

Our Cornerstone & Our Foundation

Dear Friends,

Since college Isaiah has been my favorite Old Testament prophet because of the way the Scriptures show us his calling to serve God in Isaiah chapter 6. Some seven to eight hundred years earlier, Isaiah foretold the coming of the Messiah and how much he would suffer in order to save us from our sins. Please look with me into chapter 28 of Isaiah, Isaiah 28:16(NLT) which speaks of Jesus, our precious cornerstone.

¹⁶Therefore, this is what the Sovereign LORD says: "Look! I am placing a foundation stone in Jerusalem, a firm and tested stone. It is a precious cornerstone that is safe to build on. Whoever believes need never be shaken."

When Isaiah was called by God to be a prophet, God gave to Isaiah one of the most profound experiences with God found in the Old Testament. Isaiah saw things we will not see until we enter heaven. Isaiah heard things we will not hear until we enter heaven. Isaiah felt things that we will not feel until the Lord brings us home. Isaiah had such a profound experience in God's Holy Presence that it made him into the man of God that he became. Isaiah was well assured that God is greater than all. In every chapter that Isaiah wrote, the depth of his experience in the Presence of God comes out. God is holy and we are not. In the very Presence of God, Isaiah became aware of what a dirty rotten sinner he was and his need of complete forgiveness, which he received.

Isaiah speaks more of the coming Messiah, Jesus, than any other prophet. God let him see Who the Cornerstone is. A "Precious Cornerstone" Who is our safe place to build our lives on. Jesus is our rock, our foundation, our secure safe place upon which to build our lives and live our lives day in and day out. Without the "Cornerstone" we are building our lives on sand which the smallest of winds can blow down. As we stand on the Precious Cornerstone, the worst of storms can come and we will not crumble. Jesus holds us up. He is our sure foundation.

In these days of the turbulence, we can all sing, "No one knows the troubles I've seen." Glory Alleluia! Jesus has not changed one bit. Our Foundation is secure. You can rest on it, on Him.

Let us pray. Dear Heavenly Father, all around it looks like the foundations are being shaken and some are crumbling. Thank you that Jesus is our Precious Cornerstone keeping us secure until we get to come home. May we rest peacefully on the Rock, Jesus, and be at peace even though we are surrounded by troubles. In the name of Jesus. Amen.

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Increments

Most people would like to be better than they are. We would like to improve at things like our golf score, managing our temper, spending less time on social media, staying within our budget, getting more exercise . . . The list could go on and on.

Here's a key word: incremental. If you are in your basement and want to go upstairs, you don't take a flying leap and hope you land on the next floor. No! You climb the stairs, one by one.

My house has gutters that have to be cleared many times each year due to overhanging trees. When I need to climb onto the roof, I grab the aluminum ladder. One step at a time I go from below to above.

We climb stairs or ladders by increments, not all at once.

It's the same with progress in the Christian life. Don't you wish you were more successful at prayer, caring for others, reading Scripture, giving generously, sharing your faith, and living unselfishly as a Christian in general? I sure do.

The apostle Peter gives us a sort of ladder for making progress in God's direction. Ladders have rungs. Here is Peter's ladder, with the rungs numbered and underlined (2 Peter 1:5–7):

For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your (1) <u>faith</u> with virtue, and (2) <u>virtue</u> with knowledge, and (3) <u>knowledge</u> with self-control, and (4) <u>self-control</u> with steadfastness, and (5) <u>steadfastness</u> with godliness, and (6) <u>godliness</u> with brotherly affection, and (7) <u>brotherly affection</u> with (8) love.

We all know the importance of love, for God and for one another. The passage above describes increments toward the life of love to which God calls us. Here they are:

- (1) Faith. This means trusting in Christ for forgiveness of our sins and strength for a transformed life.
- (2) <u>Virtue</u>. This means an outlook and behavior that honor God. Believing the Bible is a virtue. So is telling the truth. So is serving others. Faith in Christ leads to virtuous deeds and character!
- (3) <u>Knowledge</u>. We grow in understanding as we read Scripture, hear it preached, glean wisdom from friends, and progress in the school of hard knocks.
- (4) <u>Self-control</u>. We sin when we are enticed to go against God's word and (often) our own better judgment. Self -control helps us draw on God's word and Christ himself for stability and uprightness.
- (5) <u>Steadfastness</u>. The word can also be translated "patience." But this is not idleness or lazy defeatism. It means leaning into our challenges and not giving up.
- (6) <u>Godliness</u>. How can sinners be godly? First, recall Christ's cleansing of your sins through his death, received by faith. Second, as your new self is being renewed through faith in Christ (see Colossians 3:10), lay hold of Christlike qualities like compassion, kindness, humility, meekness and patience (there's that word again!; see Colossians 3:12).
- (7) <u>Brotherly affection</u>. The original word is *philadelphia*, love for the people around us. Our godliness (see above) should not make us stand-offish but should warm out hearts toward others, both in the church and beyond.

Council Highlights April 2022

Plans for Youth and Media roles post Josiah's departure:

- A Ministry Team has come together to support our youth throughout the summer and several members of the congregation will chaperone the 2022 Family Mission Trip.
- Brock Zwicke has accepted the Media role, concurrent with his role as Contemporary Worship Leader.

Movement for Improvement

- A Co-Pastor Call Committee is in place and had their first planning meeting (see President's article for details).
- Council will resume handing out Spiritual Gifts Profiles again for those who have not yet had the opportunity to complete their profiles. Our members are so uniquely blessed by God with their spiritual gifts and somewhere within St Mark is an opportunity to honor God by putting them to use in His service. So many already do so within and outside St Mark and we are thankful for you.

The Memorial Committee's request for a new processional cross was approved; the existing processional cross will be re-established within the church building in an appropriate location to be determined.

Funds were approved for disbursement in the amount of \$2,041.96, to WYAM (a previously vetted ministry) to help aid Ukrainian families displaced due to the war. Additional Evangelism benevolence funds were also approved to be disbursed to the same organization, to be determined by a percentage of overall Jan-April benevolence (approximately \$1500).

(8) <u>Love</u>. Love is the crowning grace of God's presence with us. "By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another" (John 13:35). "Above all, keep loving one another earnestly, since love covers a multitude of sins" (1 Peter 4:8).



So there are Peter's steps from beginning Christian life (faith) to an ever-fuller walk with God that results in effective affection for others. Few of these things happen easily. But there is a great payoff (2 Pet. 1:9):

For if these qualities are yours and are <u>increasing</u>, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Notice the underlined word: "increasing." This points to growth, progress, movement from lesser to greater and lower from lower to higher.

In other words, increments! Our growth in grace is gradual. The ladder rungs may be a far reach for us. But we are "increasing." God is real. The Bible is true. The church is worthwhile. God carries us upward when Christ is our inward impetus and final goal.




WHAT IS A CHURCH MEMBER

This month's highlight is Chapter 4: I Will Pray for my Church Leaders

Chapter 4 emphasizes our focus to pray for our pastor and church leaders.

Can you even imagine what a Pastor's day might involve? It certainly can be a roller coaster of emotional highs and lows. Well let's take a look at the possibilities; attending congregant emergencies, offsite visits and prayer needs, spiritual counseling, witnessing and praying for individuals, preaching sermons, teaching confirmation class, Bible Studies, preparing devotions and sermons, time to study the Bible and seek guidance from the Holy Spirit, attending meetings, collaborating with other churches, and performing baptisms, weddings, and funerals. Mind you, his agenda can change at the drop of a hat for emergency situations.



We read in 1Timothy 3:2-4; A pastor must be an overseer, therefore above reproach, the husband of one wife, self-controlled, sensible, respectable, hospitable, an able teacher, free from addictions, kind, a charitable heart, even temperament and manages his own household. Whew!

In 1 Peter 5:8 scripture tells us; Your adversary the devil walks about like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour. Haven't we all heard the current statistic of a Pastor's role suffering, especially during this COVID epidemic? Rummage Sale 2022 Save the Date! August 4th, 5th & 6th

Hard to believe the 2022 Rummage Sale is just over three months away. Harder to believe I have been helping to run it for over 25 years! Back then the women's group WELCA was in charge of the sale. It was very low key and only took up the back Sunday School area. Everything. even clothes, were put on tables. Donations came mostly from church members. We were only open each day until 5:00. Then somehow Sue DeYoung and I became the co-chairs of the sale and.......... We started advertising for donations in the weekly Advertiser. This brought in more donations so...... We started by expanding the sale into the fairly new Fellowship Hall. For those of you who didn't know, the Fellowship Hall used to be our Sanctuary before we added on. We also started using the basement and upstairs of the back Sunday School area. We started doing pickups which brought in more furniture donations. We got permission to start using the hallways and having our check outs in the front entry. We just kept growing and added free tents on the front lawn to help get rid of items that didn't sell well. Luckily we were able to get the Cancer Federation to drop off a truck to put leftover donations in. Before that we were driving all leftovers to Salvation Army. Then we purchased a banner to put on the lawn asking for donations from the community. This really started filling us up. Then the church bought the funeral home next door and turned it into our Education Center. So what did we do? Yep, we started using it. All clothes and toys were moved over there.

One day we had an awesome lady from Shepherd of the Lakes Church in Grayslake shop our sale. She helped with the sale at their church. She said they hung all their clothes on racks and asked if we would like to borrow them for our sale. We jumped at the chance. This allowed us to sell tons more clothes. After a few years we bought our own racks and have added to our supply of racks and hangers so that now when we set up clothes, it looks just like a department store.

We used to set up the whole sale in 3 days. That is no longer possible. So we start at the Ed Center for a couple weeks and then move to the main building for the final 10 days. Many, many hours of work by our awesome, fabulous, wonderful (we couldn't do it without) volunteers have helped turn our sale from a small fundraiser that brought in a few thousand dollars to a much larger one that last year brought in almost \$24,000! Sad for me, Sue retired and moved away. Fortunately, I have had a great group of people step up and take on parts of the sale. The sale this year will be August 4th - 6th. We will start collecting your treasures in early July. Set up will start shortly thereafter. Everyone is welcome to come and help. Next month we will tell you all the ways you can help and why we do things the way we do. So start decluttering your house and packing up all those donations. 

Thank you for all your continued support in filling the "yellow barrels"!! It's truly heart warming to see our Congregation continuing to reach out to help our neighbors in these unique times.


