

These Sunday School numbers say more than a thousand words!

Sometimes numbers have a greater impact than words. Statistically, here are the Sunday School enrollment numbers since 2010, a drop of 73%.



There are many reasons for this; downward trend in young families not seeking a relationship with Christ, changing demographics, social pressures, or families seeking a new spiritual experience in another church.

Our challenge is simple, "How do we bring our community, and especially young families with children, to Christ and St. Mark?" Based on various studies done over the past few years, we need to examine how dedicated our church is for spreading the gospel and making disciples of Christ.

Note: No numbers for 2020, Sunday School was remote due to COVID.

Children are the future of Christ's Kingdom here on Earth. Below are some numbers for our Vacation Bible School ministry for the past six years.

2023 - 40 2022 - 57 2021 - 45 COVID 2020 - COVID 2019 - 92 2018 - 105

Jesus' Determination to Save the Lost

Jesus said, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10).

Jesus laid down his life on the cross. But unless we read the Gospels carefully, we may not realize that the religious leaders of Jesus' day were trying to kill him for months before Good Friday (see John 5:18; 7:1, 19, 25; 8:37).

In fact at one point, the Jerusalem authorities "picked up stones again to stone him" (10:31). "Again" signals that it wasn't the first time. Jesus was a marked man and knew it. Only by the protection of the crowds and the guidance of his heavenly Father did Jesus continually evade arrest.

Jesus escaped that death by stoning by leaving Jerusalem and the surrounding district called Judea. Yet just a few days later he made a decision that shocked his disciples (John 11:7–8):

Then after this he said to the disciples, "Let us go to Judea again." 8 The disciples said to him, "Rabbi, the Jews were just now seeking to stone you, and are you going there again?"

Notice they say "are you going there again?" not "are we going there again?" I think they had already decided that returning was not an option.

I was teaching this passage in a church recently, and I saw two people whispering. Later I asked what they were discussing.

They told me: Jesus, after safely withdrawing from Judea where his life was in danger, then turned around and led his disciples right back in. This reminded the whispering people of a classic film: The Magnificent Seven. You may remember the cast:

Yul Brynner as Chris Adams, a Cajun gunslinger, leader of the seven

Steve McQueen as Vin Tanner, a drifter

Horst Buchholz as Chico, the young, hot-blooded shootist

<u>Charles Bronson</u> as Bernardo O'Reilly, the professional in need of money

Robert Vaughn as Lee, the traumatized veteran

Brad Dexter as Harry Luck, the fortune seeker

James Coburn as Britt, the knife expert



So what in the world do The Seven have to do with John 11? Here's the comparison that occurred to the people in my Bible class: in the movie, at one point The Seven are captured by the villain, Calvera. The Seven are ushered from the village and told never to return.

But . . . they go back! Their mission to bring justice to the harassed peasants of the village has captured their hearts. Eventually they succeed in defeating Calvera, though most of them die in the final gun battle.

The movie is based on a 1954 Japanese film Seven Samurai. A difference is that Seven Samurai does not have the part about The Seven leaving, then returning. The people in my class wondered about a Christian influence on the American filmmakers. For they saw an analogy between The Seven returning to what seemed like certain death--because of their commitment to saving the people of a village--and Jesus' resolve to return to Judea despite the evident danger, due to his commitment to saving the lost.

It was Thomas who cast the deciding vote for the Twelve: So Thomas, called the Twin, said to his fellow disciples, "Let us also go, that we may die with him."

Jesus' willing and finally fatal decision to return underscores his decision to do whatever it took to fulfill his mission. This involved not only himself but his close followers. His mission implicated them. The danger he had to risk, they could not evade, either.

So eventually, with Thomas' prodding, they returned to the village of Bethany with Jesus. Bethany was just two miles from Jerusalem. This was the beginning of the end for Jesus' earthly life. But it was the beginning of the fulfillment of God's promise of eternal life for all who believe in Jesus as the Messiah.

May we follow Jesus with the (maybe shaky) resolve of the not-always-so-magnificent-Twelve wherever he leads us this week, even if we've never heard of The Magnificent Seven.


We Thank God for your 2024 Prayers for Muslims during Ramadan

Donations Lag in February

Though giving in February was \$12,197 under budget, giving was \$29 above the amount tithed in February 2023. Cash in the bank increased by \$5,995. At the end of February there was \$369,670 in cash and savings, as well as \$60,000 in the Contingency Fund. Endowment Fund donations total \$86,904 and Restricted Funds increased by \$1,019 for a total of \$404,014.

From Logan, WV, to the Middle East

Those two areas of the world may never have been Google mapped together before but for those of us who went on the mission trip last summer – we're connecting the dots!

Last July, nine of us went to Logan, WV, for an awesome mission trip helping the people of this small town in Appalachia. The organization that organized our mission trips is called Youth-Works and the best leader - by far - I have had in my nine mission trips has been Anna Hylen. She was awesome (and not because she laughed at my stupid jokes)! We have kept in contact since last summer and she just sent me info about her next "adventure". 
