Spiritual Disciplines for Advent

During Advent you are encouraged to participate in specific spiritual disciplines which will help build you up in the Lord Jesus Christ as well as the entire church. If you have any questions, please feel free to ask me. If I look too busy, please still ask. I always look busy. I don't know how to look as if I have nothing to do. I am never too busy for you.

- 1. Put your focus on God. Every day please pick one attribute of God, one character quality of God, one truth about God and mediate on that all day long. An attribute, character quality, or truth about God are all one in the same. Please pick one thing about God every day during Advent and let it sit in your brain. Yes, in Genesis God is the Creator. In Exodus God is the Deliverer and the Law Giver. Where I think is the best place to go is the Psalms for every Psalm tells us something about God that builds us up and strengthens our faith. When our minds think on God, our spirits are uplifted.
- 2. Please take the spiritual gift test. I know many of you have already taken the test but please retake it. The church will host a one-day workshop in the near future on how to put your spiritual gifts to use. In the Bible we find there are at least 27 spiritual gifts. A spiritual gift is a spiritually-charged gift, talent and/or ability that when put to use encourages and builds up the church. When every Christian in the

church puts their spiritual gifts to use, the church grows in ways too many to number. There is an excitement in the air for God is doing something through you that is significant and is one of the reasons God saved you. There is great joy in putting your God-given gifts to work, and all for the glory of God.

- 3. Please read through the book, "I Am A Church Member." I believe it will open your eyes in ways that will not only help you individually but all of us collectively. God does not want us busier in the church. We are already busy enough. But God's church is the most important institution on this earth. We are a family. And God's ways are always best. The book shows us how good the church can be.
- 4. Please make this your prayer of the day every day during Advent.

Dear Heavenly Father, thank you for giving me spiritual gifts. Please show me how to put them to use for Your glory. Please give all of us a love for the lost and the unchurched. Forgive us for keeping our faith to ourselves when we have in us what every person needs, the Lord Jesus Christ. Please touch their lives as we are ready for You to work through us. This we pray in the name of Jesus. Amen.

God Bless you and keep you safe and healthy this Advent/ Christmas season.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Advent Wardrobe

Hot and humid summer weather seems to last forever in east central Missouri. It's not my cup of tea.

But fall and winter do eventually arrive. What a joy to look for clothes that I forgot I had. For instance, on a recent raw day in the 40s, I needed a heavy work shirt--but not too heavy--as I set out lugging a backpack leaf blower. I rediscovered my Carhartt lined shirt. Putting it on was like a hug from an old friend.

It's the same way with trusted and true work boots. Footing is everything doing outdoor work. I've got 10" Red Wings for most chores and 10" Danners (insulated) with Vibram soles for tree work in cold weather.

In the same way that we "put on" a shirt or boots for work, the Bible uses "put on" language to describe how we clothe ourselves with Christ by faith.

Consider the words of Romans 13:14: "But <u>put on</u> the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires." This comes just after we are told, "<u>Cast off</u> the works of darkness and <u>put on</u> the armor of light" (13:12).

Notice the underlined words. Trusting in Christ is like stripping off old dirty clothes and putting on new ones. The metaphor of putting on clothing occurs elsewhere: "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have <u>put on</u> Christ" (Galatians 3:27).

As we enter the Advent season, we can celebrate a relationship with God that is as real, comforting, protective, and heartwarming as our favorite flannel shirt or winter coat. We are invited to wrap ourselves in Jesus. We do this through prayer, through worship, through Scripture reading, through praise, and all the other means of grace God grants us.

There are innumerable ways to open our hearts to Jesus. Yes, putting on Jesus is a matter of the heart. It is personal, invisible. Jesus said, "Pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you" (Matthew 6:6). If we don't have a secret relationship with God, we have no relationship at all.

But that hidden friendship becomes visible. We show we have <u>put on</u> Christ by the behaviors we adopt.

Consider the fact that we, through faith in Christ, "put on the new self, created after the likeness of God in true righteousness and holiness" (Ephesians 4:24). Talk about a miracle! With faith comes a "new self." Jesus wasn't kidding when talked about being born again.



Because of God's Advent blessing in sending Jesus, Christians should be the best-dressed people around, having "put on the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation" (1 Thessalonians 5:8). We are told, "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience" (Colossians 3:12).

Best of all, in an age of tumult and rage, we find that in Jesus we can "<u>put on</u> love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony" (Colossians 3:14).

We all have favorite garments for the holiday season. We break them out each year as the snow falls, the temperature dips, and Christmas carols start to fill the air.

The best holiday garb of all is Christ: his righteousness, his promises, his presence, his guidance, and his grace. No wardrobe could be richer in comfort and appearance in God's sight.

PADS Season Update



This year, however, there will be one church opened per night to house up to 20 homeless guests. St. Mark will not be one of those churches. Instead, we are helping to supply food and volunteers at First Presbyterian Church in Libertyville on Wednesday nights/Thursday mornings. It is located in downtown Libertyville at 219 W. Maple. St Mark's Three Days of Prayer January 11-12 and 13

"It is written, He said to them, 'My house will be called a house of prayer."

St. Mark Church will be participating in our seventh LCMC *Three Days of Prayer* from Tuesday, January 11 through Thursday, January 13, 2022. We are asking for your earnest prayers that Our Lord guide each of our hearts and minds to prepare and participate in this challenging time for St. Mark and all Christian churches as we face increasing hostility from an intolerant culture.

Our prayer is to set aside time to: 1) glorify and honor Our Lord; 2) confess our sins and seek his forgiveness; 3) petition our Lord for a spiritual revival of our church body as well as leadership's wisdom and courage to step out in faith; and, 4) trust and obey the Holy Spirit's direction and to help us refocus on our mission in carrying out the Great Commission.

Martin Luther's teaching on God's command to pray.

And the first matter is to know that it is our duty to pray because of God's commandment. For thus we heard in the Second Commandment: Thou shalt not take the name of the lord, thy God, in vain, that we are there required to praise that holy name, and call upon it in every need, or to pray. For to call upon the name of God is nothing else than to pray. Prayer is therefore as strictly and earnestly commanded as all other commandments: to have no other God, not to kill, not to steal, etc. But praying, as the Second Commandment teaches, is to call upon God in every need. Therefore everybody, no matter what he has to say in prayer, should always come before God in obedience to this commandment. \(^1\)

So please mark your calendars to set aside a time to join your St. Mark family in at least one of our LCMC *Three Days of Prayer*, Tuesday, January 11, Wednesday, January 12 and Thursday, January 13. You may set aside a time(s) during the day for prayer. In the evening, we are planning to meet for evening prayers from 7:00pm to 7:45pm. You may 1) either drop in for part of the time or 2) join us and stay. You may either pray silently or aloud. There will be opportunities for individual and group prayers.

Prayer guides will be available, if desired. Watch weekly announcements for updates in mid-December. Our prayer is each St. Mark member, family, youth, and child listen for and answer Christ's call to prayer. 

ENDOWMENT FUND CONTINUES TO GROW

We are excited to share with St Mark how well our Endowment Fund has grown over the last couple of years. Your continued contributions and the Thrivent investment skills has allowed our fund to increase to a market value over \$53,000. **Thank You** St Mark for those donations.

Earlier, we indicated that only a little of the Endowment Fund would be used to support St Mark's mission. The remainder would be left to grow. Over time, as gifts are made to it and the principal grows, the Endowment



Fund becomes a substantial way for the church to expand its mission in our community. Earlier this year we used \$800 from the fund to pay scholarships for Camp Timber-Lee campers.

The IRS Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) is back this year. Did you know that the IRS allows you to contribute directly from your IRA to St Mark to meet your RMD without paying income taxes on the contribution? When you donate to St Mark via the Giving page of our website, all those contributions are considered tax deductible donations. If you ask the company managing your IRA to send money directly to the St Mark Endowment Fund, that contribution counts toward your required minimum distribution and it does not count as taxable income. A question I was asked after providing a ChurchDoctor update was, "how will the congregation know how the Action Plan Task Force (Fab 5) prioritizes recommendations in case we're interested in a particular recommendation?" Our *Movement for Improvement* Fab 5 Action Team is currently meeting each week to organize, not so much prioritize, the 160 recommendations in order to determine which group or committee to assign each one to for the development of action plans. Some are pretty easy to determine because they're specific, like the recommendation to continue livestreaming after Covid. That appears to easily fit with Worship & Music. Another one, utilize the Ed Center space as a daycare, is compelling but huge and may likely take years to implement due to studies and research needed first. It's gained interest by several of you and for that reason, even if it's assigned to a particular group or committee, we want to set it up so the congregation knows who it's assigned to and any of you can approach that group or person to offer your thoughts, opinions and engagement. That way such a huge undertaking won't fall to 2-3 people on a committee. How that is done will be up to the Fab 5 and the Council, to be sure you're all aware of opportunities, but it will happen, because this process is intended to meet as many members as possible "where they are" for optimal congregational engagement. Watch for more to come.

One of the recommendations that *will* be implemented shortly in our *Movement for Improvement* is going to be a wonderful opportunity for each of us to find out what our dominant and subordinate Spiritual Gifts are. Once you complete your own profile during Advent, you'll indicate what your gifts are on a card that you'll turn in to Deb Zuchowski so the information can be entered into our Servant Keeper database. Then on **Saturday, January 22nd**, Tracee Swank will return to St. Mark to facilitate

a workshop to help us understand how our spiritual gifts describe where we fit in the body of Christ. Taken from the workbook that is included for all who participate, "Instead of urging us to go to work as a volunteer so some job gets accomplished, God begins with us, not with the job. He has a divine calling for each one of us. His primary objective is for each of us to find supernatural fulfillment. He doesn't want to use us, He wants to bless us. Our gifts guide us to our "divine sweet spot". You will remember Tracee from the Oral Presentation provided in October; she is an excellent speaker and facilitator, having presented all over the country at LCMC events and other churches. So please plan to attend! A sign-up link will be available and there will be no charge for members to participate in the workshop. Stay tuned!!

Wishing you a special time of Christ's light shining brightly in your hearts and homes as we anticipate the celebration of His birth, Immanuel, God with us.


Holiday Dinner In A Bag

InZone views its homes as Christian facilities, however its student-base includes adherents to a diverse range of religions and non-religion.

The InZone homes offer its students regular Sunday chapel services and encourages the sharing of daily devotions focused on building up the confidence of students before they head to school.






Best of All
