MISSOURI MUSINGS

March Madness

No, I'm not talking about college basketball. Nor am I talking about the insanity of Major League Baseball owners and players unable to agree on how to divide their billions and billions of dollars.

I'm talking about spring: the sheer unbelievable glory and bounty of things going from frozen, dead, gray, and lifeless to green, fragrant, lush, and growing like mad. How does that happen?

Like all good things, behind spring's miracle is a promise from God. It came in the wake of the great flood in the days of Noah and the ark. When Noah and his family and the animals left the ark, God told them, echoing his mandate to Adam and Eve (Genesis 1:28): "Be fruitful and multiply on the earth" (Genesis 8:17).

But imagine you had seen the world destroyed by a flood. What would be the use of trying to start civilization over again? What if people resumed their evil ways and God had to wipe the slate clean again?

God had an answer. It came in the form of a promise. "I will never again curse the ground because of man, for the intention of man's heart is evil from his youth. Neither will I ever again strike down every living creature as I have done" (Genesis 8:21). Despite the "evil" human heart, God is not going to deal with sin by another flood.

Rather, we know that he would deal with sin by sending Jesus Christ to suffer the pain and penalty of sin. To confess our sin, to believe in Jesus' death in our place and to follow him, brings us forgiveness and new life. That's God's promise.

But there's another part of that Genesis 8 promise, and it explains spring: "While the earth remains, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night, shall not cease."

In March in Chicagoland, it can seem like spring will never come. But hang in there. Look at the words above: seedtime, heat, summer. That's the promise of spring! It may seem long delayed. But it's on the way. God promised. We can be hopeful of spring's arrival in 2022.

Even if baseball remains indefinitely delayed.

Here in Missouri I see innumerable signs of spring. The ice on the pond has melted. When we walk by, schools of fish follow along hoping we'll throw some food pellets their way.

My neighbor's cows and sheep and goats and llamas are giving birth to calves and lambs and kids and crias (baby llamas). They are doing what God said: "Be fruitful and multiply on the earth." But it would be hard to do in January with deep cold and frost. They succeed and survive now because of the dawn of spring. Which takes us back to God's promise regarding the rhythms of the calendar and seasons. "While the earth remains . . . [they] shall not cease."

But about those llamas and their crias. You know, it's amazing the tiny babies survive. Male llamas have been known to trample them--jealous, I guess. Plus, there are coyotes and fox and bobcats.

You know what protects those helpless little fur balls? One source puts it this way: "Crias are typically born with all the females of the herd gathering around, in an attempt to protect against the male llamas and potential predators."

How do they know to do that? I would say: God made them that way. There is often a wisdom in nature that points to the wisdom of God who created and upholds all things.

As we await the birth of spring, God surrounds us with his promises--of lengthening days, rising temperatures, and warmer soil temperatures. Expect it!

And expect no less God's faithfulness to forgive and restore penitent sinners who look to Jesus Christ for direction and hope that changes winter into spring.

Exalt the Lord Who Has Established You¹ A Reminder: The Importance of One's Prayer Life

IDENTITY is a trendy word today. Dictionary.com defines the word as, "condition or character as to who a person or what a thing is; the qualities, beliefs, etc., that distinguish or identify a person or thing." Sociologists, researchers, and others cite the "big 8" - race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, gender identity, ability, religion/spirituality, nationality and socioeconomic status.²

When someone new crosses your daily path, who do you say you are? How do you identify yourself? At what point do you trot out the words, "I am a Christian?" Speaking for myself, it took a long time. What happened was a journey toward Christian maturity becoming conformed to the image of Christ.

Today my identity is rooted in Jesus Christ. I know Him as my Creator, Sustainer, and Savior. Prayer is the dynamic mainstay to sustain my relationship with Jesus so He can define my purpose and worth in this journey as His bond servant. From A.W. Tozer's statement: "Our great honor lies in being just what Jesus was and is. To be accepted by those who accept Him, rejected by all who reject Him, loved by those who love Him. What greater glory could come to any man?"³

So as we follow our Lenten disciplines, seek the Lord's guidance through prayer. Why? To know God is to love Him, to love Him is to trust Him, to trust Him is to obey Him, to obey Him is to do His Will and to do His will is to exalt and glorify the Lord Who has established you to be His own.⁴

Feeding kids. Feeding spirits. Empowering communities.

These are the 3 pillars of Feed My Starving Children (FMSC). Every year, millions of children die from preventable causes such as pneumonia, diarrhea, malaria and undernutrition. Hunger is still causing nearly half of deaths in children under 5 years old. From this data, FMSC estimates at least 6,200 children die each day from causes related to undernutrition. (That means about 250 kids will pass away during an hour-long church service.) This is heartbreaking.

FMSC believes hope starts with food. As a Christian nonprofit, FMSC is dedicated to seeing every child whole in body and spirit. FMSC works with food distribution partners that stay with communities for the long haul, empowering them to move from relief to development.

FMSC meals are developed by food science and nutrition professionals to supplement nutritional needs and reduce problems with malnutrition. Nutrition allows children to grow, thrive and develop to their full potential.

Many of you have volunteered to pack food at the Libertyville site, another site, or maybe even at a Mobile Pack. You might have donated money to feed kids - thank you!! - or you have just prayed for FMSC - which is AWESOME!!!

But did you know there is something else you can do to get involved????

On Friday, April 29, you could join with others from around the world to help with "Building Dreams Together". This virtual experience will provide you an opportunity to be inspired, find community with other FMSC supporters, meet partners and the kids who eat FMSC meals and more. You will hear stories from children and adults whose lives have been transformed by the power of food. Have you heard the story about Emma from Uganda? During this event, you will meet Brian, Emma's oldest brother, and see how he takes care of the family since their mother and father are no longer there. When families are no longer hungry, they are freed to dream of more than food. Learn how MannaPack® meals support a child's growth and development and empower them to dream of bright futures.

Here's my list...in addition to the two stated above, see what you can add to it:

- Solid adherence to the Bible is taught in worship;

I purposely didn't list all the things to be thankful for so you can take a look around next weekend and identify more. I'm willing to guess you'll identify many other things that are carefully provided for by "someone".

Father, thank You for Your infinite love for us, for Your church, for Your incomprehensible faithfulness to us despite our human sides of rebellion that we often hide. But nothing is hidden from You, Lord, and during this holy Lenten season, cause us to search our hearts and seek You, not for what we can get from You but to know You better, to draw closer to You every day and become the people You created us to be in Your image. We want the Blesser more than the blessings. Thank You, Jesus, our Savior and forever Lover of our souls; it is in Your precious name we pray, amen and amen.


Experiencing God



WHAT IS A CHURCH MEMBER

If you haven't yet picked up your copy of WHAT IS A CHURCH MEMBER, please stop by the church office or ask any Council member for a copy (one per family please).

This month's highlight is Chapter 3: I Will Not Let My Church Be about My Preferences and Desires. This chapter certainly packed a punch for me! One of the lines in this chapter said, "But the strange thing about church membership is that you actually give up your preferences when you join." Huh? I was thinking my preferences are how I chose my church way back in 1996. This is the place I felt most comfortable; where I felt I fit in and was fed by the word preached from the pulpit.



Chapter 3 reminds me that as church members, we are definitely a member of the whole body as we have been hearing in our Church Doctor journey. We are all individually and uniquely gifted with spiritual gifts and as we use these gifts together, all the parts make a whole. But this chapter is a reminder that as the body of Christ, we are called to serve, not be served. We are here to meet the needs of others. We are here to give. We are here to sacrifice self (less of me, more of thee) as Jesus did. Here are a few highlights.

- The word servant occurs 57 times in the New Testament and many times it refers to the role we are to assume as Christians.
- Serve occurs 58 times in the New Testament. Get the picture?"
- Jesus said we must be last of all and servant of all.

"We will never find joy in church membership when we are constantly seeking things our way. But paradoxically, we will find the greatest joy when we choose to be last, to serve. True joy means giving up our rights and preferences and serving everyone else. That's what church membership means as well."

I love the closing words in this chapter. "We are to do whatever it takes to keep the unity in our church. So, if we approach church membership from the perspective of entitlement (being comfortable for us), we have it upside down. You always ask first what you can do for your church."

Great little book, quick read, powerful words that remind me what church membership is truly about and there is much more beyond this chapter!


