

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Unforgettable Lessons

It's winter. There is work to do outside. You'd better have warm gloves. I do. And when it's much below freezing I put hand warmers inside them. That helps. But what if they get wet, like from melting snow when you are stacking firewood? Or how about when you're shoveling snow while it is coming down heavily? Wet hands happen.

Well, as long as you're working hard, wet gloves may not be a problem. Your body heat still keeps your hands warm.

But once you're done, how do you dry out the gloves? Mine are nylon and leather. The directions are clear: do not use direct heat to dry them. If you just leave them on a shelf or rack at room temperature, it might take days for them to dry.

The other day I was pondering this question . . . and I remembered a trick my grandmother taught me for drying wet shoes. We used to play out in the snow. We didn't have fancy waterproof gear, just leather boon Dockers (work shoes). They got soaked. They were all we had to wear the next day.

Here's the trick: crumple up sheets of newspaper. Cram them down into the shoe--not too tightly, but so that the shoe is completely filled.

The next day you can pull out the newspaper wads (which may be a little damp). The shoes will be dry.

Why wouldn't my grandmother's trick work on gloves? I tried it. It did. Thanks, Grandma, for this blessed recollection! All I needed to do was remember what she taught me.

Life is full of situations where we need to remember what God has taught us. Here are examples of commands to "remember":

Ps 105:5	Remember the wondrous works that he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he uttered.

Luke 17:32 "Remember Lot's wife."

Heb 13:7

John 15:20 "Remember the word that I said to you: 'A servant is not greater than his master."

2 Tim 2:8 Remember Jesus Christ, risen from the dead, the offspring of David, as preached in my gospel.

Heb 13:3 Remember those who are in prison, as though in prison with them, and those who are

mistreated, since you also are in the body.

Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God. Consider the outcome of their way of life and imitate their faith.

You get the idea. People often seek some new word or direction from God. But the biggest need may be to draw on the Scriptures and remember.

Once we recall what the Bible says and apply it in our lives, we may never forget that lesson. I learned about newspaper and drying shoes about 60 years ago. But the wisdom has been there for the taking all this time. All I had to do was access it.

This young new year offers fresh challenges. But in God's word we find this counsel:

Joel 2:21 "Fear not, O land;

be glad and rejoice,

for the LORD has done great things!"

God who has been faithful in the past will be faithful today and in the future. "The LORD has done great things!" He calls us to remember.

Important decisions from the January Council meeting:

The new flooring installation throughout the entry areas, hallway, kitchen, restrooms and Sunday School superintendent's area began January 18th and is expected to be completed at the time of this reading.

Discussion resumed from the November 2020 meeting regarding the purchase of security cameras to cover the entrances and church courtyard. The topic merits further consideration and was tabled until the November 2021 Council meeting to ensure expenditures are prioritized in the event that critical maintenance/capital projects become necessary this year.





May these Words of God bring you Hope and guidance in a time of uncertainty. For Jesus is the same yesterday today and forever, and so are his promises and Spirit he provided you.




Vacation Bible School Is Coming!!!


