One of my devotions this morning was from Henry and Richard Blackaby's Experiencing God Day By Day. The title is <u>Compelled to Serve</u> and here's an excerpt:

'When God comes among His people in power, there is never a shortage of volunteers or resources for His work. (But) When Christians today are asked what aspects of the Christian life are most important to them, missions is not usually ranked as a priority because we have lost track of why God called us in the first place. We were not saved from our sin simply so that we would qualify for heaven. God delivered us so we would have a relationship with Him through which He could carry out His mission to redeem a lost world."

In this regard, when I think of the mission within our church, I think first of our youth. They are our mission field. I think of Sunday School, VBS, Confirmation and our Youth Group. The volunteers that are on this mission field to share Jesus with our kids are so significant to their future but hmmm... maybe we could do a better beating down of the doors to be part of that mission. From the Desk of Pastor Breum

Proverbs 3:5-6 (ESV) ⁵ Trust in the LORD with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. ⁶ In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

Proverbs 3:5-6 (MSG) ⁵ Trust GOD from the bottom of your heart; don't try to figure out everything on your own. ⁶ Listen for GOD's voice in everything you do, everywhere you go; he's the one who will keep you on track.

Reading the Bible from different translations and/or paraphrases has a certain impact, especially on those who have been in the same translation or paraphrase for years. The verses are the same in meaning but when you see it translated in a slightly different form, an insight can come to you that you have never thought of before. It is like looking at a picture from a different angle. You pick up more than you saw before.

These days I find myself spending a lot of time with teenagers and young adults in their 20's. One of the biggest emotional needs I hear of in these young people is that of anxiety/ depression. I, myself know a lot about anxiety, too much. Yet, age brings with it a different perspective. Things that used to make me highly anxious do not even make it on the chart anymore. The Bible has specific answers to the problem of anxiety and depression. After turning to these verses for decades, they truly do change the way we think and feel. The younger generation has yet to learn the richness of Biblical helps and it is up to us older ones to fill them in. These days when I can't find my keys, my glasses, my billfold, where I parked my pickup, that can raise my own anxiety taking the place of former anxieties. When I was young that forgetfulness did not bother me at all.

"Trust in the Lord with all of your heart (from the bottom of your heart)." It is so easy to read this and so hard to do it. Today, I define trust in God this way. No matter what issues you are facing, God Himself is by far more powerful. God is greater than anything and everything you are dealing with. No matter what, God is greater. When we pray, "Our Father who art in heaven," we are proclaiming that God is much greater than ourselves and all of our needs. Knowing that can ease anxiety and raise the level of peace.

"Lean not in your own understanding." Friends we cannot figure out what only God knows. As we lean into God, sensing and knowing the Presence of God, it brings calmness like nothing else. Putting God first by walking the path of obedience, the Lord God promises to straighten things out. In the meantime, rest in Him.

Let us pray. Lord Jesus, please forgive us for trying to do a work that only you can do. We are a people under construction, and you are moving and working in our lives every day. Help us to always cooperate with you and never work against you. Lord it may feel like you are working on us overtime. We are thankful. In the name of Jesus, we pray. Amen.

My Neighbor Has a Kangaroo

Sometimes I feel like I live in a Dr. Seuss book--to be specific, the book I read about a hundred times to my kids, *One Fish Two Fish, Red Fish Blue Fish*.

The book is all about strange creatures: "Some are thin, and some are fat. / The fat one has a yellow hat. / From there to here, from here to there, / funny things are everywhere."

They sure are. We live next to a farm that keeps animals for a petting zoo. Goats, sheep, horses, miniature (and large) cattle, burros, llamas . . . and even a camel. The animals are in big demand around Christmas. My neighbor hauls a couple of dozen away in a trailer to stage nativity scenes in the surrounding region.

Some months ago, though, a new animal appeared: a kangaroo. It was a baby. Its mother had died. My neighbor became the foster caregiver.

Would you like to meet him now? No, not my neighbor: I mean the 'roo. I saw him last week. His name his Reuben. He is looking up at me because he wants a treat:



Question: How does a kangaroo survive a Midwestern winter? Answer: Someone, in this case, my neighbor, provides shelter and protection and food. Otherwise, this out-of-habitat animal would not live for long.

I don't recall any kangaroos in the Bible. But there are plenty of animals. And God's people are often compared to a particular type: sheep. Here are two examples from the Psalms:

79:13 But we your people, the sheep of your pasture,
will give thanks to you forever; from generation to
generation we will recount your praise.

95:7 For he is our God, and we are the people of his pasture, and the sheep of his hand.

Like kangaroos, sheep need habitat. They also need someone to shepherd them, lead them to pasture and water, and protect them from harm. When we stray, we need someone to guide us back: "For you were straying like sheep, but have now returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of your souls" (1 Peter 2:25).

That shepherd is Jesus, who said, "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). He is the Lord who leads us: "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:27).

Sometimes our life circumstances are adverse. We wonder how we will survive. We feel as exposed as . . . well, a kangaroo in a Missouri winter. We wander and get lost like Reuben did one day. It was on the local news: https://www.kmov.com/2022/12/15/kangaroo-jefferson-county/

God sent the Good Shepherd to gather and save us straying sheep: "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all" (Isaiah 53:6).

We therefore find hope in this word of blessing: "Now may the God of peace who brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep, by the blood of the eternal covenant, equip you with everything good that you may do his will, working in us that which is pleasing in his sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory forever and ever. Amen" (Hebrews 13:20–21).

A final kangaroo note: Reuben's location is Jefferson County, which is where St. Mark church administrator Deb Zuchowski grew up. She might be able to tell you more about this region and its charms.




St. Mark Council News

- 4. An invitation to all if you see something that needs to be addressed, say something to the people that can help your Safety & Security Team.



If you and/or your committee need help getting started again, please ask us for help. Our partners at Church Doctor are willing to help you too.



WHAT IS A CHURCH MEMBER 2.0

It has been decades since we reviewed our membership rolls. This means that our voting records may not be current, and we base our congregational meeting quorums on those numbers. The past years of annual meeting attendance has significantly exceeded the required quorum figures so there's no concern that we didn't have a true quorum, but we need to clean up our rolls. If we were part of a synod, we would be required to submit accurate records annually. That not being the case makes it no less important that we undertake this project.



We have over 800 individuals listed in ServantKeeper whose records have never been updated. Based on our weekly worship attendance, it's easy to determine that it's clean up time.

By the time this VOICE issue reaches you, we will have generated an electronic survey to everyone for whom we have an email address. Those for whom we have no email address will receive a paper survey in the US mail with a return envelope.

I'm sure a day does not go by when you see a message pop up on your computer asking you to accept cookies when searching a page on internet. Those requests are warnings alerting you that personal information 'might' be downloaded from your computer. Later in February, you will begin to see that same message appear when you open the St. Mark website, www.smlc.info.

Why? We want to understand information about what is being looked at on the website. Such as which page(s) interests the readers. Accordingly, the Church Council has updated their website Privacy Policy, https://www.smlc.info/privacy-policy/.

From the policy; The St. Mark website uses Google Analytics to track usage within the website. Google Analytics uses a set of cookies to collect information and report site usage statistics. Individual visitors are not personally identified by '_ga', the main cookie used by Google Analytics. The cookie enables a service to distinguish one visitor from another and lasts for 2 years. Each '_ga' cookie is unique to St. Mark and will not be used to track the user on other websites.

Our goal in updating the entire website a few years ago was to present St. Mark to the community, or rather to market ourselves to attract new members. The former version catered to our members; to grow as a congregation. We need people to find St. Mark when they search for a place of worship. Knowing which page(s) people look at will help us improve the website's content and hopefully grow our congregation.

When the 'Accept Cookie' message appears on our website, please accept them.

This is a very short survey and won't take more than 5 minutes to complete. It will tell us who would like to maintain their active membership status, who would like to retain their inactive membership status and who would like to discontinue their membership, usually due to having moved from the local area. It also asks a couple of questions about worship to help us understand church wide preferences, but no changes are being contemplated, it's just for us to maintain awareness of the congregational profile.


(Donations can be made on the website: <u>openarmsmission.org</u> or if you wish you can help fill our "yellow barrels" in the narthex with non-perishable food.)

During the last couple years so much has changed for many of our neighbors - from March 2020 through September 2022 Open Arms has added 349 new families — currently OAM is averaging 85 families on Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday nights and an additional 89 households get home delivery each Thursday morning. OAM also delivers 37 Northern Illinois Food Bank and 15 OAM back pack bags to local school children.

Did you know?

Holiday giving has historically been very important for St. Mark. From January thru October the church operates at a loss. It is holiday giving that aligns our donations to our annual expenses. Unfortunately, we did not realize the typical increase in giving this past December. Though donations in November were over budget, giving to the general fund in December was \$28,620 below budget. Giving throughout the year was \$89,000 lower than expectations. Should the church hire a Co-Pastor this year, regular giving will need to increase to cover the expense.
