From the Desk of Intentional Interim Pastor Steve

Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ

They say, time flies when you're having fun. It seems like I'm having too much fun because Lent is here already!

Lent is meant to be a specific time for spiritual growth. This is the time we focus on our relationship with God and each other.

On Ash Wednesday I preached on the three items Scripture says we focus on during Lent. It's found in our gospel reading from Matthew 6. I have invited everyone to participate in the Lenten journey. I say participate because lent is something you can sit out and just go through the motions and not real experience what Lent is all about.

The first thing we're called to do is Pray. To stay in contact with God through prayer. To increase our time with God in communication. Prayer has two components. First is talking with God, to be in relationship with God in conversation. Feel free to talk with God about any topic. God is actively listening to us. Then after speaking with God, we listen to what God has to say. This may be the hardest part of prayer. We intentionally listen to the people around us, with our prayers in mind. I say, "Is God speaking to me in this interaction?" Also pay attention to the mass media you look at. Is God speaking to me through this email or podcast? Is God speaking to me via this TV show or song. This is the way God speaks to me most often, and you too!

Next, we give to the needy. Look for a non-profit that helps needy people and donate. Bring in food to our food bank. Find a needy person and help pay a bill for them. There are a ton of people in need. Find a way to help them.

Finally, Fast. What that means to me is enhance your relationship with God in some way. Add devotional readings to your life. Increase your Bible reading. Look for ways to be in God's presence more than normal. If you have a bad habit, give it up. Fasting has changed over the years. However, the one constant is that fasting helps us connect to God in a deeper way!

Here's the key, all this is done in secret. We don't share with each other what we're doing. It's all between you and God. Lent is about growing more connected to God, growing in relationship with God, and being more Christ like. The church word is sanctification. Lent is a time of active relationship building with God. It takes participation on your part!

I invite you to take a journey with God, called Lent!!!

God's Kindness

On the evening of January 21, my mother Dolores Gregory died. My wife Bernie and I can't thank St. Mark members enough for all of the cards and notes of condolence we have received. But here's a wholly inadequate start: THANK YOU!

I learned a lot about funerals from watching Pastor Breum. He had a saying: "God is never kinder than in death." We found that to be true in my mother's final days. She was on hospice, but she never gave up on life. In fact, among her last words to me were, "I just want to get out of here." As weak and ailing as she was at age 93, she still thought she might recover. You could truly say that she died trying. That means: she never lost hope. God kindly kept her out of despair.

On the day before Mom died, my younger sister was able to fly in from Los Angeles. She shared a special bond with my mother. She and my mother had meaningful conversation before Mom went to sleep late that afternoon. She never awoke from that sleep. God kindly kept my mother lucid until her dear daughter arrived. Maybe her arrival gave my mother the assurance she needed to rest in peace.

The staff at the nursing home were very attentive and kind. We have received two cards from that facility: one from the dozens of patients who knew my mother, and another from the staff who cared for her during the almost four years she lived there. It was God's kindness that surrounded my mother with people who became like family to her. That included a staff chaplain who often visited and prayed with my mother.

A few days after Mom died, I had an appointment with a former seminary student who is now a pastor. He reminded me of the question and answer found in the Westminster Larger Catechism. Question 86:

Q. 86. What is the communion in glory with Christ, which the members of the invisible church enjoy immediately after death?

A. The communion in glory with Christ, which the members of the invisible church enjoy immediately after death is, in that their souls are then made perfect in holiness, and received into the highest heavens, where they behold the face of God in light and glory, waiting for the full redemption of their bodies, which even in death continue united to Christ, and rest in their graves as in their beds, till at the last day they be again united to their souls.

"Invisible church" in the question and answer refers to the people in the church who have truly believed in Christ. (Not everyone in the church truly believes.) My mother became a Christian in high school. She suffered many hardships through rearing five children and enduring a divorce in her early 40s. But her faith in Christ remained secure.

I remember when I was maybe ten years old and we were driving home from church. Mom was at the wheel of our '62 Chevy Impala. (My father never went to church, sadly.) She said, "At my funeral, I want them to sing the hymn He Lives." Maybe you know it. The first verse runs: I serve a living Savior/He's in the world today/I know that he is living/Whatever men may say/I see his hand of mercy/I hear his voice of cheer/And just the time I need him/He's always near.

Well, in 2018 we had a talk about her funeral plans. She told me that she changed her mind: she wanted the hymns Rock of Ages and Morning Has Broken to be sung. I will lead her memorial service in early March. I have already lined up two women with beautiful voices to sing those hymns.

It is a kindness from God to know that you are only saying good-bye for a while when a loved one dies if they lived and died believing in Christ.

God was kind by allowing Bernie to be at the bedside when my mother passed away. Mom was not alone in that somber moment; Bernie was reading Psalm 23 to her and singing a hymn that addresses God with these words: Thou art the life by which alone we live/And all our substance and our strength receive/O comfort us in death's approaching hour/Strong-hearted then to face it by Thy power.

While my mother's physical heart finally gave out, God was with her to make her "strong-hearted" in spirit. That was another great kindness.

I will say it again: thank you for the kindness of St. Mark brothers and sisters in Christ for your many prayers and cards that have meant so much. It was not only a kindness of you but of our God.

I'm happy to report that things are really shaking up in the Nursery! We are in full swing with our new Parents' Morning Out (PMO) program and we will have 2 events behind us by March 1st, 2024. You may be asking what is this program?



In January 2024, the Evangelism Ministry Team started this community outreach program as a means to reach and minister to young families in the greater Lake Villa / Lindenhurst area. Children ages 0-5, can be dropped off here for 3 hours, every 4th Friday of the month from 9 am - 12 pm, as a way to provide a Free break for parents/grandparents etc. Registration is required and can be found at https://smlc.info/events/.

To run this program, we need people to help care for the children. If you are interested in spending 3 hours a month playing and tending to little ones, please contact me, Deb Heide. Background checks will be required.

Also, I will need help distributing flyers for the next PMO event on March 22nd, 2024, so please see me in the nursery for details any Sunday, between 8 am - 11:30 am. Thank you!

In addition to the PMO program, the nursery staff will restart hosting the Parents' Night Out (PNO) program, 4 times per year on Saturday evenings from 5:00 pm - 8:30 pm, to give our working parents/guardians a night out together while we watch their children; again Free of charge. The age range for PNO is 0-12 year olds, 13 and older may volunteer, 18 and older requires a background check, please see me for details.

The first PNO date is Saturday, March 16th, so Save the Date! Registration is required and may be found at https://smlc.info/events/, after March 2nd, 2024. Registration is closed on Wednesday, March 13, 2024 at 5:00PM.

The nursery is also open and supporting the "Date Night VERTICAL Marriage, a Small-Group Study. Discover the one secret that will change your marriage! The dates are the 2nd Friday of every month, February-June, the location is in the St Mark Fellowship Hall, time 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm, the cost is Free! (Pot luck meal 6:00-7:00.) "When you call on me, when you come and pray to me, I'll listen. Jeremiah 29:12

Join in Fellowship to seek God's blessing for St. Mark Church to; continue be a House of Prayer and faithfully engage in the Great Commission.

<u>First</u> note - For a believing church to be engaged in God's eternal work of salvation, restoration, and building up the body of Christ, there are three requirements of the congregation;

Realizing God's work through St. Mark Church can only be achieved, if we seek to be energized by the Holy Spirit.

Praying with prayers of faith to engage God's heart by seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance and giving glory to God for answered prayers.

Understanding God's ordained accomplishments for St. Mark Church will be attained when we, as a congregation, *depend* on the Holy Spirit and each member *willingly exercises* their Spirit's gifts. ¹

Second - Find a small group, a prayer partner, your family, your spouse. For example, a Sunday School class and a Fellowship group can pray between services for the 10:30 am service. For the evening, mid-week Lent service or 8:00 am service, a small group could meet either in the Narthex or Library prior to worship. Thus fulfilling our call to Lenten prayers of sharing and listening to each other and the Holy Spirit.

<u>Third - Pray for a least 10-15 minutes to cover a St. Mark worship service in prayer</u>, note suggested guidelines below*, but as always follow the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

*In this season of Lent join your St. Mark family in a time of focused prayer before and during weekend and midweek worship services to:

- Repent of our sins, individual and corporate (St. Mark Church);
- Ask the Holy Spirit for **revival** within St. Mark Church by;
 - the preaching at St. Mark church.
 - conversions by the power of Holy Spirit at St. Mark.
- Ask the Holy Spirit for St. Mark Church to continue reformation for all believers through;
 - practical training and teaching for our soul forming Christian journey.
 - transformation of St. Mark minds shifting from a temporal to an eternal perspective.
 - making disciples.
- Ask the Holy Spirit for St. Mark to be a church of **restoration** by;
 - nurturing future pastors to live and teach the Gospel.
 - asking the Holy Spirit to embolden each of our St. Mark family to develop new relationships within their own neighborhoods, schools, and work.
 - sharing personal stories of the Christian life at St. Mark.
 - serving community needs through St. Mark based services.
- Conclude with prayers of praise and thanksgiving to the Trinity.



A Good Start to 2024!

Though giving in January was \$2,351 under budget, giving was \$2,683 above the amount tithed in January 2023. Cash in the bank decreased in the first month of the year by \$9,490. Part of the decrease was due ceiling repairs needed in the kitchen. At the end of January there was \$363,675 in cash and savings, as well as \$60,000 in the Contingency Fund. Endowment Fund donations remained at \$72,519 and Restricted Funds declined by \$12,115 for a total of \$402,995.


