Where is God When Your Dog Dies

Isn't that a ridiculous question? We've got a pandemic, economic uncertainty, and social chaos. Does God even know about our pets? Does he care?

Did you ever read the book of Jonah? Do you remember how it ends? The words have always stuck with me: "And should not I pity Nineveh, that great city, in which there are more than 120,000 persons who do not know their right hand from their left, and also much cattle?"

God took pity not only on the 120,000 people but on their livestock.

Jesus said this about our feathered friends: "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them" (Matthew 6:26).

Scripture also teaches this: "Whoever is righteous has regard for the life of his beast" (Proverbs 12:10).

Pets were not unknown in biblical times. As a clever woman told Jesus, "Yes, Lord; yet even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs" (Mark 7:28). Or consider the diligent shepherd who leaves 99 sheep, finds the one who got lost, and according to Jesus "rejoices over it more than over the 99 that never went astray" (Matthew 18:13).

Or how about the story that the prophet Nathan told? "The poor man had nothing except one little ewe lamb he had bought. He raised it, and it grew up with him and his children. It shared his food, drank from his cup, and even slept in his arms. It was like a daughter to him" (2 Samuel 12:3).

Here's my point. Pets don't matter to God as much as people. Christ did not die so that cats and dogs (or sheep) might repent and be saved. It is humans, not animals, that are the crown of God's creation (see Psalm 8).

But because God created animals, he has regard for them (see above). And because he cares for his people, what matters deeply to them, we can be sure, matters deeply to God.

God cares when your dog (or cat, or other dear pet) reaches life's end. Because he cares for you.

Today I'm thinking about what God's word tells me: "Cast all your anxiety on God because he cares for you" (1 Peter 5:7 NIV). Our faithful German shepherd Wolf has a tumor. It has been growing for a couple of months. He moves with more and more difficulty. We see the pain in his eyes.

It's a malignant tumor in the spleen and liver. It is bulging. It will eventually rupture. Death would come by internal bleeding. We want to avoid that.

In two hours a veterinarian will a make a home visit. I already have the grave dug in the rock and clay at the border of the woods and the yard. It took two hours with pick and spade, shovel, and crowbar. Wolf lay watching, panting in discomfort at a distance while I hacked out his resting place.

A friend has made a grave marker. Carved in German Gothic script is the word "Wolf."

When he was little, one of my sons (who purchased the puppy we named Wolf as a gift for his mother) was terrified of doctor visits and shots. I taught him this verse (it rhymes if you say it all out loud):

To keep you better informed about Church Council decisions we briefly present the major items from our June 9th & July 14th 2020 meetings. Should you desire in-depth information, please go to www.smlc.info/minutes for additional Council and Committee minutes.

A motion was approved to proceed with the replacement of the North parking lot.

A Discussion was held on replacing the current epoxy flooring in the church with commercial grade, waterproof vinyl tiles.

A motion was approved to accept the resignation of Rhonda Haynes from the Evangelism Committee with deep appreciation for her dedication and work.

A motion to purchase a camera and accessories to either record or live stream worship services at a cost of \$3,000 plus \$119 monthly for services.

A motion to replace an air conditioner in the Ed Center for \$4495 with Seasons Heating and Air Conditioning.

The Finance Committee recommends that the \$415.00 currently in the Community Care Program be moved to the Good Samaritan Donations Fund.

The next Council meeting is on August 11, 2020, 7:00 pm, prayerfully in the church library.

The challenges we face are many. Since 2011 attendance at our worship services has dropped 40%. Sunday School enrollment has dramatically decreased by 60%. Volunteerism has dropped in a number of areas, most notably in help for the Sunday School.

We can point to the fact that all churches are down in attendance and Millennials are not attending; however, there are churches in our area that are growing. We have the seeds in the words of the Bible for uplifting St. Mark. Pastor Breum cannot build St. Mark alone. Let us all focus on God's love and move our church forward!

What time I am afraid I will trust in thee: Psalms fifty-six three.

He repeated that verse (in a nice melody) at the doctor's. I think he still does (age 32). It helps, because God truly is with his people in their times of duress, whether true life crisis (like a family member's death, or a miscarriage) or something far less calamitous in the grand scheme of things, like a doctor or dentist appointment.

But our lives are not just about some grand scheme. We live them out by the hour. Sometimes a dog or cat is pretty important for our mood and morale. Our dog Wolf did his duty in defense and loyalty from his puppyhood in 2011 to his dying day—today.

Jesus said, "Surely I am with you always" (Matthew 28:20). I find hope in that, because today, I am conscious even more than normal that we could use some heavenly help.

As for that classic question whether dogs (or cats) go to heaven, Scripture doesn't say, and I have no idea. But when I staked out the gravesite, I remembered Christ's words: "For as the lightning comes from the east and shines as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man" (Matthew 24:27 ESV).

When I lay Wolf into the earth, I will face him east, so he can be watching just in case.




