Reasons for Hope

When I was a kid in school, they made us learn poems. This one stuck with me, by Robert Browning (1812–1889):

The year's at the spring And day's at the morn; Morning's at seven; The hillside's dew-pearled; The lark's on the wing; The snail's on the thorn: God's in His heaven— All's right with the world!



It's spring! Lawns are turning green even in Chicagoland! Have you heard an ice cream truck yet? If not, you soon will—driving you nuts with the same song on loudspeakers over and over again.

But let's stay positive. Spring is a welcome time because it does away with winter's cold and dark. Days are longer and warmer. Maybe the Sox or Cubs are winning. Even if not: spring is a season of hope.

We need hope! Scripture says, "So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love" (1 Cor. 13:13). Yes, love is greatest, but hope is right up there near the top. Hope is one of greatest gifts of faith in Christ.

We need hope because we see so much misery and conflict and ugliness in the world around us. I know two people with vertigo right now and one dying of cancer—and she's only 30 years old. A friend's marriage is breaking up. On the political scene this is an election year—and there's not much pretty about the presidential choices that are emerging. It's hard to keep up with the wars underway in Ukraine, Israel, and elsewhere.

As if that were not enough, many of us face personal challenges that tempt us to lose hope.

Holy Scripture testifies to a hope that lifts Christ's followers out of despair and defeatism. Just in the Psalms we find over two dozen mentions of hope. They teach us valuable lessons. For example:

- 1. Ps 119:49 "Remember your word to your servant, in which you have made me **hope**." God gives hope to us through his word, the Bible.
- 2. Ps 119:114 "You are my hiding place and my shield; I hope in your word." God's word gives us refuge and protection.
- 3. Ps 147:11 "The LORD takes pleasure in those who fear him, in those who **hope** in his steadfast love." God's "steadfast love" is shown to us in Jesus Christ. God delights in us because we have placed our hope in him. That enables us to find delight in God.

In the poem above, Browning writes, "God's in his heaven/all's right with the world." Well, God is in his heaven, right enough, but a lot in this world is a mess. All is not right!

Yet offsetting sin and darkness is that fact that in Christ God "loved us and gave us eternal comfort and good **hope** through grace" (2 Thess. 2:16).

We are still celebrating Easter, and Pentecost lies just ahead (May 19). Let the signs of spring point us toward the hope we share: "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! According to his great mercy, he has caused us to be born again to a living **hope** through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead."

And what is not "right with the world," God is putting right. So: "Let us hold fast the confession of our **hope** without wavering, for he who promised is faithful" (Heb. 10:23).

UNDER CONSTRUCTION
We are pleased to announce the members of the Call Committee for a new Senior Pastor. Members include Shawn Frank, Kevin Graul, Kevin Korom, Patty Lindholm, Karisa McGill, Pam Preston, and Tom Sanderson.

The Ministry Board of Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC) recognizes the authority and responsibility of congregations of LCMC to call their own pastors. Previously, the process was for candidates being presented for a call, now it is up to each church to navigate the call process on their own.

Under the guidance of Intentional Interim Pastor Steve, we have begun meeting weekly, learning the call process and refining what was previously started. We have been viewing training videos from the LCMC website and are studying the LCMC Call Packet.

Topics being worked on (or already accomplished) include identifying all possible avenues for communicating with potential candidates, updating the pastoral job description, coordinating with Church Council and the Transition Team, and compiling a congregational profile with details about our church, ministry practices, structure, and our future.



A FEW UPDATES ABOUT FMSC


FIRST - Our next packing date is Thursday, May 2nd, at 7:15. Here is the link to use to sign up: FMSC Sign Up. You will be packing a different type of meal called MannaPack Mix. This meal still has the vitamins, vegetables, and soy but does not include rice. FMSC's partners have worked with the local people getting our food and they are able to grow their own rice, corn, sorghum, or millet for the fourth ingredient. It is a win-win on both ends of the process, FMSC can send the food cheaper since it is so much lighter minus the rice and the local people get paid for growing their own products.

SECOND - St. Mark, as an organization, has been officially packing food with FMSC once a month since August of 2022. We have missed a couple of months here and there for a variety of reasons, but we have packed 14 times as a St.







Knowing the Importance of Prayer in God's Eternal Work... Appealing to the Holy Spirit 24/7

"I am the true grapevine, and my Father is the gardener. ² He cuts off every branch of mine that doesn't produce fruit, and he prunes the branches that do bear fruit so they will produce even more. ³ You have already been pruned and purified by the message I have given you. ⁴ Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me. John 15:1-4

A few weeks ago St. Mark Church joined to eat, enjoy the spirit of fellowship, and strive for the next several hours to wrestle with phrases and words (word smithing) to birth a new mission and vision statement. First, the mission, the purpose of our congregation, and second the vision, a description of how St. Mark Church can accomplish our mission statement based on the results of the cottage meetings.

Meditating on John 15: 1-2 - it was fun, but mid-way into late afternoon - pruning was painful! First, Intentional Interim Pastor Steve led and encouraged us; his efforts culminating with a basic mission draft-emerging with beach balls flying into selected baskets accompanied by various noise makers and cheers. Over the next hour and a half, the vision draft s-l-o-w-l-y emerged on the black board enduring frequent erasing of phrases and words, sharing, reviewing for patterns, and tweaking again. "Are we done now???"

The best description is that of a junior high band practicing for its first performance - drummers drumming their part, while the other band members wait to toot their various horns. All together again - discord. Finally, after each band section toots and blows, the conductor brings the band together to play once again a recognizable "Amazing Grace." "Alleluia!!!"

This was an answer to our morning prayer for the mission and vision statements to be the fruit of this meeting. For PRAYER to emerge at the top of the list of the vision statement along with worship, we praise God! Noting in John 15, neither man, woman nor a church will be fruitful without Jesus.

Early Sunday morning of the *Extravaganza*, the following prayer was shared on the St. Mark prayer chain. For our Mission and vision extravaganza:

Please pray for St. Mark Church to seek and listen for the Holy Spirit's guidance as we work out together a mission and vision statement. We ask the statements will reflect what God loves, so to bear fruit, and glorify the Father, Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit.

Join in America's National Day of Prayer Thursday, May 2nd as well as the rest of 2024

The mission of the National Day of Prayer Task Force is:

"Centered on the Lord Jesus Christ, the National Day of Prayer Task Force exists to mobilize unified public and personal prayer for America."

Historical Summary

- 1775 The first Continental Congress calls for a National Day of Prayer and Fasting.
- **1863** Abraham Lincoln calls for a National Day of Prayer.
- 1952 Harry S. Truman declares a National Day of Prayer and signs into law an annual observance there of United States Congress passed Joint Resolution 382 on April 17, 1952/ President Truman signs Public Law 82-324 (Public Law 82-324; 66 Stat. 64—April 17, 1952).
- 1988 Ronald Reagan signs into law the designation of the first Thursday in May as the annual observance for the National Day of Prayer President Reagan signs Public Law 100-307 January 25, 1988, in the Second Session of the One Hundredth Congress (Public Law 100-307—May 5, 1988).
 - 1998 Pub. L. 105-225, August 12, 1998, 112 Stat. 1258: The President shall issue each year a proclamation designating the first Thursday in May as a National Day of Prayer on which the people of the United States may turn to God in prayer and meditation at churches, in groups, and as individuals. This law was signed by President Clinton.

Stop by at the St. Mark Prayer Table for a *Pray for America Prayer Guide*.

Pray for our elections: So why pray for the elections? There are a number of compelling reasons:

- > The Bible commands us to pray for those who are in leadership (I Timothy 2:1-4). This includes those who are vying to become leaders.
- > Godly leaders can help slow the erosion of religious liberties in our land. This can provide an increased window of opportunity for the Church to pray and evangelize.
- According to Scripture, "Righteousness exalts a nation, but sin is a disgrace to any people" (Proverbs 14:34). The selection of leaders who understand and lead according to God's righteous standards can bring great blessing to a nation.
- > Scripture also says in Proverbs 11:14, "For lack of guidance a nation falls, but many advisors make victory sure." The determination of who leads our nation will also determine who advises that leader and how we are guided.

Blessings!! Gae Michal Denise and I say hello to all the congregation at Saint Mark! This past month was a very busy month for all the




teachers and students at our Education Center. Christ has risen indeed!

Donations For March

Giving in March was \$ 4,022 under budget. Through the first quarter of 2024, giving was \$18,471 under budget and \$10,000 under total unrestricted donations for the first quarter of 2024. Cash in the bank increased by \$1,061. At the end of March there was \$370,731in cash and savings, as well as \$60,000 in the Contingency Fund. Restricted Funds increased by \$11,246 for a total of \$415,260, \$64,385 of which is the Columbarium Fund.


