Trustworthy Writings

Artificial intelligence (AI) is being discussed everywhere these days. Computers are being programmed to produce writings that are not a result of direct human authorship. Should we trust texts produced by AI like we trust letters from a friend? Should we trust a book produced by AI like we do one written by an expert on that subject? Probably not.

Should we trust the Bible in what it tells and teaches us? My answer would be yes. For one thing, it was not produced by AI. We can be grateful. It comes to us from our heavenly *Patēr* (Father), not Mark Zuckerberg's Meta.

For another - and this is decisive - Jesus endorsed the Bible. He quoted from the Old Testament frequently and said, "the Scriptures cannot be broken" (John 10:35). He appointed his followers to write the New Testament by the Spirit who led them.

When Jesus rose from the dead, he appeared to his disciples. One of the things he told them was: "Everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled" (Luke 24:44). Let's just take the Psalms as an example. How did Jesus fulfill them? Two examples out of dozens:

- 1. Jesus summarized his suffering (the cross) and exaltation (resurrection, ascension, victorious return) by citing Psalm 118:22: "The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone" (Matt 21:42; see also Mark 12:10; Luke 20:17; Acts 4:11; 1 Pet 2:7).
- 2. Psalm 22 stands out, not only in what it predicts, but in what it models about how study of God's word, hiding it in our hearts, equips us to live faithfully. Because Jesus knew this Psalm, he was able to cling to it in his dark hours on the cross:

Ps 22:1 My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning? 2 O my God, I cry by day, but you do not answer, and by night, but I find no rest.

Jesus clung to the hope of the Father's faithfulness.

Words uttered on the cross, capturing his suffering.

3 Yet you are holy, enthroned on the praises of Israel. 4 In you our fathers trusted; they trusted, and you delivered them. 5 To you they cried and were rescued; in you they trusted and were not put to shame.

6 But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people. 7 All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads; 8 "He trusts in the LORD; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, for he delights in him!"

9 Yet you are he who took me from the womb; you made me trust you at my mother's breasts. 10 On you was I cast from my birth, and from my mother's womb you have been my God.

11 Be not far from me, for trouble is near, and there is none to help. 12 Many bulls encompass me; strong bulls of Bashan surround me; 13 they open wide their mouths at me, like a ravening and roaring lion.

Jesus felt the sting of rejection. See Matt 27:43 for how mockers fulfilled this.

David's sense of God's care from before birth was also Jesus'. God's past care gives hope for the future.

Jesus' disciples had deserted him, and anyway where he was going, they could not follow (John 13:36).

14 I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast;15 my strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death.

16 For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet—17 I can count all my bones—they stare and gloat over me;

18 they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots.

The agony of the cross

Pierced: John 20:25

Lots and garments: Matt 27:35

What King David wrote a thousand years before Christ, the Son of David felt and voiced as he completed his messianic mission: "For our sake [God] made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Cor. 5:21).

The Psalms are part of an Old Testament division called "the writings." They consist of Psalms, Proverbs, Job, Song of Songs, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes, Esther, Daniel, Ezra-Nehemiah, and Chronicles.

These writings are trustworthy, just like the rest the Old Testament, and the New Testament too.

We wonder about AI and can be sure that some of it will be baloney. Some may prove toxic. Not so the "the writings," nor any other portion of God's word. These writings, as David said, are "more to be desired . . . than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb" (Psalm 19:10).

We pay for the technology that brings us AI. The gold and honey found in Scripture are offered as a gift to us - God's pure grace received through faith - provided by the work of Christ.

The resignation of Judy Dunfrund from the Safety & Security Committee was accepted with regrets.


The Seminarian Ministry and Christian Ministry Scholarship Policies were approved.

Is Christ in Your Thanksgiving Prayers?

The phrase "Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; for His steadfast love endures forever!" is found in six different verses (1 Chronicles 16:34, Psalm 107:1, Psalm 118:1, 29, Psalm 136:1, Jeremiah 33:11).

In 1789, George Washington proclaimed "a day of public thanksgiving and thanks" to thank God for his protection and as the source of all that is good. In his proclamation, he wrote,

Now therefore I do recommend and assign Thursday the 26th day of November next to be devoted by the People of these States to the service of that great and glorious Being, who is the beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be—That we may then all unite in rendering unto him our sincere and humble thanks—for his kind care and protection of the People of this Country previous to their becoming a Nation...

Note: "'God is not a glorified Santa Claus, who gives us everything we want, then fades out and lets us run our way. He gives, but in giving He gives of himself too. And the best gift God ever gives us is Himself too. He gives answers to prayer, but after we've used up the answer or don't need it anymore, we still have God.' Reflect on whether you have been realizing that gift of God Himself in your prayer life. Or have you been so self-centered on the gift or blessing that you have missed the Giver of the gift? If it is the latter, ask God for forgiveness and for change in your heart and prayer time" as the season of Thanksgiving this Fall comes upon us and transitions into the Christmas season of Joy for the gift of His son, Jesus.

The Case For Christ





Do you Know???... Linda Polman



Hi I'm Stewardship's "Ask Stewie". In this month's redux article, I want to remind you about online giving.

Greetings from the Stewardship Committee which includes Laurie Kerns and (Stewie) Carl Norlin. So, I know I like choices and really like to do it my way. At St. Mark we have many choices in worship styles, types of music and even how we give of our tithes and offerings. For so many years our committee has encouraged our members to use online giving. Well, the good news is our members have continued to increase the use of online giving. The use of paper checks in envelopes has been reduced, However, if you prefer to continue to write a paper check; it will **really help** our counting teams by writing your name (if using a pew envelope), the check number and amount enclosed on the envelope. This also helps the Financial Secretary in recording your donation for the annual statement.

As I began, we like choices and doing it our way. Let's look at how Online giving gives you choices:

First off here are reasons to consider online giving.

- You can choose not to fill out those envelopes and carry them or mail them to church.
- There is a cost savings to the church.
- There will be no more offering checks to write.
- Regular and consistent giving helps our church with budgeting. It evens out the annual giving.
- You can schedule your contribution even if you are on vacation or maybe are a "Snow-Bird". Your
 offering will come when you want it to, even when you are gone. Special offerings, no problem, they can
 be planned in advance.
- Online giving has all the special giving categories including, but not limited to, Flower Fund, HIS Ministry, and special offerings such as Memorials, to name a few.
- Helps the counting teams (a volunteer group) with less checks to count and tabulate.
- Assists our Financial Secretary, by tabulating giving reports since all information is provided electronically.
- Remember you can do it your way. You can schedule a contribution that is convenient for you, just as though you were writing a check. It can be made weekly, biweekly, or monthly. Any amount you would like, just like you would have done for the envelope.
- Or if you would prefer, the contribution could be scheduled for any amount and on any schedule as a reoccurring contribution that is done automatically.
