MISSOURI MUSINGS

BY BOB YARBROUGH Trustworthy Father

The lines of some hymns stick with us. Here's one: "The arm of flesh will fail you / you dare not trust your own." That's from a hymn called "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus."

We trust in God, through faith in Jesus Christ, not in people. Not even in ourselves. Let me say that more strongly: *especially* not in ourselves.

The Bible teaches us that even though Jesus was the Son of God, he "learned obedience through what he suffered" (Hebrews 5:8). He trusted his heavenly Father as life threw him all kinds of curves. Jesus said, "I can do nothing on my own. As I hear, I judge, and my judgment is just, because I seek not my own will but the will of him who sent me" (John 5:30). He trusted the Father.

He trusted the Father even on the cross: "Then Jesus, calling out with a loud voice, said, 'Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!' And having said this he breathed his last" (Luke 23:46).

When Peter trusted in himself, it got him into trouble. Recall that scene from the night Jesus was betrayed: "Peter said to him, 'Even if I must die with you, I will not deny you!' And all the disciples said the same" (Matthew 26:35). Big talk. Hours later Peter denied Jesus. All the disciples deserted him with the possible exception of John.

Jesus warned those who "trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and treated others with contempt" (Luke 18:9). He also warned against the human tendency to seek human approval rather than God's approval: "I have come in my Father's name, and you do not receive me. If another comes in his own name, you will receive him. How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and do not seek the glory that comes from the only God?" (John 5:43–44).

Here's the point. It's important that we trust in God, through faith in Christ, more than we trust in anything or anyone else.

We have a trustworthy Father, who sent his trustworthy Son. By the Holy Spirit God has given us his trustworthy word the Bible: "All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness" (2 Timothy 3:16).

Politics will disillusion us. Financial markets are fickle. Our bodies will eventually age. People will let us down. Only God is worthy of our

ultimate trust. This is a great theme of the Psalms: "Put not your **trust** in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation" (146:3). "It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to **trust** in man" (Psalm 118:8). "**Some** trust in chariots and some in horses, but we **trust** in the name of the LORD our God" (20:7).

This doesn't mean we live paranoid lives, suspicious of everything around us. There is much goodness in the world. We are blessed with many trustworthy family members and friends. And don't forget our dog or cat who depend on us, as we depend on them. And they come through! Well, most of the time.

But there is a level of commitment that we reserve for God only: "You shall have no other gods before me" (Exodus 20:3). We know this God saves only through faith in Christ. "The Scripture says, 'Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame' (Romans 10:11).

These have been hand crocheted/knitted with a prayer in each stitch, for the well-being of the recipient! Please plan on stopping by our display after each service. There is also a supply of yarn available. I you are familiar

with "granny squares", all the scraps that we have could easily be made into a small comfort shall. Even if you do not want to make a completed shawl, just make the squares. I know we have folks who would gladly put them together!

St Mark has a glorious future ahead and God will lead and guide us.

Over the past year and a half, we've been implementing some initiatives. Let's take a look at how we're doing with the gifts and talents God has provided.

Our list of 161 recommendations included 61 that were all blessings for which to thank God. There was purpose in including those 61 individual blessings for which to give thanks. We are inclined to get caught up in our busy lives and many things God provides for us are taken for granted so each Tuesday over 61 weeks last year and early into this year, each of the blessings was highlighted in a prayer request distributed through the email list maintained by the church office. Please continue to pray for these blessings – this isn't a one and done. God provides these things continually and it is right to thank Him continually for them.

Our Call Committee's search has been active and has been updated to seek a Senior Pastor instead of a Co-pastor.

Close to 100 of you completed your Spiritual Gifts profiles so we have a good picture of the primary strengths across our congregation. Service and helps are prominent and that should come as no surprise when we consider the faithful servants who keep St Mark running smoothly, the majority unseen except in God's eyes and the eyes of those who know who they are and all they do.

We've had 2 Spiritual Gift workshops to help people know how to use their God given gifts.

More of you have joined Bible studies and new Bible studies have begun. Several of the participants are non-St Mark members and were invited by our members, just as we were encouraged to do.

Live-streaming continues each week and our Facebook presence is drawing more of you to help us be more visible to social media users outside St Mark whenever you "like", comment or share a post.

Our beautiful new outdoor message sign significantly updated our property appearance and when the plantings bloom this spring and summer, it'll look even more beautiful.

If you read the Council minutes, you're aware that a Community Garden is in the works, to be located at the NW end of our property. This will be a fabulous outreach opportunity.

We've received many responses to the membership questionnaire that was recently distributed via email and snail mail. If you haven't yet responded or don't recall receiving the questionnaire, paper copies are available in the narthex under the bulletin board. Please complete one to help us update our membership rolls.

That leaves a number of recommendations yet to be initiated and completed and if you recall any of them resounding with you, please let a Council member know of your interest in participating. If you need another copy of the recommendations, you can obtain one from the church office.

I wish you all a very special Holy Week of remembering the Passion of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, culminating with the abundant Joy of the Holy Spirit as we celebrate Christ's resurrection and our freedom from the bondage of sin.

The Financial Audit has been rescheduled for Thursday, May 11, 2023 due to date conflicts in March and April.

A motion carried to pay Paychex \$1942.65 to file for an Employee Retention Tax Credit of \$13,598.52 on behalf of St. Mark. Paychex assumes potential liability for filing errors and eliminates potential liability on St. Mark.

A motion carried to approve the location of a Community Garden on the northwest corner of St. Mark's property. A restricted fund was approved for potential donations to the Garden.

A motion carried to approve 2023 Confirmands: Alyn Appelt, Madeline Butler, William Honaker, Leah Koslosky, Samuel Krook, Reina Maciareillo, Zeke Quane, Matthew Sanderson, Sydney Schneider.

A motion carried to create a restricted fund for Easter Breakfast donations and to donate excess Easter Breakfast donations to the 2023 Mission Trip after all Easter Breakfast expenses are paid.

A motion carried to approve new Evangelism Committee members, Kurt Ulbricht and Fred Natschke.

The Council accepted with regrets, Pastor Terry Breum's retirement, effective Monday, March 20, 2023.

Greetings from the call committee! Previously, we had received 7 applicants for the co-pastor position we were seeking to fill. The position had been posted since September of 2022. Ultimately, the applicant decided not to pursue further with us for personal reasons. This all took place before Pastor leaving. Everything happens at God's perfect timing. Perhaps God chose not to fill the co-pastor position because He knew we were going to be needing something more. (A thought that was shared with us and makes perfect sense!)

With the recent departure of Pastor Breum, the committee will be re-wording the position available and updating the posting. We will be expanding our search beyond those that identify with 'available for call' on the LCMC website. We also seek prayers for endurance, discernment, and wisdom as we move forward. We appreciate all prayers for this new search and for our church as a whole!



COLUMBARIUM UPDATE

Where is it you might ask? When the Peace Garden and Columbarium project was announced about one year ago, it was expected that the Columbarium would be in place by the fall with the garden to be completed this spring. Well, clearly the project is behind schedule. Why?

- The manufacturer of the columbarium was delayed by several months receiving the granite needed for the structure. Its expected availability for delivery of last fall has been extended to late spring.
- Our landscape architect had emergency cancer surgery followed by a heart attack and then a broken leg. His creation of the necessary construction drawings for contractors have been delayed during his various recovery periods. We now have design dr

his various recovery periods. We now have design drawings and a foundation drawing but are still waiting for the peace garden dimensional drawings needed for site excavation.

You are here to love the Lord your God and to love your neighbor. You are here to share what you have and who you are. And you are here to unite together as we discover how to live like Jesus.



Important Prayer Opportunity for Our Muslim Neighbors Here and Abroad March 19 to April 18, 2023

A mighty spiritual battle has and is continuing to rage between Christians and Muslims for hearts, minds and souls worldwide. Have media soundbites convinced you that Muslim's are to be feared or hated? Have you observed these attitudes in yourself, family, or even within a church setting? A well-documented fact, but not generally reported in Western media, is that unprecedented numbers of our world's Muslim neighbors have discovered the heart transforming presence of Christ in their lives over the last three or so decades. This awakening is the result of prayers, witnessing and softening of Muslims' hearts by the wooing of the Holy Spirit.

This year Lent, Easter and Ramadan calendars are overlapping with Easter falling one day before "Laylat al-Qadr, the "Night of Power", which celebrates the revelation of the Quran's first verses to the Islamic prophet Muhammad. It is an exceptionally significant event - prayers and good deeds done on this night are considered to be of greater value than all the prayers and good deeds done in a thousand months. This night is also known "Night of Destiny", when many believe their fate for the following year is determined. Therefore, it is especially important for Muslims to pray for forgiveness and blessings on this night, and many will pray throughout the night. It is also believed that the angels spend this night in constant journey between heaven and earth, dispensing peace and blessings on believers as they pray.

This is the night of all nights when Jesus reveals himself to Muslim individuals in their dreams."1

How to pray on this night of Monday, April 17 (one day after Easter):

That God will miraculously reveal Himself to them in their dreams and visions as Muslims are seeking God with real focus.

Many Muslims are seeking forgiveness for their sins on this night. Pray that they will have a revelation of Jesus, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world (John 1:29).

Pray for this Night of Destiny to bring opportunities for followers of Jesus to share the Gospel with their family and friends.

When Do I Pray? Sunday, March 19 to Tuesday, April 18 during Ramadan, the season of fasting and praying. As they fast and devote themselves to Islamic rituals, you're invited to join other Christians in prayer that many Muslims will be drawn into a relationship with Jesus. And, if the Holy Spirit calls you pray during the season of Ramadan and beyond, how are you going to respond? Are you listening? Will you obey His call?

In the Bible, the Good Samaritan is an example of someone who had margin in his life so that he could make a contribution. Remember the story? A guy was mugged on his way from Jerusalem to Jericho. The attackers beat him up, robbed him of all his stuff, and left him for dead at the side of the road. The first guy who came walking by and saw him was a religious leader who had no margin in his life. He was in a hurry and basically said, "I don't have time to help this guy." And he walked on. Another religious leader walked by. He said, in effect, "I've got my own agenda. I've got my own goals and ambitions. I'm too busy. I don't want to be associated with that guy anyway." And he walked past the dying man.

The third guy came along, and he had every reason to pass. He was a Samaritan, and the Samaritans and Jews hated each other. But he stopped anyway. He put this total stranger on his donkey, took him to the nearest hotel, and told the manager something like this: "You feed him, you clothe him, you restore him to health, and I'll pay for it."

When was the last time you helped someone in need? (One of our Lenten Spiritual Disciplines is to do 3 Random Acts Of Kindness – have you done yours yet????) If it's been so long you don't even remember, you probably don't have any margin in your life. But this guy did. He had time margin; he left early enough to stop along the way to help somebody in need. He had financial margin; he was able to give away his money. And he had energy margin; he was able to help because he wasn't stressed out.

Every day of your life, you walk by people you could help (in the world AND <u>at St. Mark</u>). But if you're overloaded and only focused on your own life, you can't stop to help anybody. You can't make a contribution.

When you boil it all down in life, there are only two kinds of people: givers and takers. Which are you going to be?

3 POINTS TO PRAY ABOUT

- What unique abilities has God given you? How are you using them to bless others (in the world AND at St. Mark)?
- How does culture try to convince you to be a taker instead of a giver?
- In what ways can you build margin into your life so that you are focused on other people (in the world AND at St. Mark) and not yourself?
