Greetings Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Last month over 100 people gathered in our fellowship hall for our Mission and Vision Extravaganza and worked together to create our new mission statement which is;

Loving God and All People

Many may still be asking what a mission statement is or what does it do? Simply put, a mission statement is a tool that helps provide direction to where and what a congregation is doing. It sets expectations of what a congregation is all about and what their priorities are. I'm excited that St. Mark is all about Loving God and all people. It's straight out of the Bible!

The new mission statement will be used to help us move forward.

We also created 8 vision statements on April 14th. Vision statements help explain how the mission statement will be accomplished. Our vision statements are:

1)Prayer 2)Worship

3)Provide opportunities and encouragement to grow in Christ.

4)Attract young people and provide what they need.

5)Share our gifts both material and spiritual.

6) Maintain a safe supportive place for people.

7)Combine faith and relationships.

8)Be in the world but not of the world.

I want to thank you all for the hard work you put in during the Mission and Vision Extravaganza! Since the event, every text on Sunday has affirmed the mission and vision statements we created. I call that getting an Amen from the lectionary and Scriptures.

Over the next 8 weeks I'll be sending out a devotional on each statement. I'm calling this a devotional and not a simple write up because I believe we still need to ask God to actively guide us in the process of discerning if this is the direction God has called us to.

The mission and vision statements are only as useful as we make them, like all tools if you don't use it, it's not that helpful. My role will be to help everyone be comfortable and proficient with our new mission and vision statements. Again, thank you all for your hard work and I'm excited to begin to use these statements to help move us forward.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

The Unexamined Life



I read something in Taylor's devotion last Friday that caught my attention. He was speaking about a list of undesirable traits found in 1st Timothy 3:15. Among them were pride, envy, arrogance, abusiveness, treachery, lovers of self and money, and several others. Taylor went on to say that we need some kind of system to track these traits and deal with them. One of the ways to accomplish this is to develop a relationship with a trusted friend who can hold us accountable for our choices.

A long time ago, around 400BC, Socrates said that the unexamined life was not worth living. He recognized the need to periodically step back from our daily grind and take an inventory of our lives. Ignatius of Loyola claimed that the examination of conscience is the single, most important spiritual discipline. When you think about it, we all take an inventory every day. Before we leave the house each morning, we may check our cash flow to make sure we have enough for the expenses of the day. Before we go grocery shopping, we may check the cupboard and come up with a list of items we need. We don't hesitate to do an inventory for certain aspects of our life, but rarely do we feel the need for a spiritual inventory. Why is that? Maybe because it forces us to look inward and that can be painful and very risky. We might have to change!

Doing a daily spiritual inventory is vital to spiritual growth. Taylor points out that the goal is not to reach spiritual perfection, but rather spiritual progress. What does that look like? Let's say for example, that you have a problem with anger. You may be known for a short fuse and often lose your temper with your spouse and/or children. Doing a daily spiritual inventory identifies that anger and helps you track it. Each day, write down the number of times you lost our temper and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you. That's what the Holy Spirit does! He provides revelation and guidance. He opens our minds to truth and provides the power to move forward, especially when we humbly ask Him to remove our character defects. This might not be something that happens overnight. It is enhanced by studying what the bible has to say about anger. Proverbs is loaded with them. I did a Google search on "verses related to anger" and 25 examples popped up. This works for whatever issue you struggle with, not just anger. An accountability partner can help by holding your feet to the fire.

I encourage you to identify negative traits in your life that need improvement. Try performing a spiritual inventory and take a close look at your character defects. Make a commitment to partnership with the Holy Spirit to overcome them. Try starting with this prayer found in Psalm 139:23-24: "Search me O' God and know my heart. Test me and know my anxious thoughts. Point out anything in me that offends you and lead me along the path of everlasting life." It starts with examining where you are, and it ends in a life worth living!

Transition Team Update

We have come a long way St. Mark! We have examined our past and celebrated our history with Heritage Weekend in October. We embraced the present by celebrating our spiritual gifts and our Service to God, the Church and community. The work done in the past and present phases set the Groundwork for our look to the future. At the beginning of the year, we began coordinating and conducting Cottage Meetings to discuss where we want to be in the future. We had seventeen meetings With over 100 participants and learned a lot.

The culminating event for the future phase was April 14. The objective of the event—the Mission and Vision Extravaganza— was to allow the people of St. Mark to develop a Mission Statement for our Church and Vision Statements to accomplish our Mission. God's blessings were evident at the meeting, and the Holy Spirit was with us as we landed on our Mission and Vision.

What's next?

Our transition continues and will do so until we call a new pastor. The Team will still be around, but it is now time for Call Committee to do its important work.

What can you do?

There is so much. Please consider your spiritual gifts and the vision statements listed as an opportunity to commit yourself to being more involved in accomplishing our Mission. There are opportunities to serve on Council or join a ministry team. At a minimum, please pray for the Call Committee for discernment and wisdom as they seek to find the pastor that God has chosen for us.

Update!

After our May packing event, the St. Mark's packing table has helped feed 300 kids a daily meal for a year!!! When we go to Libertyville's FMSC site, we are not the only one's packing so, if I include our numbers with everyone else's, we have fed 1782 kids!! (This information is posted near the kitchen in the Fellowship Hall.)

Speaking of numbers, through St. Mark's wonderful generosity, 526 Bibles have been taken from the site – free of charge. Since we started this, on 8/15/2023, that is almost 2 Bibles a day!!!

Our next packing session will be Saturday, June 1st, at 8:45 am. We will <u>NOT</u> be packing in July since "our date" lands on the 4th of July but if you want to put it on your calendar, Saturday, August 3rd, at 8:45 is the next packing day.

One of our "sibling" churches in Libertyville, Holy Cross Lutheran, has decided to take the lead on filling the site with different churches during the week of June 24th through the 29th. On Monday there are two sessions to fill, on Wednesday and Thursday there are 5 sessions, and on Tuesday, Friday, and Saturday there are 4 sessions each. That comes out to 24 sessions and, as I type this, there is only 1 session that is full. To go into the numbers even more, of the 4320 open volunteer slots available, only 1169 slots have been filled.

That means there are 3151 open slots still available!!!

HOW MANY OF THOSE CAN ST. MARK FILL????

School is out, VBS is over, there are morning, afternoon, or evening slots available, the site has AC or heat – depending on the day, there are no pesky flies nor annoying mosquitos inside the building, there are sit down jobs, stand up jobs, and jobs to get your exercise, you can bring kids 5 years old and older, great commercial-free music is played, it's free, and ...??? Please check your calendars and sign up for as many slots, with as many of your St. Mark friends as possible!

THE GALA EVENT

On Saturday night, May 4th, Laurie Kerns, Jill Decker, Joyce, and I went to Oakbrook Terrace for an evening filled with good fun, good food, and a number of amazing God stories.

Mark Crea, FMSC's Executive Director/CEO, started the stories with two Holy Week miracles that happened in Haiti. Imagine you need to take a 180 mile trip? In the states that would take about 3 hours, right? Now put those 180 miles in Haiti between Port-au-Prince and Jeremie, which is on the far western end of Haiti, and that trip is over 7 hours long. On top of that, that 180 mile road is "patrolled" by 9 different gangs!! A truck full of FMSC food made that trip not oncebut twice! The last delivery was made on Easter morning.

The main speaker was Beatrice Williamson, Founder and Director of Maisha Project in Kenya. Beatrice is a native born Kenyan, who knows firsthand about the needs of children and families in her home country. From the age of nine years old until her second year of college, Beatrice received a scholarship for education from a Swedish missionary, Anna Lanson. Education was what Beatrice needed to rise above her circumstances and realize her potential. "Aunty Bea" as the Maisha children affectionately call her, came to the United States in 2001. In 2006, she founded Maisha Project in response to the call for help from home. Now, her passion is to reach out to orphaned and destitute Kenyan children and provide them with the same opportunity Anna Lanson gave her. She shared with us, through tears in her eyes, what people call our MannaPack food bags- "gold"! She added that every time we pack a bag, we give kids hope and love.

Maisha Project's first ever shipment of food was packed at the Libertyville site, and I was working that day. Beatrice, who has friends in the Chicago-land area, happened to be visiting them but made a trip to our site, to see the shipment leave. Most of you probably don't know that before the back door of a semitruck—loaded with our food— is shut and leaves our site, the FMSC workers will come to the loading dock and pray for the food, the driver, and the journey the food will take. I felt so blessed to be there that day to meet Beatrice but to also be able to pray with her and for her and for the food that was going to her mission! WOW—God is good all the time and all the tine, God is good!!!


St. Mark's Joyful Hearts - Singles Group

Book Corner

If you enjoy historical fiction, this month's book choice, Children of Disobedience by Asta Scheib, may be for you. One of the most scandalous love stories of history: a renegade monk marries a run-away nun, and in the process our understanding of love between man and woman takes on a historically new meaning. So too, is the love between God and people, and with it our very understanding of religion. to be kept), Asta Scheib's novel is a sensitive and critical portrait of the man Martin Luther from the perspective of his wife. It is as well a beautiful description of the woman Katharina von Bora who held her own strong and influential self in a relationship that was neither simple nor easy. August 1st, 2nd & 3rd.... Sale Dates

August 3rd at 3pm... Clean Up (A poster will be up in July with days/ times we will be working for you to sign up)

Items we do not accept:

Mattresses or box springs, large appliances like stoves, fridges, microwaves, paints or chemicals, large mirrors without frames, large glass top tables, heavy desks, TVs, large exercise equipment, computers, large entertainment centers, China cabinets, encyclopedias, textbooks, magazines, Christmas trees, chandeliers, ceiling fans, wall to wall carpet, pool tables, ping pong tables, cribs, expired car seats, tires, building material, anything broken or missing parts, sleeper sofas, pianos or organs, or aquariums. These items don't sell and are hard to get rid of after the sale. Please only donate clean resalable items. If you would throw it out, so will we.



How you can help.....

- 1. When donating items, put like items together. Kid's clothes in one bag, women's clothes in another, linens in another, books in one box, housewares in one box, tools in another, etc. This greatly helps us when setting up. Also please do not tightly tie bags closed. We reuse them to pack up after the sale, but if we cannot open we have to rip up and throw away. When you drop off items, please leave them in the boxes or bags. If you take out of the boxes items can get broken and they are very hard to stack until we can set up.
- **2.** Come help setting up the sale. We take help of all ages, but do ask an adult to stay with younger children. Confirmation students can earn service points. We have jobs for everyone. No special skills required. If you can open a box or bag, hang or fold clothes, set items on tables you are qualified. Our help is getting older each year and we really would love to welcome some younger faces. Join us even if you have an hour to give. Many new friend-ships are made at the sale. It's a great way to get involved and meet new people.
- **3.** Work the sale. This involves straightening up after shoppers, helpings shoppers with their items, answering questions, cashiering, etc.
- **4.** Help with cleanup. Much help is needed at 3:00 on Saturday to pack everything up and put the church back in order. We need to pack and put leftovers on the donation truck,, sweep and vacuum floors and carpet, take down tables and racks, put up tables and chairs and put all our supplies away. Many hands makes this go faster.
- **5.** Help with pickups. Our pickup crew is aging and could use a few strong younger guys to help. If you have a pick up truck or if you can ride along with them your help would be greatly appreciated.
- **6.** Bake items for the bake sale. These can be dropped off Wednesday night or anytime during the sale. We sell baked goodies for .50 each so if you can package them on small plates, it helps us at the sale. **For more information or questions, call Laurie Kerns at (847) 612-1510**.
