# MISSOURI MUSINGS

# What's So Special About 19?

Nineteen is a special number in the card game called cribbage because it is the score you *cannot* earn no matter what cards you hold or play. (You also cannot score 25, 26, or 27, though you can score 28 or the very highest possible score of 29.)

Cribbage aside, 19 is special to me right now because it is the number of condolence cards I received from St. Mark members after my father died recently.

I was amazed! Not that *somebody* sent a card, but that *so many* sent cards. And I know many others breathed prayers for our comfort in a time of loss.

As the cards filled our mailbox day after day, I thought of a line from The Apostles' Creed: "the communion of saints." That can also be translated "the fellowship of true believers."

Your cards and prayers were proof of that fellowship. Thank you for your thoughts and very real gestures of care.

Here's an example: one of your cards was home-made and featured this message: "Praying that your heart will be lifted by the many loving thoughts that surround you today." I did feel my heart lifted as I a prepared to conduct my father's funeral. God translated your prayers into our encouragement.

God's people have a history of upholding each other. In the New Testament Paul mentions Timothy as someone who shares Paul's heart for people: "For I have no one like him, who will be genuinely concerned for your welfare. For they all seek their own interests, not those of Jesus Christ" (Phil. 2:20–21).

Paul also mentions Epaphroditus. This selfless church worker "nearly died for the work of Christ, risking his life to complete what was lacking in your service to me" (Phil. 2:30).

It is part of the Christian legacy that people work hard for the Lord and come to each other's aid when the need arises. Paul spoke glowingly of Euodia and Syntyche, "women who have labored side by side with me in the gospel together with Clement and the rest of my fellow workers, whose names are in the book of life" (Phil. 4:3).

In the early church, when persecution arose, some congregations were commended with these words: "You had compassion on those in prison, and you joyfully accepted the plundering of your property, since you knew that you yourselves had a better possession and an abiding one" (Heb. 10:34).

Practical and tangible care for others is not just part of New Testament history. We see it all around us in the church today. Stephen Ministers give their time and energy. Church members give tithes and offerings to support God's work at St. Mark and around the world. People phone and send emails to express their interest and concern. The people who sent me condolence cards probably send many others in the course of a year. It's part of the sense of ministry they have developed.

To keep you better informed about Church Council decisions we briefly present the major items from our November 10th, 2020 meeting.

The Council received a presentation from Ray Martin of Martin Technology Solutions on how church and Ed Center safety can be improved through the use of outside cameras. The recommendation for cameras was brought forward by the Safety and Security Committee. The Council is taking the recommendations under advisement.

Brock Millsop presented a CARES ACT update. When the government provided funds to maintain employees on the payroll, St. Mark applied and received funding. During this time, the congregation had accumulated adequate payroll expenses in the designated time frame to apply for loan forgiveness and has adhered to all the rules. A discussion was held on the ethics of retaining the money since St. Mark had adequate funds available during this time.

The replacement of the epoxy floors in the lobby and hallways was discussed on who and how the work will be completed. A donation was received to help with the replacement cost and the project was approved to proceed in January at a cost not to exceed \$20,000.

A motion was approved that Pastor Breum can designate \$35,000 of his salary as a housing allowance for 2021.

A motion was approved to move the remaining funds from the Director of Music budget at the end of 2020 to a restricted line item for 2021.

A motion was approved to hire Emily Leeds as Director of Music effective January 1, 2021.

A motion was approved to distribute unallocated and Council discretionary benevolence funds to the following organizations: Open Arms Food Pantry (\$2,000), InZone (\$8,000), PADS (\$8,000), A Safe Place (\$2,000), With Purpose (formerly Love, Inc. \$8,000), and Veteran's Closet (\$2,000).


A motion was approved to allow Kristen Johnson to use space at St. Mark as a remote office for With Purpose ministry business. This is a ministry and a network of volunteers from area churches helping disadvantaged individuals to rebuild their lives and create new relationships all in the Name of Christ.

A motion was approved to contract with Lake County Snow Plowing and Salting on a snow "push" basis for the coming winter season.

# St. Mark's Three Days of Prayer January 12 - 14, 2021

Matthew 21:13 ""It is written, He said to them, 'My house will be called a house of prayer."

St. Mark Church will be participating in our sixth LCMC Three Days of Prayer from Tuesday, January 12 through Thursday, January 14, 2021. We are asking for your earnest prayers that Our Lord guide each of our hearts and minds to prepare and participate in this extraordinary time for St. Mark Church and the Lutheran Church as



we celebrate the 503<sup>rd</sup> year of the Reformation. Our prayers are to make these three days a special occasion to; 1) glorify and honor Our Lord, 2) to petition God for a spiritual revival of our church body, and 3) that the Holy Spirit open our hearts and mind to His direction for our church, for the life of the world as Christian persecution grows.

"Martin Luther saw prayer as crucial to human life, a life created by the relationship to God. In this relationship God starts a conversation, communicating God's words of law and promise. Prayer is a part of the human response to God's speaking, a response itself shaped by the words of command and promise. Luther thought that God's promise to hear prayer defines both the nature of God and the nature of the human relationship to God, as well as the human approach to life. Luther's comments and instructions on prayer permeated his work. Luther sought to build an evangelical prayer practice that reflected the key insights of his theology: just as God redeems the unworthy human, so God promises to hear and respond to the one praying, despite his or her unworthiness. Humans respond to God's actions in law and promise when they pray regularly, forthrightly, honestly, and frequently."

Today, look to God first. Put prayer on the front lines, instead of making it an afterthought. You will begin to see renewed power in your daily life and life becoming more simple, focused as well as joyful.

So please mark your calendars to set aside a time to join your St. Mark family in at least one of our LCMC Three Days of Prayer, Tuesday, January 12, Wednesday, January 13 and Thursday, January 14. Due to pandemic most likely being with us, we will be providing virtual Zoom evening prayer meetings. There will be opportunities for individual, family and group prayers.



Prayer guides will be available, if desired. Watch weekly bulletins for updates in mid- December.

Our prayer is each St. Mark member, youth and child listen for and answer Christ's call to prayer. Please contact Barb Ewert (b1182ray@aol.com, 847-514-5487) for questions and/or suggestions.



# Growing in Christ Winter 2021

This fall we read Dr. Ken Boa's, *Shaped by Suffering*, and discussed the issue of suffering and viewing personal videos dealing with suffering by the authors and other Christians. We shared our life experiences with suffering, being encouraged knowing we are not alone and laughing with one another – a wonderful way to not despair.

This winter of 2021 as we continue to deal with the challenges of isolation, fear and despair in the middle of this pandemic, I want to share a "holy moment" with you leading to the choice of our next book by Matthew Kelly, *The Biggest Lie in the History of Christianity*.

*Growing in Christ* selections are based in prayer. I ask God for his guidance in the choice of topic and book selections. With the November deadline

looming for December/January *Voice* submissions, I had several book choices, but none seemed to be the one. Until just before the deadline, as I was putting shoes on, I spotted this small paperback on the bedroom floor lying atop a pile of old cards. As I examined the table of contents, I remembered it had been handed out to me as I left St. John Catholic Church in Maryland in spring of 2019. This little book has a very timely message for all age groups of hope and happiness - by loving your neighbor. A wonderful read and a Christian call to action for the holidays and seasons to come.

This book is a wonderful transition from *Shaped by Suffering*, to how to live a life of hope and happiness. God's timely answer to prayers!

# St. Mark Holiday Dinner-In-A-Bag






