From the Desk of Intentional Interim Pastor Steve

Greeting brothers and sisters in Christ

Transitions can be scary times and can create anxiety all by themselves. My primary role here is to be your pastor, to worship with you, to proclaim to you God's Word, to study the Bible together, to walk with you, to remind you that God is present and active here at St. Mark!

It's so great to be here! I've really enjoyed our visits together and encourage anyone who has yet to sign up to sign up. As we begin our time together, I want to meet as many people as possible. MISSOURI MUSINGS

Trustworthy Torah

Summer brings thunderstorms. That can mean wind damage. Trees can be toppled. We had strong straight-line winds recently. They tore down a very old red cedar. Here are the logs from its double trunk:

When you work up a tree like that, you need to know what you're doing. I was guided by principles learned from my father and then from years of cutting down trees.

In all of life, we need principles to guide us. Where do we find them? Christians look to the Bible. Good idea: Jesus did too. He quoted Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms frequently.

Jesus knew that the five books of Moses (Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy) are the foundation of the church's saving knowledge of God. These books are called the Torah.



Genesis teaches us that God made our world and is sovereign over it. It tells us that he made man and woman. It tells us what our mission as humans is, both male and female: "Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth, and subdue it" (Genesis 1:28). God established marriage between one man and one woman. When they fell into sin, God took steps to limit the damage and make a way to return to him. He promised a savior, the seed of woman, who would crush the serpent's head (3:15).

The rest of Genesis tells of Noah and the flood and the true meaning of the rainbow, which is a promise between God and all the earth that "the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh" (9:15). Too bad that the rainbow has been hijacked today as a sign of human pride in rejection of how God made us, according to Genesis and Jesus (Matthew 19:4).

Genesis goes on to show how all peoples were blessed through promises made to Abraham (see Genesis 12:1–3). Abraham becomes the model of faith in God's promise for Christians (see Romans 4).

Abraham died in faith awaiting that promise. Jesus said, "Abraham rejoiced to see My day, and he saw it and was glad" (John 8:56 NASB). This is the promise that was fulfilled in Christ's coming, his death, and his resurrection. Hallelujah!

"Torah" is a Hebrew word that means teaching or guidance. It can also be translated "law." But the Torah should be viewed first as a book of trustworthy instruction. It tells the story of human beginnings, the aftermath, and God's foundational work to redeem the world. It is certainly not a set of outmoded rules.

Because Jesus and the apostles quoted the Torah so much, and it is part of our Bible, we know it contains trustworthy principles for our walk before God each day as well as for our heavenly hope.

When you drag out a big chainsaw to cut up storm-damaged trees, you need to operate based on solid principles.

When you face life's daily and finally eternal challenges, you need the trustworthy Torah. It tells us who we are, what is wrong with us and our world (hint: sin), and how God is redeeming our souls and the cosmos by his promises and faithful actions.

Many of these promises are established in the Torah. All of them are fulfilled in our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ.



St. Mark Council News

Council Highlights July 2023

A Council retreat is scheduled for Friday evening and Saturday, October 13-14.

The LCMC Annual Gathering will be held in St. Charles, MO October 1-4; anyone interested in attending should contact IIPastor Steve or Joni Wasmund.

In depth discussion of serving alcohol on church property acknowledged that arrangements with vendors to be the servers are subject to contracts and additional insurance requirements and although they may provide the church with additional layers of protection in the event that something goes wrong, they do not necessarily assume all responsibility. In light of the potential liability in the absence of a detailed and specific policy to include parameters that would be necessary to protect St Mark from risk, not only legal and monetary but also reputational risk, the guidelines as stated in the policy manual will remain in place (Alcoholic beverages, liquors or other non-physician prescribed drugs will not be permitted on church property at any time).

The 2024 budget draft was reviewed and edited for updates pending final approval during the August Council meeting.

The updated PTO (Paid Time Off for Staff) Policy were approved.



Did you know?

- When giving online, you save the church money by processing your donation as a check direct from your checking account rather than through a credit card.
- When giving online you can give a one time donation, or set up automatic payments.

Fin Facts

 When giving online you can select general giving or special giving for designated funds like flowers, memorial gifts, building fund, etc.

As of June 30th St. Mark had \$286,256 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in a contingency account. Due to staff vacancies, the church is running a net income for the first half of the year in the amount of \$57,000.

You ask, "what is an Altar Server"?

Besides the Pastor, no one else so closely plays a part in the presentation of the Elements of Holy Communion. Your participation as an Altar Server is special. When you serve Communion, you serve the people of God, and you serve Christ. You have seen our servers during Communion in their white Albs with crosses and the rope belt. Altar servers are typically scheduled for Holy Communion every Saturday evening at 5:30pm and the 1st and 3rd Sundays both 8am and 10:30am. Servers assist by serving the bread on Saturday and on Sunday we need three servers for each service to serve the bread or wine.

As an Altar Server, you will do tasks that others will never do. You will learn things that others will never know. You will see the Worship service in ways that others may never see it. You will do it all for the Honor and Glory of God.



From your Church Doctor Task Force

We are looking forward to working with Pastor Steve and the Transition Team as St. Mark continues to work towards getting a new pastor. Besides Pastor Steve coming on board here, there are a lot of exciting things happening at St. Mark: Christmas In July, the Mission Trip to Logan, WV, our annual Rummage Sale, and planning for our first HarvestFest!!



We also want to support and/or help all the committee ministry teams prosper in 2023 as well as in the future. As a reminder, here are the 2023 Vision Statements given to us this past February:

<u>Congregational Life</u> – As a committee, it is our vision to continue to provide fun activities for the St. Mark members. We also plan to sponsor events that invite the public into St. Mark with the hope that they will choose to become members at some point.

<u>Church Council (Best Practice & The Elders)</u> – Pray for the Call Committee, the Organist, the youth of our congregation, and pray for the community (the unchurched) to find St. Mark.

<u>Evangelism</u> – To train disciples of Christ to share the gospel with the world. St. Mark is the heart of the greater Lake Villa community, dedicated to making sure everyone knows that they belong, they are loved by God and worthy of it.

Finance – Working on a Checklist, updating policies, continue with Fin-Facts, looking for additional members.

<u>Stewardship</u> – Continue with Stewie – encourage members to be involved with the church with small projects. Inform congregation what really goes into our budget.

Worship & Music – We want each of our services to glorify God and lead the congregation into deeper worship through musical excellence, creativity and passion flowing from the Holy Spirit.

Praying in Unprecedented Times



Continued from June and July 2023 Voice...

So how do we live in these unprecedented times? We live with character, integrity, purpose, a calling, and hope. Christ is to be the center of our life, not our self. In the previous *Voice* I shared an exercise to help to train yourself to practice, when you are anxious, fearful and full of concern. Do this for 40 days faithfully, a habit shall develop and you will find the peace of God which transcends all understanding which will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ.

Here is timely life story illustrating this truth. Our son, Andy is a history buff and serves on the Waterford, Wis. Town Board. The town has been storing a historic rusting cannon used in the Spanish American war in one of their maintenance buildings for several years. Being one of only four remaining in the United States, Andy decided to build a July 4th float displaying the cannon so as to raise restoration funds. Speakers were in place to blare Tchaikovsky's *1812 Overture* with the symphony's cannons blasting as the float rolled by. Unfortunately, Andy's work phone, the vital tech link to playing the sound into the float's speakers had gone missing! Best guess, it disappeared Monday evening after he and his daughters, Natalia and Natasha, had decorated the float and drove it to its overnight parking spot. Anxiety and lots more followed into the night as numerous places were combed over in the house, the yard, the streets traveled, and no phone! Company tracking was unavailable due to the holiday. What to do? Morning of July 4th a mad scramble to refigure a tech connection. It worked so well, Andy's float won first prize in the open class.

Afternoon of July 4th it was acknowledged only God knew where the location of the phone lie. I suggested Andy relax and leave the phone issue in God's hands. Andy had prayed, but it was as he was running out of human options as well as his mindset was that God was not interested in "little things." Andy sighed, "I am done stressing about the phone. It's in God's hands." Later after, Cliff and I left for home, John, Andy's brother-in-law, declared he would call the phone just one more time and told Andy to "Just keep the faith." John dialed the phone and a woman answered! Her autistic grandson had spotted the phone. It was lying in a curbside on a street which Andy had not traveled while towing the float to and from various locations. Joy and gratitude filled our households.

The lesson: pray first, trust and obey God's teaching Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. Philippians 4:6-7.

Over time as you make a habit of turning the anxiety, fear and concern into a prayer and petition, with thanksgiving to God, you shall find the true peace of God which guards your heart and mind even in a world of fear and anxiety.

Grace is the church's great distinctive. It's the one thing the world cannot duplicate, and the one thing it craves above all else--for only grace can bring hope and transformation to a jaded world. Yancey sets grace in the midst of life's stark images, tests its mettle against horrific "ungrace":


Can grace survive in the midst of such atrocities as the Nazi holocaust? Can it triumph over the brutality of the Ku Klux Klan?

In his most personal and provocative book ever, Yancey offers compelling, true portraits of grace's life-changing power. He searches for its presence in his own life and in the church. He asks, "How can Christians contend graciously with moral issues that threaten all they hold dear?"

And he challenges us to become living answers to a world that desperately wants to know, *What's So Amazing About Grace?* You can find this book under call number 234 YAN.


