Our Words Must Be Filtered by Love

Dear Friends,

How thrilling to hold a community event at our church honoring the Lindenhurst Police Department. Thank you for speaking with them, eating cake with them, and taking their prayer cards to pray for them. Our police deserve all the proper respect that we can give to them. They literally put their lives on the line every day facing situations that you and I will never have to face.

1 Corinthians 13:4-7 (NLT2) ⁴ Love is patient and kind. Love is not jealous or boastful or proud ⁵ or rude. It does not demand its own way. It is not irritable, and it keeps no record of being wronged. ⁶ It does not rejoice about injustice but rejoices whenever the truth wins out. ⁷ Love never gives up, never loses faith, is always hopeful, and endures through every circumstance.

I am a person who often speaks before I think. I often don't know what I think until I speak and then I just my change my mind. My mouth moves faster than my brain. So often in my life, I hear what I say but it was not planned. It just comes out.

Reading the greatest definition of love ever written in 1 Corinthians 13, I can see that in order to live out what God asks of us, our words must be filtered by love. This means the brain is to work faster than the words. Without a filter of love, words come out wrong and inflict pain that may take years to overcome. One little match can start a forest fire. One ill-spoken sentence can cut into a person and leave them wounded for years. This is the absolute opposite of love. Truth spoken in love is a healer and does not inflict undo injury.

It is not enough to just remain silent. Silence is not the answer. Pushing the mute button on yourself is not what is being asked of us. When we display Christian patience and kindness the love of Christ is on display. When we obey God by not being jealous, arrogant, or downright rude, we display the beauty of Christ. It is this type of love that draws people to Jesus and to the church. By refusing to be irritable and quick tempered, we choose to stay on the calm side and not let others push our buttons that send us into orbit. Love covers a multitude of sins and lets go of all grudges and offenses instead of letting them build up until one becomes a living version of Mt. St. Helens. Forgiving is giving up my right to hold a grudge. Forgiving is letting God's forgiveness in our lives sink deep into our souls, so deep that it becomes easier to forgive others with the same forgiveness God has given to us. As believers we no longer have the right not to forgive. God's love to us is unconditional and that is what He asks us to give away. Love hangs in there, endures, and refuses to stop. Love works in tandem with hope, knowing that love always eventually wins out, if not in this lifetime, for sure in the life to come.

May the Lord God place in our brains His filter of love so that every word that comes from our mouths is worthy of being spoken in a way that pleases God.

Microspikes: Be a Gregory

Snow and ice. Slick roads and sidewalks. Yesterday a friend of mine came in from shoveling snow. In the garage his snow-caked boots slipped out from under him. BAM! He lay full length on the concrete floor. His hip was not broken, just severely bruised.

At about the same time, another friend fell in much the same way. He fell on his upper arm. It broke the bone (the humerus) severely. It may require surgery to repair.

It can happen to any of us, so we have to take care. I am fortunate to own a pair of Microspikes (just google the word) for my boots. Bernie has a pair for her boots, too. They were Christmas gifts from our adult children, who seem to think their aging parents might slip and fall outside in winter. The nerve of kids these days!

Anyway, these steel-and-elastic devices are great on ice and snow. They cause your feet to grip instead of slip. Let's hear a round of applause for Microspikes!

Jesus did not tell any parables about slipping on icy surfaces. But he did warn about a kind of a slide: "And because lawlessness will be increased, *the love of many will grow cold*" (Matthew 24:12).

The words in italics describe slippage toward lovelessness. Is that us? Is that me?

What is Jesus talking about?

He spoke those words not long before the cross. He was teaching his disciples about the end times, the time before his return. This is a time that we should all eagerly await and long for. Paul modeled this eager expectation when he prayed "Maranatha!" (1 Corinthians 16:22 NASB) Many translations give that Aramaic phrase in English: "Our Lord, come!" (ESV)

One reason for zeal about Christ's return is to avoid slipping into indifference, laxity, complacency, and lethargy. This happened to many characters in the Bible. Moses got uppity and struck the rock in anger. King Saul blew off Samuel the prophet. The whole nation of Judah fell away from God in Jeremiah's time. They persecuted Jeremiah even though they were the problem, not him! The result was the destruction of Jerusalem by the Babylonians in 587 BC.

Do you want to avoid slipping? There's a word found almost two dozen times in the New Testament that means "be watchful, ready, alert, on your guard, proactive." That word is γρηγορέω (*grēgoreō*). We get the name "Gregory" from that word.

A Gregory in this sense would be a person not slipping but sure-footed. He or she is actively growing in their pursuit of God. They exhibit habits like worship, prayer, Bible study, service in their church, love for their neighbor, sharing their faith, and obedience to God.

Here are some Gregory verses. Forms of the Greek word *grēgoreō* are underlined. They are all sayings of Jesus.

Matthew 24:42 Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.

Matthew 26:41 Watch and pray that you may not enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing, but the flesh is weak.

Mark 14:37 And he came and found them sleeping, and he said to Peter, "Simon, are you asleep? Could you not watch one hour?

Revelation 3:3 Remember, then, what you received and heard. Keep it, and repent. If you will not <u>wake up</u>, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what hour I will come against you.

Strong words! But life is full of slick spots and temptations to take it easy. Put on your Microspikes! Hear Jesus' call to readiness. As Paul concluded (using the same Gregory word), "So then let us not sleep, as others do, but let us <u>keep awake</u> and be sober" by putting on "the breastplate of faith and love, and for a helmet the hope of salvation" (1 Thessalonians 5:6, 8).

Outdoor Sign Update - permits have been applied for and ground-breaking will begin when weather allows.

Spiritual Gifts Workbook Small Group status - small groups will meet on Sundays between services, once logistics and details are determined, with March as a target month to begin.




St. Mark has committed to financially support the work of other Christian charities and non-profit organizations through the giving of 10% of its monthly offerings.

We, as a congregation, have done a LOT in 8 months: we completed a deep-dive congregational diagnostic profile, we completed 2 church-wide surveys to determine where we are today as a congregation, we had 40+ members interviewed in person for a deeper understanding of survey responses, we received an oral presentation of the results of our diagnostic profile along with so many good recommendations to help us build on our strengths, we have implemented recommendations as noted below, we continue to develop action plans for others and we're looking forward to building on those that we've already begun.

Our new exterior sign with electronic messaging will bring a clean, fresh, updated appearance to our property as soon as the ground thaws for electrical work and installation. Thank you to Robin Korom and Jerry Gass for the many hours they invested to fulfill this recommendation, one that was started even before we knew it would be a recommendation. That may be an indication that we're further along than we even know. If you haven't seen the image of the new sign yet, you can see it in the announcement queue that runs prior to worship services.

The second recommendation we fulfilled kicked off with our Spiritual Gifts workshop in January, which so many of you attended and expressed your appreciation for and excitement about afterwards. The workshop was a train-the-trainer format, with our ChurchDoctor, Tracee Swank, facilitating the first one and future workshops to be facilitated by one of our own, using the PowerPoint presentation provided by ChurchDoctor. We'll continue to build on the workshop with small group discussions between services that we hope to start this month (March). Those of you who attended the workshop already have the workbooks that will be used in the small group and we have more workbooks for others who were unable to attend.

Kent Hunter, ChurchDoctor founder, has written many books and we have copies of several of them to loan to anyone who would like to read them.

They'll help you understand our mission of discipleship and the journey we're on. These will eventually be added to our church library but in the meantime, please let me know if you'd like to borrow a copy to read.

Several of you have asked about the recommendation to utilize the Ed Center as a daycare. We are completely open to that and look forward to research beginning on that project as we know, if it's meant to be, it will likely take several years to come to fruition, always in God's perfect timing. If anyone is interested in starting the research or being part of that process, please let one of us know (me, a Council member, or a member of the Parish Ed Committee).

The recommendation to add a second Pastor is high on the Council's list to begin working on and we have begun to identify steps needed to proceed. The process as an LCMC church will differ from earlier processes when we called pastors as an ELCA church and we will keep you informed of the status as we go. This will not be rushed, it will all be led by the Holy Spirit and we will follow God's prompts for the timing and the right person that He leads us to call. God's timing is absolutely perfect and He already knows who the person is who will compliment Pastor Breum's gift of evangelism and work side by side with him to lead our congregation.

Please pray for unity and excitement within our congregation as we follow God's lead to become a beacon to the community, a congregation with a culture that disciples others to seek His will first, knowing that we are new creations in Christ so cynicism, negativity, resentment and bitterness is replaced with grace, mercy, excitement and hope in what remains unseen. So many need Jesus but continue to fall further into darkness because no one is reaching a hand to lift them out. We need to be the hands of Jesus and be intentional about our caring for each other, not hesitant about potentially offending someone but delivering an "I care about you, how can I help" message in love.

For this light momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison, as we look not to the things that are seen but to the things that are unseen. For the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal.

2 Corinthians 4:17-18




WHAT IS A CHURCH MEMBER
