From the Desk of Pastor Breum

One Body, Many Parts

1 Corinthians 12:18-26 (NLT2) ¹⁸ But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it. ¹⁹ How strange a body would be if it had only one part! ²⁰ Yes, there are many parts, but only one body. ²¹ The eye can never say to the hand, "I don't need you." The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you." ²² In fact, some parts of the body that seem weakest and least important are actually the most necessary. ²³ And the parts we regard as less honorable are those we clothe with the greatest care. So we carefully protect those parts that should not be seen, ²⁴ while the more honorable parts do not require this special care. So God has put the body together such that extra honor and care are given to those parts that have less dignity. ²⁵ This makes for harmony among the members, so that all the members care for each other. ²⁶ If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it, and if one part is honored, all the parts are glad.

This past week I had a conversation with a member of St. Mark. The person was thrilled to the bone because of the opportunity God gave to her to do ministry. She considers it a way of honoring God by putting to use the spiritual gifts that God has given to her. Inside of her there is a huge feeling, "for this I was born (again)."

Every person in the Body of Christ has been gifted by God to do acts of service unto the Lord Jesus Christ so the church can be built up continually. Dr Charles Stanley writes, "When I talk about serving the church with God-given talents and gifts, people oftentimes think too small. They picture the choir singer or the Sunday school teacher. But if they don't happen to be naturally adept at singing or teaching, they give up."

When you leave church on Saturday night or Sunday morning you are entering your field of ministry. God has literally gifted you to do acts of ministry, service, helps, to encourage, to teach, to pray with, and more. You are God's minister throughout the week wherever you are. I say the best of ministry occurs outside of the church walls. It occurs around you when you put to use the spiritual gift(s), talents and abilities that God has given to you.

Dr Stanley continues, "It's time we stop thinking in terms of a "Sunday only" establishment. The church is not a place or a time; it is a body of believers, each one uniquely gifted by God to guide, help, challenge, and support the rest. In fact, most service to the Lord doesn't take place inside the church building. It happens out in the world, where we do all the things that Scripture commands."

It is a privilege to honor God in your area of influence. Sometimes you will sense inwardly that God is smiling at you because your act of ministry pleases God. It's the only way to live!

Wages and the Way

For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord (Romans 6:23 ESV).

Near the end of the New Testament period (mid to late first century), a document called "The Teaching" [didachē, pronounced DID-a-kay) appeared. It was an early church manual of faith and practice. It begins with these words: "There are two ways, one of life and one of death, and there is a great difference between these two ways."

How true! "The Teaching" may have been drawing on Jesus here, as it does elsewhere. For Jesus depicted the way that leads to life--to him and to his kingdom--in starkly binary terms: "Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few" (Matt. 7:13–14).

Life is complex. Gray areas abound. Yet Jesus taught that we all face a simple but fateful Either-Or: a wide way leading to woe, or a narrow way leading to life.

Romans 6:23 (quoted above) echoes Jesus' conviction. The word translated "wages" often referred to the pay a soldier would receive, or to a worker's paycheck more generally. In Romans, "sin" is said to "reign" (5:21; 6:12), like a military general or a despotic boss. What is sin's compensation package? Paul summarizes with one word: "death."

Paul's great epistle to the Romans is a brilliant summation of the gospel. But Romans also speaks much of "death": of Paul's 50 uses of that word, 29 of them occur in Romans 5–8. Happily, offsetting the morbid prominence of death, Paul mentions "life" 20 times in Romans, far more than in any of his other letters.

"Life," unlike "death," is not "wages." "Life" is rather "the free gift of God." Moreover, this is not simply "life" in terms of daily earthly existence. Rather, Paul speaks of "eternal life." This implies duration: a life that never ends. But it also implies quality: "eternal life" means living in God's presence, enjoying fellowship with Christ, bearing the fruit of his Spirit, worshiping and serving in his name.

Paul stresses "free gift" because in his day as in ours, people believe they can bargain with God. We can do enough to earn his favor. We can be better than most other people and are certainly not as bad as lawbreakers and criminals.

Paul anticipated such wishful thinking in Roman 3. He quotes the Old Testament to remind us that no one measures up to God's perfection and holiness. To appreciate Romans 6:23, we must recall Romans 3:23: "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." As Paul writes elsewhere, in ourselves we are without "hope and without God in the world" (Ephesians 2:12).

To sum up: Romans 6:23 points to two great truths about what Jesus Christ has done for us when we face our hopeless state and look to him:

- (1) We are liberated from the black hole of seeking to earn God' favor by working for wages. Our sin incurs a debt that we have no ability to pay.
- (2) God, so gracious and merciful, offers eternal life as a free gift on the basis of Jesus' death and resurrection. As Romans makes clear elsewhere, we receive this gift through faith, which means trusting in Jesus' death for our sins and in faith presenting our lives to him, to serve him as our resurrected Lord and master.

The glorious outcome of receiving this "free gift of God" which "is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord" is not passive complacency as if no response to this gift were called for. Rather, there is a profound practical effect. There is a break with sin. Being "in Christ Jesus" implants a zeal for righteousness in the form of godly living.

Another verse in Romans 6 depicts the change of heart and behavior that God's free gift received sets in motion. Note the contrast between death and life: "Do not present your members to sin as instruments for unrighteousness but present yourselves to God as those who have been brought from <u>death</u> to <u>life</u>, and your members to God as instruments for righteousness" (Romans 6:13).

Romans 6:23 means Jesus Christ delivers those who trust him from the treadmill of sin and condemnation (death), as he grants us the free gift of fellowship, hope, and purpose, right now and in the age to come (eternal life).

Council Highlights May 2022

A motion passed to purchase a 24/7 video camera system with (8) exterior security cameras through Martin Technology Solutions @ \$15,647.75, with funds to be paid out of Capital Improvement Restricted Funds.

A motion passed to approve the new job title and description for the Contemporary Worship and Media Coordinator. Brock Zwicke assumed the new role as of May 30, 2022.

A motion passed to approve the purchase and installation of a new air conditioning unit through Seasons Heating & Air, to replace unit #10 due to age and needed repairs.

A motion passed to approve the 2021 Financial Audit that was conducted by the Audit Team on March 21, 2022 and finalized on April 26, 2022.

A motion passed to clarify the guidelines as written for the Sunday School teaching age limit to allow one of the 2 co-teachers in a classroom to be a high school student, minimum age 14. The student must have engaged in the life of St Mark for a minimum of 6 months and must be evaluated and approved by the Parish Ed Committee.



Items We Do Not Accept

Mattresses or box springs, large appliances like stoves, refrigerators, microwaves, paints or chemicals, large mirrors without frames, large glass top tables, heavy desks, TVs, large exercise equipment, computers, large entertainment centers, encyclopedias, textbooks, magazines, Christmas trees, chandeliers, ceiling fans, wall to wall carpet, pool tables, ping pong tables, cribs, expired car seats, tires, building material, anything broken or with missing parts, sleeper sofas, pianos or organs, aquariums. These items do not sell and are hard to get rid of after the sale. Please only donate clean, resalable items. If you would throw it out, so will we.

How You Can Help

When donating items put like items together. Kid's clothes in one bag, women's clothes in another, linens in another, housewares in one box, tools in another, etc.. This greatly helps us when setting up. Also please do not tightly tie bags closed. We reuse them to pack up after the sale, but if we cannot open them we have to rip them up and throw them away.

Come help set up the sale. We take help of all ages, but do ask that an adult stay with younger children. Confirmation students can earn service points. We have jobs for everyone! No special skills required. If you can open a box or bag, hang or fold clothes, or set items on tables you are qualified!

Work the sale. This involves straightening up after shoppers, helping shoppers with their items, answering questions, etc..



WHAT IS A CHURCH MEMBER

This month's highlight is Chapter 5: I Will Lead My Family to Be Healthy Church Members

When I think of my "family," many people come to mind. My family tree would be a giant oak with branches including people from my biological family, neighborhood, colleagues, co-workers, various sports teams and, of course, church. In each group of friends, I have some favorites and a few I might avoid due to growing frustrations, anger, or hurt feelings. God asks us to love unconditionally- without restrictions or limits. But how....



- FORGIVE- In Josiah Frusti's May 11th devotional, he quoted C.S Lewis, "To be a Christian means to forgive the inexcusable because God has forgiven the inexcusable in you." People hurt us, sometimes it is hard to heal. The main way to heal is to forgive. We need to be kind and compassionate to others. Every time we recite the Lord's prayer, we ask that God forgives our trespasses as we forgive others who trespass against us.
- DON'T JUDGE- In Matthew 7:3-5, Jesus is preaching and talks about removing the plank in your own eye so you can see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye. Having a judgmental attitude against someone else tears them down. Before you look at the fault of others, take a look at yourself first.
- PRAY AND WORSHIP TOGETHER We are responsible for encouraging and leading our family to worship in church. If married, include a spouse; a parent include a child; if single, include a friend. Pray for things like: protection, spiritual growth, strength, courage, discernment, wisdom.
- SURRENDER EXPECTATIONS- Expectations can be a big barrier to giving (and receiving) unconditional love. We must surrender the thoughts about what the church can do for us. Instead, we must serve and care for others. When we love freely and don't expect anything in return, we ultimately experience the gift of unconditional love even if we disagree with something within the church.

When we love, forgive and see others with new eyes, we are set free. Will you love others the way Jesus loves you? "But God proves His own love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). God's love is infinite. There will never be a day when God doesn't love you. When we surrender ourselves to loving others with no strings attached, we can reap the healthy benefits that unconditional love has to offer.

from one day to the next, initiated by those who have no sense of accountability to God. The Committee wisely recommended we install exterior security cameras around both of our buildings as a deterrent to anyone who might have any level of harm in mind to bring to our church or our congregation. Five cameras will be mounted at the doorways of the main building and three will be mounted at the east, west and north Ed Center doorways. The cameras will capture the parking lot views as well as the planned columbarium grounds, memorial garden space and the area behind the church near the shed. Video will be retained for 90 days in the event we would experience an incident warranting investigation. This decision was in many ways, a challenging one, due to it being similar to an insurance policy; a significant dollar investment for something that may never be needed. God's grace has been upon us for 60 years. That said, when He sends a message to us as stewards of His church, to prepare for the fact that the enemy's days are getting shorter and shorter and the propensity for ill will becomes greater and greater, we need to listen and heed His protective directives. St. Mark will be a safe place, not only spiritually but physically, to provide us with the peace to worship.

As always, we have SO much to be thankful for and I pray that amidst the challenges of life this side of heaven and opportunities to walk closely with Jesus, His Holy Spirit will help you defeat those challenges and make them all opportunities. Blessings to know Him more each day.

The American Evangelical Story







Restricted Funds? What are these?

As a non-profit, St. Mark has what is called Restricted Funds. Unlike regular contributions (tithing), which are used for general operating expenses, Restricted Funds come from financial gifts (offerings) which have been given for specific use. One of St. Mark's restricted funds is being terminated. This is a good thing! In July, St. Mark will be making its last payment on the mortgage for the Education Center and will no longer have any need for the Debt Retirement Fund! Many St. Mark congregants have been giving faithfully to this fund for years. Now that the mortgage is paid, increasing the Building Maintenance and Capital Improvement Funds will become important. Our aging buildings and appliances are in need of repair and replacement. We have 10 furnaces, air conditioning units and water heater

alone that are over 20 years of age. If you have been giving to Debt Retirement, we hope you will now consider giving your offering to the Building and/or Capital Improvement Funds to help ensure the church's financial means to keep our buildings in great condition.
