From the Desk of Pastor Breum

Dear Friends,

John 1:16 (TLB) ¹⁶ We have all benefited from the rich blessings he brought to us—blessing upon blessing heaped upon us!

Getting away for several days, a much-needed vacation, my perspective of serving here at St Mark was reenergized supernaturally by God's Holy Spirit. My former professor at Gordon-Conwell, Dr. Gordon Fee, wrote the following and I love it. "The Holy Spirit is God's empowering Presence. It is the animating energy we draw on through relationship with God."

While away I spent the first 4 days with our youngest, Johnny. This included 2 softball games and 2 soccer matches. I witnessed my son hit his first infield home run. The softball did not go over the fence and stayed in the field. He was able to round all the bases and make it home without being thrown out. I yelled, "That's my son!" I even teared up a little bit because I was so blessed by God to be there at that particular moment. I have watched him involved in baseball/softball for 21 years. Later a friend told me it was not appropriate to yell, "that's my son" since he is an adult. I'm still glad I yelled it and thank God for that moment between father and son. He saw how proud I was of him. Yes, I'm even proud when he strikes out. I watched a total of 4 softball games and enjoyed every second of them.

The above verse talks about blessings that are given to us by Christ. God has blessed my wife and I with four children, all blessings from God. We have also been given by God a daughter-in-law, a son-in-law, and now a granddaughter. Being away from the pastorate for a short time and having alone time made God's blessings upon me and my family clearer than ever.

I like this definition of blessing. "Enrichment beyond normal quality." I spent time in prayer for St Mark. I sense God's blessing upon our church. I thought of specific people (who shall not be named), whose witness of Christ is so bright. I thought of the deep friendships that so many of you have with each other and how blessed you are with that closeness.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Grace to Continue

As a teacher of adult students, I encounter many tired people. Most seminary students work to support themselves and their families. Their studies demand long hours. Some work a night shift, then show up for class at 8:30 AM. They fight sleep until class is over and they can get home for a nap. I understand if they nod off in class.

People are tired because life is hard. It takes effort to overcome obstacles. But God gives us tools to motivate and refresh us. What are some of those tools? Here are six that occur to me.

- 1. Isaiah speaks of waiting on God to renew our strength. "Waiting" here means having faith, looking to him, serving him, not giving up when we are tempted to quit: "They who wait for the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles; they shall run and not be weary; they shall walk and not faint" (Isaiah 40:31).
- 2. But don't overlook the nightly gift of sleep! Sometimes we're worn out and we just need to turn off the TV and our personal devices and hit the sack. The Psalmist reminds us that sleep is a gift from God: "It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for he gives to his beloved sleep" (Psalm 127:2).
- 3. For that matter, besides sleep, there are common sense things like diet, exercise, and recreation. All of us need balance in everyday activities. These are among the many things "that God created to be received with thanksgiving by those who believe and know the truth" (1 Tim 4:3).
- 4. What else does God provide to motivate and refresh us? Paul wrote to Philemon, "Refresh my heart in Christ" (Philemon 20). Sometimes it is people around us who refresh us. Years ago I stopped by McDonald's on Grand Avenue east of Sand Lake Road. A sizable crowd of St. Mark people were shooting the breeze and drinking coffee. I seem to remember Bruce Young saying, "This is St. Mark East!" Maybe I'm dreaming that.

But for sure they were having a good time. Fellowship with others and especially fellow believers can be uplifting and just plain fun.

- 5. Sometimes we are dragged down from a sense of failure and self-pity. What may help here is gratitude. The Bible contains the words "give thanks" 59 times (ESV)! Thanks can cancel out uncertainty or resentment. It can renew our sense of wonder at God's love, forgiveness, protection, and direction.
- 6. I have to admit that there is one thing above all others that God uses to say to me, "Yarbrough, what are you whining about?" It is stories like these:

Some weeks ago a newspaper called the Morning Star News in Kampala, Uganda, reported what happened on August 10 to five Ugandan church planters. They struck up a conversation about Jesus the Son of God with Muslims on a ferry boat on Lake Kyoga.

The Muslims, ten in number to the church planters' five, threw them overboard. They all drowned. They have joined the martyrs beneath God's heavenly altar (Revelation 6:9). Let us right here commemorate the names of these brothers and sisters: Ankunda, 44; Peter Agaba, 28; Juliet Ashaba, 39; Johnson Karungi, 27; and Julius Lweere, 52.

As John writes in Revelation 14:13: "Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord from now on." "Blessed indeed," says the Spirit, "that they may rest from their labors, for their deeds follow them!"

When I am tired and read an account like that, something changes inside. Maybe it's partly adrenalin. But it may also be God's way of changing my outlook so that I receive a fresh infusion of grace from him. In Scripture we read, "It is good for the heart to be strengthened by grace" (Hebrews 13:9). God can use the bravery and steadfastness of our brethren elsewhere to recharge us.

That's exactly what Peter wrote to churches of his day as they faced perilous and exhausting circumstances. I leave his exhortation to those churches with you for the next time you feel lax and listless (1 Peter 4:9–10):

Resist [the devil], firm in your faith, knowing that the same kinds of suffering are being experienced by your brotherhood throughout the world. And after you have suffered a little while, the God of all grace, who has called you to his eternal glory in Christ, will himself restore, confirm, strengthen, and establish you.

Council Highlights October 2022

Approved Mission Trip 2023 to Logan County, West Virginia, July 15-22

Benevolence for the remainder of 2022 was approved to reroute from Cup of Cold Water to WYAM, upon word that Rhonda Haynes' full focus on her Dissertation resulted in her missionary work being suspended. WYAM is a Christian organization that has been instrumental in helping Ukrainians in Romania since the unrest began in February 2022. St. Mark has contributed funding several times this year to this organization.

\$2000 was approved to send to Samaritan's Purse from the Council Discretionary Benevolence fund on behalf of Florida and Puerto Rico flooding restoration.

Discussion re: St. Mark's invitation to join the Lindenhurst/Lake Villa/Round Lake Chamber; decision was deferred until the November Council meeting pending discussion with the Men's Ministry group. Membership would bring significant opportunity for outreach in the community.

St. Mark's Privacy Policy was reviewed and approved with revisions regarding the acceptance of cookies in light of our efforts to expand our Social Media footprint.

Todd Stickney's resignation as Elder was accepted with regrets.

1 Thessalonians 5:18

Last month I was invited by my daughter for a Parents Weekend at my granddaughter's high school nestled in the rolling hills of northwestern Massachusetts. This is at the peak of the Fall Foliage in New England and our last of such trips since our daughter's family is relocating to Southern California.

This year the vibrant mix of oranges, yellows, reds, and blue horizons on the landscapes reminded me again of God's love of beauty reflected in His handiwork. At Saturday's lunch



a parent of my granddaughter's friend set her plate down and quietly prayed over her meal. Not a short prayer either. A sharp reminder that I had not taken the time for my own blessings in public! Not just for the food, but for health, family, friends, and school parents from last year sharing parenting experiences and our faith as well. Not only that realization, but I had a looming deadline for an article on prayer to complete for the November *Voice*. In hindsight, I had prayed for guidance on what to write about prayer. So His answer was my lived experience. His perfect timing and sense of humor and love to make His point to me; it is not just thanksgiving, but gratitude.

Just as Israel had numerous themes and festivals to help them "remember." It's a motif throughout the Hebrew Bible: Do not forget!

Moses, in Deuteronomy 8, laid out the importance of remembering this iconic text on gratitude. *Beware that you do not forget the Lord your God by not keeping His commandments and His ordinances and His statutes which I am commanding you today; otherwise, when you have eaten and are satisfied, and have built good houses and lived in them, and when your herds and your flocks multiply, and your silver and gold multiply, and all that you have multiplies, then your heart will become proud and you will forget the Lord your God who brought you out from the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. (Deuteronomy 8:11–14, emphasis added)*

So to avoid an attitude of ingratitude:

- Deliverance in the past. 2 Timothy 2:8, Psalm 136:1
- Benefits in the present. 1 Corinthians 4:7
- Promises for the future. Ephesians 3:20

If you forget God in any one of these areas, ingratitude will result—leading to missed blessings and missed opportunities for growth. Happy Thanksgiving, to all!!!

Fire Prevention Month, it is time for another

On Saturday, November 19th, and Sunday, November 20th, the Lake Villa Fire Department will be here to help us run the drill. As we did last year, the drill will occur at the end of the service, and we will be there to announce it. After last year's drill, we were told by the fire department that we need to "congregate" away from the parking lots and, even though it is at the end of the service, we ask you do NOT get into your cars and try to leave. We will be working with our ushers to try to take attendance once we exit the building. Please pay attention to announcements about this as the event draws closer!!

Somewhat in line with our fire drill, we are in the process of making an "emergency response procedure" card to be put in all the pews to explain evacuation, sheltering and safety.

In other items of business, we are working to make sure all the rooms in the Ed Center, including the Sunday School rooms, are safer in case of an emergency. We have asked the Fire Department if they have any old hoses to use as a locking mechanism for the doors in the main floor of Sunday School, we are assessing the need to change the handles on the downstairs doors, and putting up a cover for the rooms that have windows.


We are very excited to have Angel Tree back at St. Mark this year. Be on the lookout for the tree in the Narthex (end of November) tagged with

I like choices and doing it my way

Hi I'm Stewardship's "Ask Stewie". In this month's article, I want to write about online giving.

Greetings from the Stewardship Committee which includes Laurie Kerns and (Stewie) Carl Norlin. So, I know I like choices and really like to do it my way. At St. Mark we have many choices in worship styles, types of music and even in how we give of our tithes and offerings. For so many years our committee has encouraged our members to use online giving. Well, the good news is that our members have increased the use of online giving by 250%. The use of paper checks in envelopes have been reduced (a big thank you from the counting teams).



As I began, we like choices and doing it our way. Let's look at how online giving gives you choices: First off here are reasons to consider online giving:

- You can choose not to fill out those envelopes and carry them or mail them to church.
- There is a cost savings to the church.
- There will be no more offering checks to write.
- Regular and consistent giving helps our church with budgeting. It evens out the annual giving.
- You can schedule your contribution even if you are on vacation or maybe are a "Snow-Bird". Your
 offering will come when you want it to, even when you are gone. Special offerings, no problem,
 they can be planned in advance.
- Online giving has all the special giving categories including, but not limited to, Flower Fund, HIS
 Ministry, and special offerings such as memorials, to name a few.
- Helps the counting teams (a volunteer group) with less checks to count and tabulate.
- Assists our Financial Secretary by tabulating giving reports since all information is provided electronically.
- Remember you can do it your way. You can schedule a contribution that is convenient for you, just as though you were writing a check. It can be made weekly, biweekly, or monthly. Any amount you would like, just like you would have done for the envelope.
- Or if you would prefer, the contribution could be scheduled for any amount and on any schedule
 as a reoccurring contribution that is done automatically.



Did you know?

On page 13, Stewie discussed how online giving benefits the church. Did you know that how you process that online giving also makes a big difference? When giving online you are given the choice of paying by e-check, debit or credit card. If possible, please choose **E-CHECK**. There is a processing fee associated with all online giving. The fee for credit/ debit cards is \$0.42 per transaction plus 2.74% of the amount given. The fee for e-check is only \$0.24 per transaction plus 0.4% of the amount given. If you give by e-check rather than your debit card, you save the church quite a bit of money over the year. If you have your giving automatically transmitted, please go online to check your payment settings. It is a small change on your part that can give a lot of change (\$) to St. Mark!




A Life Observed
