The Apostles' Creed: Worth More Than a Yawn

I preached at St. Mark Sunday morning, August 27. After the sermon we stood to say the Apostles' Creed. I saw someone yawn. I won't mention their name.

Who could blame them? A preacher's best can still be boring. Also, science tells us that yawns can be triggered by low oxygen levels. That probably describes a lot of us by the end of a Sunday morning sermon. We feel ready for a nap. Sometimes we may even be taking one. Yes, during the sermon. Then our spouse pokes us, hopefully before we start to snore.

Here are some reasons, though, why the creed we say in worship should snap us to alert rather than stupefy us:

- (1) The creed is a wonderful teaching tool. It summarizes the Bible under the Trinitarian headings of Father, Son, and Spirit. By frequent repetition it lodges deep in our memory. It rings deeply true in our heart. It provides a framework for reading the Bible, for approaching God, and for sensing God with us in our daily lives. We can say it in our daily prayers to confirm and celebrate our faith.
- (2) The creed links us with God's people through the ages. Most of the elements of the creed can be traced back into second century church practice and every clause finds some basis in Scripture, which is still more ancient. Reciting the creed places us in a confessing heritage that has observed God's faithfulness and unchanging truth across language groups, geographic boundaries, and nationalities for two millennia. There is staying power in this glorious lineage.
- (3) Creedal convictions connect us with each other presently. We are local but part of something bigger than local. We live in a divided society, we keep hearing. And there is truth to that claim. On the other hand, the largest religion worldwide is Christianity. What unites the true church everywhere in 2023? A major tie is certainties we share about God, the Son of God, and the Holy Spirit.

Some of us have felt this commonality deeply while worshiping in other countries. The customs, language, and dress may be different from what seems normal to us. But we share the same true and living God confessed by the church wherever the God of the Bible is still affirmed and worshiped. God does not change from country to country, any more than he alters from age to age. His kingdom is sovereign and united overall. The creed is both a call to worship and a means of worship. We feel afresh the truth and mystery of Scripture's reminder that there is "one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all" (Ephesians 4:5–6).

- (4) The creed is a means of knowing God better. It gives us clear categories for thinking about the eternal God in the majesty of the manner he has revealed himself to us:
 - "I believe in God the Father Almighty" reminds us that there is a caring sovereign being who made all things. As heavenly Father he upholds his people by his grace, guidance, and love.
 - "I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord" affirms the truth of the Gospels' testimony to Jesus' coming in fulfillment of dozens of Old Testament prophecies. He died for our sins, rose victorious over death, and will return in judgment. By faith and fidelity to him, be ready!
 - "I believe in the Holy Spirit" calls forth recollection of multiple saving works of God: the holy universal church, the communion of believers in Christ, the forgiveness of our sins, the resurrection of the body, and the promise of heaven with its joys and rewards "the life everlasting."

When we rise to recite the Apostles' Creed, instead of stifling yawns, we should actually probably be suppressing heartfelt cheers.

Council Highlights September 2023

Motion carried to approve a Constitution/Bylaw verbiage change for presentation to the congregation during the Annual Meeting on November 12th. The verbiage will change the word "committee" to "ministry team" wherever it appears in the documentation to further the fact that our volunteers strive to serve in capacities matching their spiritual gifts as opposed to the business-like connotation of "committee" and associated perception of bureaucracy.

Motion carried to approve the revised Requisition and Purchase Policy.

Motion carried to approve the Memorial Committee requests for 2023-2024

Motion carried to donate \$4,500 of Council Discretionary Benevolence funds to Shining Abilities, an organization that serves families in Lake and McHenry Counties through recreational programming for individuals with developmental disabilities.

Motion carried to donate \$2,500 of Council Discretionary Benevolence funds to SaveMessiah.org. Messiah Lutheran Church in Joliet IL (LCMC) is required to return \$485,000 in donations received over the past decade that were unknowingly part of fraudulent activity on the part of the businessman who donated them. Messiah has used the donations in ministry over the past decade and did nothing wrong however the SEC has the legal right to claw back all donations made by the individual at fault.

Church Mutual is preparing quotes of increased fraud coverage for St. Mark in light of the situation above.

The State of IL now requires every Illinois employer with five or more employees to offer their own retirement program for employees or facilitate Secure Choice, a free program offered by the State. After review of various options, St. Mark will register with Illinois Secure Choice.





I like choices and doing it my way


Hi I'm Stewardship's "Ask Stewie". In this month's redux article, I want to remind you about online giving.

Greetings from the Stewardship Committee which includes Laurie Kerns and (Stewie) Carl Norlin. So, I know I like choices and really like to do it my way. At St. Mark we have many choices in worship styles, types of music and even how we give of our tithes and offerings. For so many years our committee has encouraged our members to use online giving. Well, the good news is our members have continued to increase the use of online giving. The use of paper checks in envelopes has been reduced, However, if you prefer to continue to write a paper check; it will **really help** our counting teams by writing your name (if using a pew envelope), the check number and amount enclosed on the envelope. This also helps the Financial Secretary in recording your donation for the annual statement.

As I began, we like choices and doing it our way. Let's look at how Online giving gives you choices:

First off here are reasons to consider online giving.

- You can choose not to fill out those envelopes and carry them or mail them to church.
- There is a cost savings to the church.
- There will be no more offering checks to write.
- Regular and consistent giving helps our church with budgeting. It evens out the annual giving.
- You can schedule your contribution even if you are on vacation or maybe are a "Snow-Bird". Your offering will come when you want it to, even when you are gone. Special offerings, no problem, they can be planned in advance.



- Helps the counting teams (a volunteer group) with less checks to count and tabulate.
- Assists our Financial Secretary, by tabulating giving reports since all information is provided electronically.
- Remember you can do it your way. You can schedule a contribution that is convenient for you, just as though you were writing a check. It can be made weekly, biweekly, or monthly. Any amount you would like, just like you would have done for the envelope.
- Or if you would prefer, the contribution could be scheduled for any amount and on any schedule as a reoccurring contribution that is done automatically.

Financial Position & Budget

As of August 31st St. Mark had \$314,777 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in a contingency account and \$317,297 in Restricted Funds. Due primarily to staff vacancies, and in spite of contributions being \$52,986 below budget, the church is running a net income (gain) through August in the amount of \$81.092.

. . .

At the 2022 Annual Meeting the Congregation stepped out in faith and approved an anticipated loss of \$35,850 for this fiscal year. In spite of income coming in on a monthly average of \$6,500 below budget, God has provided. Please take the time to review the proposed 2024 budget. Once again we will be asking for approval of a loss in 2024. Our church is financially sound and God will provide as he always does. It is time to invest in the future of our church!




Miracles: What They Are, Why They Happen, and How They Can Change Your Life
