These devoted church leaders meet monthly to drive the future of St Mark through their dedication to fulfilling all that needs to be done to encourage strong fellowship (Congregational Life), to plant the seeds that draw people to St Mark (Evangelism), to ensure our financial position remains strong from month to month (Finance), to plan and prepare for Sunday School, VBS, Confirmation and Bible studies (Parish Ed), to plan and carry out the projects that keep our buildings safe, attractive and well maintained (Property Management), to plan and carry out physical measures that keep us all safe (Safety & Security) and to plan and carry out everything for our worship services (Worship & Music) to give the due honor, praise and glory to our Father who provides everything noted in this paragraph, and more.

The committees meet on the 4th Tuesday evening each month and after their individual meetings, we come together in a joint meeting to share what they are working on so everyone present knows how their committee can support the work being done at St. Mark. There have been some excellent conversations over the past year including a lot of focus on the 3 prayer requests above. Please know that committee meetings are open to anyone who would like to know what is happening within our church. One thing for certain is that it's quite a slippery slope that we tend to try to navigate when we speculate with limited information and that's why the meetings are open, so anyone interested can gain insight.

From the Desk of Pastor Breum

Philippians 1:6 (NLT2) ⁶ And I am certain that God, who began the good work within you, will continue his work until it is finally finished on the day when Christ Jesus returns.

Philippians 2:13 (NLT2) ¹³ For God is working in you, giving you the desire and the power to do what pleases him.

Outside of my office in the narthex two people, Jim Schaufel and Keith Niles, are preparing the walls to be painted. It is part of the preparation work being done to ready St Mark for Easter. Yes, there is work to be done during Lent in our lives, God's wonderful inner working of the Holy Spirit inside of us. From Ash Wednesday through Easter Sunday we in the Lutheran church take time to delve into our walks with God, seeking God with our whole heart, mind, and strength and asking God to change us on the inside so we can shine ever brighter for Christ on the outside.

God is doing a work inside of you. It started before you were even aware of God, even at your baptism. Sometimes when people are working to get the church ready they make a lot of noise, drilling, pounding, scraping. It is work that has to be done and I have no complaints. On the other hand, God's inner working in our lives is most often done quietly and we probably are not even aware of it. The Holy Spirit is doing good work on the inside that does become noticeable on the outside. The Bible calls this sanctification, the process whereby God remodels us inwardly so the holiness of Christ can be seen in our lives outwardly.

Please take this time of Lent seriously by attending the special services each week, having fellowship with friends during supper before Wednesday evening worship, and enjoying conversations after the service before leaving for the night.

The spiritual disciplines for Lent will be posted for all to participate in. They will include Bible reading, prayer and fasting, random acts of kindness, and letting go of a particular habit and/or beginning a new healthy habit.

The Hidden You

The apostle Peter gives this advice to Christian wives: "Let your adorning be the hidden person of the heart with the imperishable beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which in God's sight is very precious" (1 Peter 3:4).

There is the part of us that we show, our exterior person. And then there is the inner person. Paul writes: "So we do not lose heart. Though our outer self is wasting away, our inner self is being renewed day by day" (2 Corinthians 4:16).

Who are you, who am I, really, deep down, on the inside?

God knows. The Psalmist says to God, "You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from afar" (Psalm 139:2).

God knows our thoughts and the "real" inner you and me. Through faith in Christ, we invite him to work inside us. In invisible ways he convicts, instructs, guides, guards, and renews us. He does this as we pray, read Scripture, worship, share with others, and live our lives in obedient devotion to him.

I was reminded of God's hidden work today. It is February and chilly--14 degrees this morning, and it never got out of the 20s all day. Late in the afternoon I looked out the kitchen door into the woods. I was amazed to see a ribbon of white ice, about a foot long and maybe three inches wide, dangling from a sugar maple limb.

As I watched, a nuthatch landed on the limb. Hanging upside down (as nuthatches do), it pecked at the ice. How did the ice get there? There has been no rain or snow lately. There is no water dripping from above.

A little research and I found this on a Twin Cities website: "A sapcicle is an icicle made of sap. Members of the maple family have sap flowing on warm days in the spring. The sap flows due to a quirk in the structure of maples and is caused by pressure that builds as the result of the freezing and thawing of water in the tree in the spring."

Sapcicles! While visibly the trees here are bare and the landscape bleak, inside the maple trees sap is beginning to flow, despite the freezing temperatures. You can't see it on the outside, but on the inside, there is life.

We have something in common with those trees: there is movement on the inside which no one but God can see. The Bible observes, "Even in laughter the heart may ache" (Proverbs 14:13). There is more going on than those around us can observe.

Here's what I find encouraging: when life seems cold and wintry, and we may feel that spring will never come, sap is flowing. God is at work inwardly.

I often take comfort in this reminder: "It is vain for you to rise up early, to retire late, to eat the bread of painful labors; for He gives to His beloved *even in his* sleep" (Proverbs 127:2 NASB).

Even when I sleep, God is at work. He sustains, shields, and shapes us not only visibly but invisibly. With David we can confess to God, "Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being, and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart" (Psalm 51:6).

Three times in the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus calls for devotion and assures us, "Your Father who sees in secret will reward you" (Matthew 6:4, 6, 18).

Take heart in God's patient sculpting of the inner you.

Council Highlights February 2023

Kurt Ulbricht is serving as St. Mark's liaison with the Lindenhurst, Lake Villa, Round Lake Chamber of Commerce. Many St. Mark events will be included in the Chamber's announcements to increase community awareness of opportunities to join us in worship and fellowship.

An additional multi-lens security camera will be mounted with to increase visibility of our property.

The resignation of Jill Winling from the Finance Committee was accepted with regrets.

The 3 prayer requests above (or 6 if the 3 open positions are broken out) *need your prayers every day* just as much as the committee and Council member prayers. If we want to see a God-empowered movement initiated, it will require God's power. God acts in response to His people's prayers. We know that God wants everyone to come to repentance (2 Peter 3:9). We know that He will build His church (Matthew 16:18). We know that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us and will give us what we request (1 John 5:14-15). Therefore, we need to ask.

When you read about the early church in the Book of Acts, prayer is everywhere:

Acts 1:24 praying before choosing leaders.

Acts 4:31 (23-24a, 31-35) after persecution praying for boldness...great growth.

Acts 6:6 (6-7) praying before choosing leaders...great growth resulted.

Acts 9:40 (40-42) praying for signs and wonders...resulting in great growth.

Acts 10-11 (Cornelius) prayer surrounded every aspect of the crossing over of the gospel to the Gentiles... a new people group.

Acts 12:12 praying for the release of Peter from prison.

Acts 13:1-3 praying before setting aside the first missions/church planting team, Paul and Barnabas.

Acts 14:23 praying before setting aside new believers in new churches as leaders.

Acts 16:25 praying in prison, resulting in the conversion of the jailer's household.

Acts 20:36 praying when departing from a church he had planted.

Acts 21:5 praying when commending Paul to a dangerous situation and certain imprisonment for the sake of the gospel.

Acts 22:17 praying in worship and receiving guidance as to future ministry plans.

Acts 28:8 praying for signs and wonders.

Nothing is changed today. God never changes and still desires our prayers for His church to grow. Please join us in praying for these 3 (or 6) things daily. I truly believe that if we ALL take a few minutes once each day, God will honor our prayers and we'll see His hand move. He wants us to see where He's working so let's pray and watch with expectation.

When Do I Pray? Sunday March 19 to Thursday, April 18 during Ramadan, the season of fasting and praying. As they fast and devote themselves to Islamic rituals, you're invited to join other Christians in prayer that many Muslims will be drawn into a relationship with Jesus. And if the Holy Spirit calls you pray during the season of Ramadan and beyond, how are you going to respond? Are you listening? Will you obey His call?




This year's trip cost has gone up to \$200 per individual but that cost can be lowered by being involved with some fundraising activities we'll schedule in the future.

We are also exploring ways we can support the church. We are a new group and appreciate all suggestions!



- 1) We have agreed to purchase one more camera (to help cover the area where the columbarium will go) and are looking at the possibility of getting one more.
- 2) In case of an emergency, the upstairs doors in the Ed Center will soon be able to be locked from the inside, just like the library doors, and the windows in the downstairs classrooms will soon have window covers.




(Donations can be made on the website: <u>openarmsmission.org</u> or if you wish you can help fill our "yellow barrels" in the narthex with non-perishable food.)

OAM also delivers 37 Northern Illinois Food Bank and 15 OAM back pack bags to local school children.

VOICE Article - March 2023 Spiritual Gifts Workshop 2.0 update Submitted by Debbie Plishka

We had a great group of folks attend our Spiritual Gifts Workshop 2.0! If you missed, try to find someone who attended and ask them about it. Personally, I enjoyed stepping far outside my comfort zone and facilitating the workshop. I learned a lot preparing for it and was excited to share what I learned with the group.

While working on the presentation and researching more information, I came across a blog post titled "8 Reasons Why All Christians Should Know Their Spiritual Gifts", written by Dr. Larry Gilbert of www.churchgrowth.org. Here are the eight reasons Dr. Gilbert mentions:

- 1. Knowing your spiritual gifts helps you understand God's will for your life.
- 2. Knowing your spiritual gifts helps you know what God has *not* called you to do.
- 3. Knowing your spiritual gifts relieves you from serving out of "duty".
- 4. Knowing your spiritual gifts helps you understand how the Holy Spirit works through you.
- 5. Knowing your spiritual gifts fills a deep inner need or void in your life.
- 6. Knowing your spiritual gifts builds unity among Christians.
- 7. Knowing your spiritual gifts equips you to fulfill God's purpose in your life.
- 8. Knowing your spiritual gifts adds to your self-acceptance. (My side note to this is that we all struggle at some point with accepting ourselves. We want to be better, different, etc. But knowing that the Holy Spirit called you to be who you are helps you accept and understand you were intentionally given gifts to use.)

Dr. Gilbert continued with this: "Spiritual gifts involve God's stewardship. He assigns us certain tasks (1 Corinthians 12:18) and then equips us to do them in a manner that brings glory to him and fulfillment to us.

1 Peter 4:10-11 (NLT) 10 "God has given each of you a gift from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to serve one another. 11 Do you have the gift of speaking? Then speak as though God himself were speaking through you. Do you have the gift of helping others? Do it with all the strength and energy that God supplies. Then everything you do will bring joy to God through Jesus Christ. All glory and power to him forever and ever! Amen."
