

2024 Prayer Guide for St. Mark Lutheran Church

"Seek the Lord and His strength, seek his presence continually," 1 Chronicles 16:11

How thankful we can be that we can enter into prayers with our brothers and sisters in Christ at St. Mark Lutheran Church, a church body which is strongly rooted in the truth of God's Word and in the belief that God is fully alive and calling us to follow Him.

Communicating with God - speaking *and* listening to Him - is one of the great gifts and privileges of being his child. It should be the centerpiece of your spiritual journey. Prayer is a wonderful gift, an ever-accessible. So as we enter into 2024 Easter Season and the rest of 2024, we do so in the confidence that God is listening to our prayers and answering them in His perfect way. We seek revival of St. Mark Lutheran Church, our community, nation and the world. Revival is birthed in ongoing prayer and it begins with YOU.

For these Days of Transition, we are simply asking that you take time each day using this booklet, the *St. Mark 2024 Prayer Brochure*, and the *Youth Prayer Guide* to pray for (1) the concerns presented, (2) adding whatever prayers you may be inspired to say and you may (3) join with others near and far in prayer. Please take an extra copy of the booklet and give it to a friend. They too will be enriched by the passages and following prayers.

Why Should We Pray?

NOTE: Christian service is most effective when prayer not only precedes it, but also flows together with it. When prayer is overlooked or appended as an afterthought to service, the power of God is often absent.

Here are ten reasons why.

- 1. Prayer enhances our fellowship and intimacy with God (Psalm 116:1-2; Jeremiah 33:2-3).
- 2. The Scriptures command us to pray (Luke 18:1; Ephesians 6:18; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18; 1 Timothy 2:1).
- 3. When we pray, we follow the example of Christ and other great people in Scripture like Moses and Elijah (Mark 1:35; Number 11:2; 1 Kings 18:36-37).
- 4. Prayer appropriates God's power for our lives (John 15:5; Acts 4:31; Ephesians 3:16; Colossians 4:2-4).
- 5. We receive special help from God when we pray (Hebrews 4:16).
- 6. Prayer makes a genuine difference (Luke 11:9-10; James 5:16-18). As William Temple is attributed to observing, "When I pray, coincidences happen; when I don't, they don't."
- 7. Prayer develops our understanding and knowledge of God (Psalms 37:3-6; 63;1-8; Ephesians 1:16-19).
- 8. Our prayers and God's answers give us joy and peace in our hearts (John 16:23-21; Philippians 4:4-7). Our problems may not disappear, but in prayer we gain a new perspective on our problems along with the peace and patience to stand firm.
- 9. Prayer helps us understand and accomplish God's purposes for our lives (Colossians 1:9-11).
- 10. Prayer changes our attitudes and desires (2 Corinthians 12:7-9).¹



Suggestions for Enhancing Your Practice of Prayer²

- Choose the best time. Select a particular time of the day, and dedicate it only to personal prayer.
- Choose the best place. Where there will be a minimum of interruptions and distractions.
- Set a minimum time for daily prayer. Try to be realistic - don't attempt too much at first, or prayer life will become mechanical and discouraging. "In prayer, quality is always better

than quantity."

- Be consistent. Picture it as a daily appointment you have made with God and respect it as much.
- Focus on the person of God. Prepare your heart and mind for prayer by releasing all stresses and concerns and giving them to the Lord. (1 Peter 5:7).

• Come before Him in humility. Judge yourself to be sure that you are approaching him honesty and openness, with no barriers of unconfessed sin, because he hates sin and cover-ups.

- Come expectantly to the throne. Come in simplicity and trust like a child to a father. Expect the supernatural ask Him for something only he can do (Genesis 18:14) and watch what happens.
- Pray at all times in the Spirit. "We do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groanings too deep for words" (Romans 8:26).
- Strive for a balanced diet. Our prayers should incorporate adoration, confession, supplication (intercession and petition), and thanksgiving.
- Pray Scripture back to God. By personalizing passages of Scripture and offering them back to the Lord, you integrate them in your life and experience and think God's after Him.
- Do not do all the talking. Practice time of silence before the Lord so that you can be sensitive to the prompting of His Spirit.
- Make prayer a part of your relationships with people. Prayer should be a part of the home and part of Christian friendships.
- Practice the presence of God. In this way, each task is rendered in his name and done in conscious dependence on him.
- We should to seek to cultivate the practice of praying for others as we see them and talk to them. Watch what affect it has on our attitudes and behavior.
- Begin to associate your work with prayer. "It is not prayer in addition to work, but prayer simultaneous with work.

The following is a suggested format for your use during these each day of prayer:

1. **SUBMITTING TO GOD** – Because of all You have done for me, I present my body to You as a living sacrifice for this day. I want to be transformed by the renewing of my mine, affirming that Your will is good for me and acceptable and perfect. (Romans 12:1-2)

One possible way to begin each time of prayer is to focus your mind by using a prayer known as "The Jesus Prayer." This very simple prayer has been used widely since its introduction in a book, *The Way of the Pilgrim*. This book describes a Russian peasant who traveled around trying to learn how to "pray without ceasing." (I Thessalonians 5:17) This prayer can be used to quiet the mind. It is short and simple but can also be used for deeper reflection as is demonstrated in the explanation below.

The Jesus Prayer:

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, Have mercy on me.

Lord - You are the One who hears our prayer. Lord you are in charge and we are your servants. Help us choose to please the One whom we serve rather than to choose to please ourselves.

Jesus - You bless little children and care for people's needs. You are our Friend. You became human and came to fill us up with joy.

Christ - You are God's anointed one. You fulfilled God's plan for our salvation. We all belong to you.

Son of God - When we speak to You in our prayers, we speak to God. You are the Eternal one of the Eternal Father. We stand in awe before the majesty of the Holy Trinity.

Have Mercy on us - Have mercy as we are in need and really can't help ourselves. Your help is a gift we can't earn or repay.

On Me - You, God, know us, love us, hear us and have mere	cy on us personally. Can be repeated

2. ADORATION AND THANKSGIVING

Offer a brief word of praise to God for one or more of His *attributes* (e.g., love and compassion, grace, mercy, holiness, goodness, omnipotence, omnipresence, omniscience, truthfulness, unchanging character, eternality) and/or *works* (e.g., creation, care, redemption, loving purposes, second coming).

Ask the Spirit to search your heart and reveal any areas of unconfessed sin. Acknowledge these to the Lord and thank Him for His forgiveness.

Submit yourselves therefore to God. Resist the devil, and he will flee from you. James 4:1.7 Prayer based on James 4:1-17

- Lord, instruct us regarding the passions that are at war in our members: Teach us to recognize our
 excessive attachments to worldly things, lest by friendship with the world we become Your
 enemies.
- Almighty God, who yearn jealously over the spirit You have made to dwell in us, make us humble that we may receive Your grace; and let us not be proud, lest we find ourselves opposing You.
- Help us to submit ourselves to You, and to resist the devil until he flees from us. Draw us near to You, Lord, as You draw near to us. Cleanse our hands, forgive our sins, purify our hearts, and make us single-minded in turning ever toward You.
- Teach us to mourn for the miserable state of Your Church in this world, the wretchedness and dejection she suffers in striving to walk in Your Way.
- Guide us not to judge one another, as the judgment of souls is Yours alone; but let us not forget our obligation to judge sins, because for this You have given us Your law, and by this, our sins can be forgiven
- All this we pray in Your own holy Name, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, one God, world without end Amen and Amen


Read Romans 12:1 and pray using Romans 12:1

Be on ALERT to the promptings/warnings of the Holy Spirit to pray mightily to put up hedges of protection and secure boundaries around those who He directs you to pray. Yourself, family, friend(s), neighbor(s), church, community, state and nation. Note: Revival, restoration can be unsettling.

- 6. Ask in the Spirit. (Romans 8:26-27; Ephesians 6:18; Jude 20)
- 7. Ask in fellowship. (John 15:7: James 5:16: 1 John 3:21-22)
- 8. Ask frequently (1 Chronicles 16:11; Colossians 4:2; Thessalonians 5:17: Luke 8:1)
- 9. Ask with others. (Matthew 18:19-20; Romans 15:30)
- 10. Ask in Jesus' name (John 14:13-14;16:24; Ephesians 3:11-12; Hebrews 10:19-22)

Reflection on your Prayers

Take three or four minutes after you have finished praying to reflect on the prayer. This is not part of the prayer, but a separate exercise. How did the prayer get started? Were you aware of God's presence, or was there a sense that you were simply thinking by yourself? Did any parts of the prayer seem especially "alive" as you prayed? Did you have times of strong convictions or emotion, and if so, what were they? Did they seem to be moving you closer to God, or farther away?

What difficulties did you encounter? Did you feel tired or bored or experience other barriers? Did you find your mind wandering, and if so, to what? What were you praying over when this happened? How did you respond?

Did you have any sense of being called to respond or carry out some action? If so, what was it? What was the general "tone" of your prayer: warm and loving? Difficult or painful? Dark? Reassuring? Sobering? Foggy?

Did you pray with an attitude of thanksgiving and gratitude?
