Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

As president-elect of St. Mark for the coming year, I would like to share some of my thoughts and goals with you.

I sincerely thank Joni for her dedication to St. Mark for the past three years. All of us appreciate her time and effort to help move our church forward through a difficult time. It is my prayer that Joni continues to help in the growth of our church.

My goals are simple, yet complex as I will work to move Christ's Kingdom forward, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, at St. Mark and our community.

- 1) To fully support the work of the Transition and Call teams in their work to secure a Christ centered pastor who will bring renewal to St. Mark.
- 2) To invite more people to accept Christ and prayerfully attend St. Mark, especially young families with children. We should explore better use of the Ed Center to make it a hub for youth activities: a day care center, a facility for home schooling, a place for after school care, nights for youth tutoring, scouting activities, etc. By using our resources to reach out to the community, "They'll Know We Are Christians by Our Love."
- 3) To simplify our church operations. Our ministry teams should serve as the primary facilitators in moving St. Mark forward with the support of the Council. Each ministry team will have an annual budget to be controlled at their discretion. When ministry teams are empowered to perform at the highest level, they will be more successful and the members will be happier and the results more satisfying.
- 4) To enhance communications between the leadership and the congregation. In addition, provide open communication to the community through direct mailings for events, press releases to the local media, and increased use of social media.

In today's world Christianity is under attack from many sides with agendas to marginalize the Christian influence. I pray that by all of us working together we take the Lord's Great Commission to "...make disciples of all nations..." and apply it to our own community.

Finally, I thank Deb Zuchowski and Rhonda Doran, who are leaving at the end of the year, for their dedication and work that greatly supported St. Mark through their years of service. Work is being done to replace both positions, but with the Holiday Season, these jobs may go unfulfilled so we ask for your patience. We also ask that if you have some free time in January, 2024 to help by volunteering to answer phones, assist in the office, and keep a daily routine going, your time will be greatly appreciated. From the Desk of Intentional Interim Pastor Steve


Greeting brothers and sisters in Christ

ENDOWMENT FUND CONTINUES TO GROW

We are excited to share with St Mark how well our Endowment Fund has grown over the last couple of years. Your continued contributions and the Thrivent investment skills has allowed our fund to increase to a market value over \$75,000. **Thank You** St Mark for those donations.

Earlier, we indicated that only a little of the Endowment Fund would be used to support St. Mark's mission; the remainder would be left to grow. Over time, as gifts are made to it and the principal grows, the Endowment Fund becomes a substantial way for the church to expand its mission in our community.

The IRS Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) is in full swing. Did you know that the IRS allows you to contribute directly from your IRA to St Mark to meet your RMD without paying income taxes on the contribution? When you donate to St. Mark via the Giving page of our website, all those contributions are considered tax deductible donations. If you ask the company managing your IRA to send money directly to St. Mark, marked for the Endowment Fund, that contribution counts toward your required minimum distribution and it does not count as taxable income. Confusing, maybe, but your income tax preparer knows all about this. A National Epidemic

Are you traveling for the holidays? Many are. They will visit family or friends. Sometimes conflict arises because we need to visit more than one place. If your own family lives in the same area as your in-laws, it can be hard to balance your time. You can't be two places at once.

But isn't it nice to be wanted? Not everyone has that "problem." In fact, according to the surgeon general of the US, Dr. Vivek Murthy, there is a national epidemic . . . of loneliness. Almost 1/3 of people in the US among 19–29 year-olds say they feel lonely. That number goes up to almost 40% among college students.

One report states: "The student loneliness epidemic is often associated with the COVID-19 pandemic shutdowns, which prevented young people from making connections in their usual classroom and extracurricular settings, but the issue dates to well before 2020."

Isn't it ironic? There has never been more "connectivity" in the form of cell phones, messaging, texting, and the like. "Influencers" have millions of "followers." But the more digital connection we have, the more isolated many feel.

Most who are caught up in *connectivity* have never discovered *Christianity*. By "Christianity" I mean not so much the institutional religion as personal faith in Christ and the bond we have with others as a result.

More than any media influencer, Christ connects us. He connects us with God: "For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1 Tim. 2:5).

Christ also connects us with other people. Through faith in him we have God as our heavenly Father. We have fellow believers as sisters and brothers.

To know Christ is to know you belong. Even after this life, we have a future home, for Jesus said, "I go to prepare a place for you" (John 14:2 KJV). But already, here and now, God is with us. We are not alone, ever. Consider such Scripture promises as:

"Fear not, for I am with you" (Gen. 26:24).

"The LORD your God is with you, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt" (Deut. 20:1).

"The LORD your God is he who goes with you to fight for you against your enemies" (Deut. 20:4).

"Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God" (Isa. 41:10).

"The God of love and peace will be with you" (2 Cor. 13:11).

One of Jesus' most famous promises is found in the last verse of Matthew's Gospel: "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (28:20).

Not only do we belong to God the Father in Christ: we belong to each other. It's one of the best things about church: we care about others, and others care about us.

Twenty years ago we were living in Venetian Village. I was driving my son Micah to a baseball tournament out in Rockford. These words of a Toby Keith country music song came on the radio: "I love this bar/It's my kind of place/Just walkin' through the front door/Puts a big smile on my face."

Not everybody smiles when they walk into St. Mark on Sunday. But many do. They love "the church," and they don't mean the building: they mean the people. They shake hands or hug in the narthex. They hang out between services in the fellowship hall. They may meet separately during the week.

I wonder if "St. Mark East" still meets in the McDonalds on Grand in Lindenhurst?

As the holidays are nearly upon us, remember that for many it's a lonely time. Take Romans 5:8 to heart: "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."

Then show to others the love God has shown to you. By ourselves we can't cure the national epidemic of loneliness. But we can receive and share with others the potent cure of belonging, to Christ and to each other.

A HUGE THANK YOU and an update about FEED MY STARVING CHILDREN

If you have been to FMSC in Libertyville lately, you may have noticed something new!! In the lobby is now a shelf with Bibles on it and a sign that says: "If you would like or need a Bible, take one. They are free!" Those Bibles are from St. Mark!! In August, after getting approval from Council and Worship and Music, I collected St. Mark's old unused Bibles and started putting them on the shelf to be taken by our volunteers. Looking at the number of boxes of Bibles we had, I figured it would take a *long* time to go through them all, but God had other ideas. In just over two months, 155 Bibles have been taken off the shelves and we are out of the used Bibles.

Now for the HUGE THANK YOU!! Seeing that there is definitely a need for Bibles in the area, I again approached Council and this time, Evangelism, seeking funds to purchase more Bibles. H.I.S. 
God Never Blinks

most popular columns ever published in the newspaper, and since then the 50 lessons


have been emailed to hundreds of thousands of people.

Financial Position & Year End Giving

As of October 31st St. Mark had \$325,775 (increase of \$11,000 since August) in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in a contingency account and \$363,262 in Restricted Funds. Due primarily to staff vacancies, and in spite of contributions being \$83,842 below budget, the church is running a net income (gain) through October in the amount of \$91,824.

Now that we will soon be at full staff, we expect a net *loss* in 2024 of approximately \$41,000. Losses of this magnitude cannot be absorbed indefinitely. Please carefully consider St. Mark in any year end giving you may be planning. Beyond tithing, year end offerings can help sustain a church through the lean years. General offerings or donations to one of St. Mark's Endowment Funds (see page 4) will be put to good use. Also, do not forget to designate those Thrivent Choice® dollars before the end of the year!
