Gathering or Sleeping

The summer of 2022 was a hot one in the Midwest. It was so hot that on many evenings when I needed to check the garden, I was reluctant: even at 6 PM it was still well in the 90s. And such humidity! It was tempting to ignore the garden.

On the other hand, when you work hard to put a garden in, it would be a shame to let the harvest go to waste: cucumbers, squash, okra, peppers, and tomatoes. So despite the heat, I usually mustered the oomph to get out the door, drag the dog out with me so he could suffer too, and pick what was ripe. Or pull weeds, prune and tie up the tomatoes, and scout for tomato worms or destructive insects.

I was reminded of my mental battle to tend the garden (or not) when I read this verse in Proverbs:

He who gathers in summer is a prudent son, but he who sleeps in harvest is a son who brings shame (Prov. 10:5 ESV). Other translations say much the same thing:

He that gathereth in summer is a wise son: but he that sleepeth in harvest is a son that causeth shame (KJV).

He who gathers crops in summer is a prudent son, but he who sleeps during harvest is a disgraceful son (NIV).

A wise youth harvests in the summer, but one who sleeps during harvest is a disgrace (NLT).

(Pro tip: would you like to be able to consult about five dozen translations of any Bible verse? Just go to Biblegateway.com and type in the verse or passage you want. Then click the link that lists your verse "in all English translations." It's like having a free library of dozens of Bibles!)

Proverbs teaches, in any translation, that when the harvest is ready, you need to harvest. To sleep (or stay inside with the AC) is shameful (ESV, KJV) or a disgrace (NIV, NLT).

Jesus said some important things about harvest. He said to pray for more workers, because the harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few (Matthew 9:37–38). Jesus also said, "Look, I tell you, lift up your eyes, and see that the fields are white for harvest" (John 4:35).

In our walk with Christ, harvest refers to sowing the seed of the gospel message, and then reaping as God causes that seed to sprout, take root, and grow. Here are some examples of harvesting: Leading someone to personal faith in Christ. Reading the Bible, praying, and singing with our children because we have taught them to enjoy a time of daily family worship. Talking about things of the LORD with a Christian friend, and maybe praying together too. Learning about the Christian faith well enough that we can talk to others about it with hope and confidence.

We harvest whenever we go out into God's garden (which is the whole world) and live lives of love, service, and faithfulness wherever he has called us. In this case we are harvesting the benefits of his daily grace, protection, and leadership, fulfilling his will in our daily lives and witnessing to his presence by being salt and light in a world that is often bland and dark.

To return to Proverbs 10:5 above, "He who gathers in summer is a prudent son" means that as believers in Jesus Christ, we "gather" during the continual summer of his favor and care. Every day, hour, and minute, we have the privilege of devoting ourselves to Christ, conscious of his presence. To live fruitful lives, gathering as long as he grants us life, is prudent, pleases God, and benefits those we serve, love, and witness to.

By the same token, "He who sleeps in harvest is a son who brings shame" is a label we want to avoid. This is not talking about our nightly rest, which God grants and blesses--Psalms 4:8 says, "In peace I will both lie down and sleep; for you alone, O LORD, make me dwell in safety." Sleeping in harvest means failing to live our lives engaged in the pursuit of Christ. It means missing out on the opportunity to grow daily in God's grace. It means neglecting our call to love and serve others. It means failing to exercise the spiritual disciplines needed to sustain such loving and serving.

So: the garden is growing. It is prudent to ask: am I gathering or sleeping?

Council Highlights August 2022

In the works are a new Spiritual Gifts workshop, a Spiritual Gifts class to meet during Sunday School hour, and a Bible Study class open to all, with the first study being Spiritual Gifts.

Bids have been received from 2 services to begin cleaning our buildings this fall; motion carried to sign a contract with Stratus Building Solutions, pending reference checks.


Mortgage Payoff Celebration - Piñatas have been purchased for the picnic on August 21. Plans are progressing to incorporate the ribbon cutting ceremony into Rally Day festivities. Rally Day is scheduled for Sunday September 11, 2022.

Security Camera status update - Cameras are installed on both buildings. Training will be completed ASAP for cameras to go live.

The 2023 Spending Plan (annual budget) was approved for the Annual Meeting on November 13th. Copies of the approved plan will be available to the congregation 30 days prior to the meeting.

A motion carried to allocate \$2,000 of the Council Discretion Benevolence to Samaritan's Purse for the Kentucky flooding relief.

2023 Council nomination process opened August 13; positions to be filled are President, Secretary, one Elder and one Trustee.



What Do Our Tithes Pay?

Now that we have the mortgage on the Education Center paid in full, the percentage of certain expenses have changed. What does our tithing pay, you may ask? Through the first 7 months of the year the majority of our donations (61%) goes to paying staff salaries: Pastor, Administrator, Bookkeeper, Worship Leader, Maintenance Assistant, etc. This percentage is due to go up next fiscal year if the church is successful in calling a Co-Pastor.

Property Management, which includes the cost of utilities, amounts to 16% of our total expenses, followed by Benevolence (11%), Administrative Expenses (3%), Parish Ed (3%), Congregational Life (1.8%), and Worship & Music (1.6%).

Praying for Life Choices and more...

As summer begins to fade into fall, the transition of the seasons is upon us. It is also the time of year when life choices past, present and those impending, manifest themselves. Over time our choices increasingly narrow as we make key life decisions - school choices, career choices, marriage choices, etc. aiming to make a "first class" life for ourselves. Teens struggle to know who am I; where did I come from; what's my purpose; what happens after I die? Adults too, can continue to struggle with the same questions, especially when earlier



choices fail to deliver the expected outcomes. Today's worldly culture is peddling life choices too - bad ideas, deceitful choices, misleading worldviews that are creating sufferers, victims and death rather than a "life that is full and good."

You ask, "What can I do?" Pray for those teens and seekers in your family, your neighborhood, St. Mark Church who are searching for answers. Especially those with whom you already have a relationship. Ask the Father to send them your way. Pray for the Holy Spirit to prepare you with His words of wisdom. Prepare for unexpected interruptions. Listen closely to their comments and questions. Ask probing questions to help them to think critically. "What do you seek?" "How do you hope to achieve it?" "Have you the knowledge and wisdom to always make the best choices?" What results have your former choices given you? How are your friends' choices working out? Who can counsel you to make the best choices? Who do you think can guide you now and in your future to always make healthy choices physically, emotionally and spiritually? Would you be interested in learning how to make better choices and have a good life? "When you want to talk more, I am here for you. How can I pray for you?"

Continue in prayer asking the Holy Spirit to work in those He sends to you. Pray for yourself to guide those who He places in your path. These prayers will be heard, listened to by our Lord, for we *know* He calls all to glorify Him by doing His will and making disciples.

John 10:10 MSG Jesus told this simple story, but they had no idea what he was talking about. So he tried again. "I'll be explicit, then. I am the Gate for the sheep. All those others are up to no good—sheep rustlers, every one of them. But the sheep didn't listen to them. I am the Gate. Anyone who goes through me will be cared for—will freely go in and out, and find pasture. A thief is only there to steal and kill and destroy. I came so they can have real and eternal life, more and better life than they ever dreamed of.

"Well ... at least we had Monday!"


After 6 days, 13 hours and 29 minutes, and 5265 miles in two vans, the Alamosa Mission Trip of 2022 came to an end – unfortunately the end came two days early. We left with tons of excitement but returned with some disappointment. Because of Covid, we had to cut our trip short and head home early. We know this article will appear in The Voice after our "Mission Trip Review Night" but for those who missed that night, here is a synopsis of what happened.

After a nice send off, including communion, we hit the road early Saturday morning, July 23rd, on our way to a stopover in York, NE. After a pretty uneventful first day, our second day gave us a chance to stop in Buffalo Bill territory for lunch and a nice picture stop. For those of you who think parts of Kansas and Nebraska are flat and boring, you've never seen eastern Colorado. As we got closer to our final destination, the land got to be flatter and more barren than we could imagine! But then came the mountains!!! Alamosa is in the center of the San Luis Valley, but it is surrounded by mountains – one reaches *ONLY* 14,022 feet in elevation, another gets up to 14,266 feet, and the third touches 14,351 feet (Colorado's fourth highest peak)!! To say the least, quite a difference for us Flatlanders. Alamosa is a town of about 10,000 people where about 25% of the inhabitants are below the poverty line.

YouthWorks, the organization we go through to organize the actual *mission* work part of the trip, runs a very well organized and thought-out program. So after a quick Sunday night dinner, orientation, and our first Gathering – a nightly group worship setting – it's off to bed for an early Monday morning awakening. The 15 members of St. Mark that went on the trip were put together as one work crew – the Mountaineers – but then got split up Monday morning with one part painting a room in an elderly woman's house and the other part helping a Catholic church dispose of some sound proofing material – the painting crew got off easy that morning!! We ate lunch together in a town park that actually had the Rio Grande River running through it. Walking up to it, for those of us that were old enough to see the movie, we were expecting to see John Wayne, Maureen O'Hara, and a big, wide, raging river! Well – we didn't see any of this since the river starts up in the mountains west of Alamosa, the "big river" wasn't very impressive but at least we can say we saw it!! One of us can actually say he fished in it!!! After lunch, we got to work as a group and helped with some outside yard work at a very nice and expansive piece of property right along the Rio Grande.

Another split in the group occurred after dinner when some of us went to the local swimming pool, while the other group went to Zapata Falls, about 25 miles outside Alamosa. While the time at the pool was fun and refreshing, the trip to the falls was amazing! First, you have to get to the parking lot via a winding road up the foothills of a small mountain. Then you must walk another mile or so *up hill* to get to an ice-cold creek, which was, luckily when we visited, only a foot or less deep because you need to walk in this creek to see the falls, which are INSIDE the mountain! Yes – it was worth it!!! To say the least, we all slept well that night.

Tuesday started off bright and early full of excitement and after breakfast, we were off to help at Alamosa's Senior Citizen Center, which is a beautiful facility for the more-mature people in the valley. We cleaned up their bus, weeded their flower beds, washed some tables, polished some of their silver (YES – you read that right!), and one of us even had ear acupuncture – ask Pastor about that experience. But during all of this, we noticed one of our young men just wasn't himself so off to find a drug store to pick up a Covid test kit. Sure enough – he tested positive! So back to the same drugstore to pick up enough kits for all of us to test. We sure must have been a sight – in a public park, 14 of us sitting around separate



tables sticking Q-tips up our noses! We then found out one more of our young men had Covid so while the rest of the group went back to work at another site, YouthWorks gets notified, personal belongings are collected, and a hotel room is found to isolate our two young Covid'ers. To say the least, our group's worship time that night wasn't the happiest. Tuesday night also had us visit a local historical museum – very interesting – and a local arcade place – very fun!

Wednesday started off with another round of Covid tests – no positives! After checking in with our 2 sickies to see if they were OK and having a nice talk with them in the hotel parking lot, it was off to lunch for the rest of us at a local "landmark" – The Secret Garden and Grotto. If you are ever in Alamosa, you need to check this place out! A local man and wife built, in their own backyard amidst the arid landscape of the area, this lush and beautiful garden that includes wandering paths with tunnels, a coy pond, 2 or 3 picnic areas, and yes – its own little grotto. After lunch we went back to the place we were at Monday afternoon, and helped with more landscaping.

Well, it's just a tremendous amount of fun to spend time with everyone because we all have the same goal, to make this the best community event ever and show all those who shop just what a wonderful place St. Mark is. Thank you, Laurie Kerns and all those who helped make this happen by God's grace. There's no doubt of that. He does make it happen and again, He's working where we can't see, in the hearts of many who are shopping for treasures to help them find the REAL treasure: HIM.

And....thank you, HIS ministry and others who helped renew the appearance of our gazebo. Some handy carpentry work, a fresh coat of paint and a beautiful Saturday morning brought a lot of good fun and fellowship to all of you. We are truly blessed.





Besides being a very gracious host, the daughter of the elderly couple who owned this land had a lot of work for us to do!!

After a quick dinner, we were off to a place that is very hard to describe – Great Sand Dunes National Park. As you drive to this park, tucked along a mountain range, you see this pile of sand just getting bigger and bigger and bigger. These dunes are the tallest sand dunes in North America but for our group, they were the tallest one's EVER!! You look at them and expect to see Luke Skywalker and R2 -D2 come over the ridge in their Landspeeder – very, very surreal. The dunes are big enough that you bring pieces of cardboard with you and slide down the sides of the dunes like we do sledding here during the winter. Some of the group made it to the top but all of us were just amazed at where we were. On the way home, being out in the middle of nowhere, we stopped and got out of the van to look at the stars. We saw more sand AND more stars that night than we had ever seen before – God is a wonderful Creator of beauty.

Thursday morning started with another round of tests and unfortunately – 2 more of us tested positive. Even though we only had one more day to go, we decided to pull up our tent stakes and head back home. Before leaving though, near one of the churches we stayed at was a local day care center called PALS (Positive Activities Lead to Success) and this is where the offering collected during St. Mark's VBS was donated. About \$350 donated will help out 5 to 9 year old Alamosa children who are combating trauma or instability in their home lives. What a perfect place to donate to – thank you to all the kids who gave to the offering during VBS!

AND THANKS TO ALL OF YOU WHO SUPPORTED OUR TRIP WITH PRAYER AND/OR DONATIONS!! So after two long and relatively uneventful days, we returned to St. Mark safe and sound. Through your support and with all the ups and downs, we still considered this trip a "success". 


