President's Notes

Thank you to all who attended our Annual Meeting a few weeks ago and thank you for participating in a very good discussion. It's important to be able to have respectful dialogue among our church family members and I'm grateful we can do that with the Holy Spirit guiding the way.

It did bring to light the truth that the same people continue to say yes when asked to serve in capacities that require time commitments. We have many volunteers who serve weekly or monthly in needed roles to usher, greet, teach Sunday School, serve communion and many other functions and I can only say praise God for all of you. That said, we have approximately 25 volunteers who carry multiple plates and consequently commit 6-10 hours each week to ensure St. Mark is able to offer meaningful worship services and Sunday School and other programs and to keep the church running efficiently. Our records indicate that we currently have 405 active and non-active members over the age of 18. If there is any possibility of some of the 380 helping the 25 by assisting committees, it would make a remarkable difference. I have serious concerns about the health of some of our committee volunteers who are reaching the end of their abilities. No one should ever feel heavy levels of stress when serving our Lord but they're tired. There was anticipation that the Ministry Palooza might generate the interest of those who aren't yet committed to serving but there were very few who signed up for any of the needs. Some have limited abilities due to health reasons but others are healthy and just haven't found their niche. I'm not sure how long those who have been serving for 10-20 years non-stop will be able to continue. Young people and newer members are especially needed because when the same people continue to serve in the same capacity year after year, we don't get fresh, new ideas. God wants you to use your spiritual gifts and if you know you are using them, you are probably serving in a significant capacity and this message may not be for you.

From the Desk of Pastor Breum

Joshua 1:9 (NLT2) ⁹ "This is my command - be strong and courageous! Do not be afraid or discouraged. For the LORD your God is with you wherever you go."

Joshua 1:9 (MSG) ⁹ "Haven't I commanded you? Strength! Courage! Don't be timid; don't get discouraged. GOD, your God, is with you every step you take."

Thanksgiving is behind us and Christmas is in front of us. The Word of the Lord speaks to us year-round, for every season of time, and life. I feel at times like God's Word rescues us from ourselves, from the outside pressures that seek to destroy us, from unhealthy inner attitudes that can be so destructive, and from overwhelming fear that can stop us in our tracks and hold us from moving forward. Joshua played a huge role in the Exodus of God's people from Egypt on into the Promised Land and the conquering of the Promised Land. He was placed in a most impossible position, to take over the leadership of Moses after the death of Moses. Joshua had seen all the acts of God such as the parting of the Red Sea, the manna that came daily except on the Sabbath, water gushing from a rock, an earthquake that swallowed up those in rebellion, and the pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night which was the Presence of the Lord leading the people. He saw more than I can mention plus he was mentored by Moses to be the next leader of God's people.

Where do you find yourself today? Are you dealing with family relationships, emotions, situations, or a place of overwhelming responsibilities? You might even dread the thought of tomorrow for today was not all that easy. God spoke to Joshua directly and Joshua took in the Word of the Lord. I truly believe the Word of God brought great strength into Joshua.

Joshua looked up to Moses and saw how badly the people rebelled against Moses. Why would anyone with half a brain agree to be the next leader? 1. Joshua listened to God's calling on his life and in that calling came great strength to accomplish what God called him to do. Moses had left but God promised never to leave Joshua. God would be with him every step of the way. 2. God instructed Joshua to never let fear take over his life. In order for this to happen, Joshua listened to God and chose to put all of his trust in God, overriding his fears. I do believe the Presence of God touched Joshua deeply and Joshua sensed God's helpful Presence. 3. God spoke against discouragement which meant Joshua felt encouraged by God Himself to lead the people of God. Every word God spoke inspired Joshua and motivated him to walk with the Lord at every step.

I have a picture of my grandmother in my office. In her 80's her smile was precious. I could make a list of various problems, struggles, heartaches, and more that she experienced in her 98 years, but she lived every day in such a way that whatever happened to her did not stop her from doing good and she never was overcome by the evils she faced. Grandma kept going, kept serving, kept being helpful to us all, and all by an inner strength given to her by God. Her faith in God kept her going.

Jesus says to all of us, "Fear not." God is with us every step of the way. And yes, we are here for each other.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

St. Mark in South Africa

"Finally, brethren, pray for us, that the word of the Lord may run and be glorified . . ." (2 Thess. 3:1 ASV). Recent translations change "run" to something like "spread rapidly" (NIV) or "speed ahead" (ESV). But I like the awkward image of God's word running. For I see that word surging and bounding into people's lives with a sprinter's mad abandon. God's word *runs* as we study Scripture in seminary classes. It *runs* in churches on Sundays as the Bible is preached and taught. It *runs* daily in our personal lives as we read it, heed it, and live our lives for God's glory.

All over the world, the good news of Jesus Christ goes forth. The living and active word of God (Heb. 4:12) is on the loose. We need only latch on, hang on, and settle into the rich life in Christ that it maps out for us.

Recently I observed the Bible *running* in three different settings in South Africa. Pastor Bill Shields and I preached at two different churches in Cape Town on Sunday morning, October 16. Then we led a conference for about 70 pastors and their wives that lasted from Sunday evening until Wednesday noon. This is an outreach that St. Mark supports. Greentree Community Church in St. Louis donated money for free books for the pastors who attended. This ministry, which began in 2014, continues to have a powerful effect in many lives and congregations.

In South Africa, social and economic conditions for many are dire. But people are seeking God where he is to be found: in the Scriptures. It was a joy for Bill and me to spend four straight days helping God's people (and some who have yet to believe) think through the word of God that creates faith (Rom. 10:17) and through that faith bestows eternal life. When people hunger for it, God's word runs to meet them, and then carries them forward and God-ward, for this age and the next.

After our four days in Cape Town (Sunday–Wednesday), I journeyed to Johannesburg and conducted a retreat for a pastoral staff on Thursday, October 20, from 9:30 AM until 4:30 PM. This was at the Rosebank Union Church--google it (https://ruc.org.za/) to get a sense of the ministry that goes on there.

Then at the same church, on Friday and Saturday, I taught at a two-day conference that focused on the epistles of John. 150 people signed up for this event! We studied the word from 9:30 AM until 4 PM. About half of the people were students from Bible training centers in nearby townships.

The townships are areas where Black people were herded during the Apartheid years in South Africa, when non-Whites were suppressed. Part of the role of the South African church now is to be living out the gospel message that reconciles people in Christ across racial lines. Our conference, with both Blacks and Whites, was a statement of the gospel truth that God is not partial: all races and nationalities need forgiveness of their sins and new life through faith in Christ. We can embrace each other in God's love rather than shun or hate each other.

In the book of Revelation, the Lamb who was slain is praised in these words: "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God <u>from every tribe and language and people and nation</u>" (Rev. 5:9).

This is not just a heavenly vision. Already, right now, people "from every tribe and language and people and nation" are coming to faith and coming together as God's people, the body of Christ, the church, as the word of the Lord runs and is glorified.

Here is a picture of about 50 of the 70+ people at the Cape Town conference. They all praise God and thank St. Mark for your prayers and support!

In this edition of, Ask Stewie, let's look at St. Mark fundraisers; some that you may know about and then again maybe not. Stewardship oversees four ongoing fundraisers. Two of which are once every month (Community Fellowship nights), another is a once a year (Rummage Sale), and the last is an ongoing "We Care" collection container.

The funds that are collected from the Rummage Sale are a separate income that is labeled Restricted Funds and are used for designated purposes, These funds are not part of our offerings to pay expenses. You may not realize that these fundraisers collectively generate \$23-25,000 annually. Yes, that's not a typo-, you all help and can maybe help even more.

Community Fellowship Nights, Just eat out, carry out, or have delivered meals two nights a month. Antioch Pizza night, is the second Tuesday of the month and Wendy's Night is the third Thursday of the month. St. Mark generates over \$1,000 per year with these fundraisers and all you need to do is enjoy a meal or two per month and enjoy great fellowship with others.



Another fundraiser added in the last year or so is the "WE Care" collection container behind the Ed Center. Just deposit clothing and fabrics and we generate nearly \$500 for things we used to throw away but now are recycled.

Finally, the big event that happens once a year in early August, the St. Mark Rummage Sale. This event can generate over \$21,000 over three sale days. Wow, a great fundraiser and a way to make room in the garage, basement or that spare room. Thank you to all that donate and Laurie thanks the faithful workers.

So, let's eat, recycle clothing/fabric and make room for all that rummage. Please join these fundraisers and let's generate money for St. Mark and the Lord's work.

This comes out to about 10 times per year. You would take one of the days our week, pick up the food at the Antioch Township offices at 1625 Deep Lake Road at 10:00 am and deliver to the clients. All clients are in the Lindenhurst/ Lake Villa area. It usually takes a little more than an hour to complete the route. The seniors are always happy to see you and are very grateful. One of us would ride with you the first time to help show you the ropes. So if you are free mornings and love helping people, give Laurie Kerns a call at 847-612-1510 and we will get you started.

How Can I Help?

We need at least 16 volunteers every Friday night/ Saturday morning from October to April to help provide food and shelter to homeless guests at St. Mark. This is a very rewarding experience and a wonderful way to share God's love with others. Any help you can give is greatly appreciated.

What would you do?

Friday...

5pm-8pm...Check in with the site manager, welcome guests, heat up and serve food, clean up kitchen and eating area and visit with guests.

8pm-11pm...Hand out needed supplies, visit with guests. Most guests are in bed by 9:30

11pm-3am...Everyone sleeping. Read a book, catch up on emails, quietly talk with the other volunteer, make lunches if not done. Assist any guests that get up during the night.

Saturday...

3am-7am...Check in with site manager, start breakfast, wake up guests, serve breakfast, clean up kitchen and eating area.

5am-7am...Check in with site manager, wipe down all pads and pillows, gather laundry into hampers, clean bathrooms, sweep and mop floors where needed and take out garbage.

St. Mark has been a part of this ministry for over 30 years. Our prayers are to one day be out of businesses because their are no homeless or they have a permanent site. Until then we desperately need your help to keep this going. We especially need help for the 11pm thru clean up shifts. Grab a friend, try it once and I'm sure you will come back again. St. Mark has been supporting OAM for several years (both monetarily and with volunteers) – For each \$1 donated, OAM can buy approximately 8 pounds of food from the Northern Illinois Food Bank

(Donations can be made on the website: <u>openarmsmission.org</u> or if you wish you can help fill our "yellow barrels" in the narthex with non-perishable food.)

During the last couple years so much has changed for many of our neighbors - from March 2020 through September 2022 Open Arms has added 349 new families – currently OAM is averaging 85 families on Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday nights and an additional 89 households get home delivery each Thursday morning. OAM also delivers 37 Northern Illinois Food Bank and 15 OAM back pack bags to local school children.


