Proclamation of Thanksgiving Cliff's Notes: By Cliff Ewert

On October 3, 1863, Abraham Lincoln signed a proclamation designating the last Thursday of November "as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise." After reading Lincoln's proclamation a number of times, I found that his words have great meaning in today's world. Just change a few words in this document that was delivered more than 150 years ago, and you may find that Lincoln's message is very relevant in our society today. I pray that you take time to read this proclamation and how it parallels many of the challenges we currently face.

Washington, D.C.

October 3, 1863

By the President of the United States of America.

A Proclamation.

The year that is drawing towards its close, has been filled with the blessings of fruitful fields and healthful skies. To these bounties, which are so constantly enjoyed that we are prone to forget the source from which they come, others have been added, which are of so extraordinary a nature, that they cannot fail to penetrate and soften even the heart which is habitually insensible to the ever watchful providence of Almighty God. In the midst of a civil war of unequalled magnitude and severity, which has sometimes seemed to foreign States to invite and to provoke their aggression, peace has been preserved with all nations, order has been maintained, the laws have been respected and obeyed, and harmony has prevailed everywhere except in the theatre of military conflict; while that theatre has been greatly contracted by the advancing armies and navies of the Union. Needful diversions of wealth and of strength from the fields of peaceful industry to the national defense, have not arrested the plough, the shuttle or the ship; the axe has enlarged the borders of our settlements, and the mines, as well of iron and coal as of the precious metals, have yielded even more abundantly than heretofore. MISSOURI MUSINGS

Why Be Grateful in These Grim Times?

I keep hearing bad things about the year 2020. People want it to be over with. They want to forget about the pandemic, non-stop riots in American cities, the political turn in professional sports, skyrocketing murder rates in American cities, and social turmoil. They want their jobs and their kids' schools to get back to normal.

But what if 2021 is even worse? What if it turns out that the death and disorder we associate with other parts of the world is taking root and spreading in our own country?

As Christians living in the United States, we worship the God who "delivered us from the domain of darkness and transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins" (Colossians 1:13–14).

We inhabit two kingdoms: (1) the USA and (2) God's kingdom. Which is more important?

We know the right answer: God's kingdom. But everything around us screams, "Be fearful and agitated and angry and apprehensive about the here and now!"

The here and now is important. We live by the hour. We have daily responsibilities. We react to the things we see and the news we hear.

But it is important to remember our redemption (see Bible verses above). We have trusted in Christ. Our sins have been forgiven. "The domain of darkness" we see creeping and seeping in around us is affecting the sinking ship of a world that stands under God's everlasting judgment.

Christians confess that God has "transferred us to the kingdom of his beloved Son." We live in everlasting hope. We know that "heaven and earth will pass away, but [Christ's] words will not pass away" (Matthew 24:35).

We have stability when things around are shaken. As it is written, "Therefore *let us be grateful* for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken" (Hebrews 12:28, emphasis added).

That's why we're grateful, whatever the turmoil being ginned up in the current news cycle. We are citizens not only of a nation that will, like all human entities, eventually crumble and be no more. We are also citizens of "a kingdom that cannot be shaken."

Jesus gave this advice when he looked down through the annals of time and foresaw days of chaos and gloom prior to his return—a time like our own: "Now when these things begin to take place, straighten up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near" (Luke 21:38).

Here in Missouri, following autumn's chill breezes and waning daylight, the forests burst forth in their glorious fall colors. I'm looking at them right now: oranges and yellows, reds and purples, browns and still greens, and everything in between.

In the household of God the church, the pillar and buttress of the truth (1 Timothy 3:15), the chill winds and sometimes darkness of current events bring forth hope in the hearts of Christ's followers. For our welfare, short term and long, rests in Christ, not in the ups and downs of these unpredictable times. Jesus Christ's glories are incomparable, inexhaustible, unstoppable, and incalculable.

Can I get an amen?

Losses we see and feel these days may be real and wrenching. We are human. They affect us. Nevertheless: in Christ we can be grateful. His kingdom - and ours by God's kind invitation - cannot be shaken.


Population has steadily increased, notwithstanding the waste that has been made in the camp, the siege and the battlefield; and the country, rejoicing in the consciousness of augmented strength and vigor, is permitted to expect continuance of years with large increase of freedom. No human counsel hath devised nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy. It has seemed to me fit and proper that they should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged as with one heart and one voice by the whole American People. I do therefore invite my fellow citizens in every part of the United States, and also those who are at sea and those who are sojourning in foreign lands, to set apart and observe the last Thursday of November next, as a day of Thanksgiving and Praise to our beneficent Father who dwelleth in the Heavens. And I recommend to them that while offering up the ascriptions justly due to Him for such singular deliverances and blessings, they do also, with humble penitence for our national perverseness and disobedience, commend to His tender care all those who have become widows, orphans, mourners or sufferers in the lamentable civil strife in which we are unavoidably engaged, and fervently implore the interposition of the Almighty Hand to heal the wounds of the nation and to restore it as soon as may be consistent with the Divine purposes to the full enjoyment of peace, harmony, tranquility and Union.

In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the United States to be affixed.

Done at the City of Washington, this Third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty-three, and of the Independence of the United States the Eighty-eighth.

Nov. 15th 12-4PM we will be packing shoe boxes full of gifts and supplies for kids in need all around the world.



St. Mark's Three Days of Prayer January 12 - 14, 2021

Matthew 21:13 ""It is written, He said to them, 'My house will be called a house of prayer."

St. Mark Church will be participating in our sixth LCMC Three Days of Prayer from Tuesday, January 12 through Thursday, January 14, 2021. We are asking for your earnest prayers that Our Lord guide each of our hearts and minds to prepare and participate in this extraordinary time for St. Mark and the Lutheran Church as we



celebrate the 503rd year of the Reformation. Our prayers are to make these three days a special occasion to: 1) glorify and honor Our Lord; 2) petition God for a spiritual revival of our church body; and, 3) request that the Holy Spirit open our hearts and minds to His direction for our church for the life of the world as Christian persecution grows.

"God is calling out a remnant of believers throughout the world who understand the role of prayer in their daily lives. These people have learned that prayer is not a five-minute exercise in the morning devotion time, but it is a vital strategic tool to discern and know God's will and purpose in their everyday lives. You see, they have learned that their daily occupations are their ministries to God and others for the life of this world.

"Martin Luther saw prayer as crucial to human life, a life created by the relationship to God. In this relationship God starts a conversation, communicating God's words of law and promise. Prayer is a part of the human response to God's speaking, a response itself shaped by the words of command and promise. Luther thought that God's promise to hear prayer defines both the nature of God and the nature of the human relationship to God, as well as the human approach to life. Luther's comments and instructions on prayer permeated his work. Luther sought to build an evangelical prayer practice that reflected the key insights of his theology: just as God redeems the unworthy human, so God promises to hear and respond to the one praying, despite his or her unworthiness. Humans respond to God's actions in law and promise when they pray regularly, forthrightly, honestly, and frequently."

Today, look to God first. Put prayer on the front lines, instead of making it an afterthought. You will begin to see renewed power in your daily life and life becoming more simple, focused as well as joyful.

Please mark your calendars to set aside a time to join your St. Mark family in at least one of our LCMC Three Days of Prayer; Tuesday, January 12th, Wednesday, January 13th and Thursday, January 14th. Due to the pandemic likely extending into the new year, we will be providing virtual Zoom evening prayer meetings. There will be opportunities for individual, family and group prayers. Prayer guides will be available, if desired. Watch weekly bulletins for updates and signup information for daily prayer times in mid- December.

Our prayer is for each St. Mark member, youth and child to listen for, and answer, Christ's call to prayer. Please contact Barb Ewert (b1182ray@aol.com) for questions and/or suggestions.

Opportunities for Prayer

Living in God's Presence

Practicing Daily Solitude. Set aside 10 minutes time to get alone and intentionally embrace the precious present. Use these minutes for ADORATION: Offering a brief word of praise to God for one or more of his attributes (e.g. love and compassion, grace, mercy, holiness, goodness, unchanging character) or works. THANKSGIVING: Thanking God for the good things and blessings in your life.

A Hard Thanksgiving

Paul talks in 1 Thessalonians 5:18 about giving thanks – not some, not in most, but in *all* circumstances. When we get good news or something exciting happens to us, thanking God comes easily. But there is also a "hard thanksgiving." This is what we do in circumstances that, in our limited view, seem difficult or less than desirable. Think about your current life. Do you need to offer God a hard thanksgiving for something? If so, do it now and several more times over time. Ask God to help you see that circumstance as a temporary part of living on this earth. Ask God to use this situation to help you lean on him more, draw closer to him, and welcome His



presence into more of your life. (Read 2 Corinthians 4:16-18 and 1 Peter 5:10 for further reflection on your circumstances in the light of eternity).

The Worship and Music Committee has posted the 2020 Three Days of Prayer Brochure on the St. Mark website under **Resources**. We prayerfully request you include these various petitions as part of your devotions for our church families, Pastor, staff, church council and committees and for the life of the world during this church year. Pray for our members who appear in our Church Directory on the same page as you.

Early Christians stand apart from the culture and suffer social stigmas and physical persecution at times. Peter challenges them to remain faithful to Jesus who also suffered for not conforming. (*Voice* side note).

Although you haven't seen Jesus, you *still* love Him. Although you don't yet see Him, you do believe in Him and celebrate with a joy that is glorious and beyond words. 1 Peter 1:8


- Amendments to the Bylaws

The first three items are straight forward; however, I would like to explain the rationale behind the fourth item, the suggested changes to the bylaws. While some are relatively small, three changes need an explanation.

- Currently the president's only responsibilities are to conduct the congregational and Council meetings. It has long been assumed that the president had "presidential" authority, but that has been not stated in the bylaws. The revision now states the president will now serve as "the chief administrative officer of the church."
- 2. The bylaws also state that, "Elections to the Church Council shall be conducted by a secret ballot," Since many of our elections have only one candidate, the following

wording has been added to streamline and shorten onecandidate elections: "When there is only one candidate for an office, a vote of acclamation may be held."

It Should Not Take a Pandemic to.....

Greetings from the Stewardship Committee which includes Laurie Kerns, Peter Bolender, and me Carl Norlin. I have served on Stewardship for nearly 20 years. During that time, the committee has struggled with how to encourage our members to use online giving. Well the good news is our members have increased the use of online giving by many-fold; the bad news is the Pandemic drove that unintentional improvement.



So why is online giving beneficial:

- > First off you do not have to fill out those envelopes and carry them or mail them to church.
- > There is a cost savings when the church does not have to print and mail those envelopes.
- > There will be no more offering checks to write.
