# From the Desk of Intentional Interim Pastor Steve

Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ

I'd like to spend my next few articles looking at our vision statements. Our mission statement Is **Love God and love all people.** 

How can we go about that?

Our vision statements are exactly how we do it!

#### Our first vision statement is: Prayer

We are a people who are about prayer. As Paul writes in Thessalonians <u>17</u> pray without ceasing, <u>18</u> give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you. <u>19</u> Do not quench the Spirit.

We pray in all circumstances! Prayer is about communication with God through talking and listening. Several people saw this vision statement as too inclusive, that this isn't about the world and others. Yet I propose that prayer is an integral part of everything we do, both at church with the people of God and with and for the world.

Matthew 9 reminds us we are to be out in the world, praying that God's kingdom would come to its fulness and we would be out in the world doing God's work.

35 And Jesus went throughout all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction. 36 When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. 37 Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; 38 therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest."

We are sent out into the world with prayer as our foundation in our relationship with God! We are called to love and pray for everyone, even our enemies.

### **Our Church Needs You!**

Elections are coming soon! Our annual meeting is on November 10<sup>th</sup>. Every year, the Elders are challenged with putting together the slate of nominees for positions that need to be filled. This is a very daunting task. We touch base with quite a few people during July, August and September asking them to consider a position on Council. Sadly, most decline. Some members may have genuine life circumstances that prevent their ability to serve. Here are some of the reasons people provide and what the bible has to say.

- 1) "I don't have the time." Busy schedules, routines and roles can become overwhelming. There are many things that can cause us to take our eyes off God and lose site of Him and the work he is doing in our lives. What is consuming your time? Is it the worries of everyday life; working to achieve wealth; or desires of other things? "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil." (Ephesians 5: 15-16). The past several Council Presidents have aimed to try to keep the length of Council meetings reasonable!
- 2) "I don't think I'm qualified." Any time you start something new there is a learning curve. Fear of not knowing what to do can be anxiety producing. We desire security and control. But we are not in control, God is. Only God. We must set fear aside to make room for the power of God to work through us. "For God gave us a spirit, not of fear but of power and self control" (Timothy 2:17).
- 3) "Been there, done that, it's for the young people." The Bible provides many examples of God using elderly men and women to do His work. As long as you have breath, God has a purpose and plan for your life. Seniors help pass faith down to the next generation; are a source of wisdom; and may have "old ideas" that still apply and can be useful in the present day. "Even to your old age and gray hairs I am he, I am he who will sustain you, I have made you and I will carry you; I will sustain you and I will rescue you" (Isaiah 46: 4).
- 4) "I've been on council previously and it wasn't a good experience." Disagreements and ruffled feathers do come along at times while doing "church business." Prayer for the Pastor, the Church, the Church Council is IMPERA-TIVE. Council members should do as Jesus instructed, "A new command I give you: Love one another, As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will now that you are my disciples, if you love one another." (John 13: 34-35). Even in love, we can still disagree. If you are holding on to grudges or hurt feelings, I urge you to make amends.
- 5) "No one asked me before" The Elders cannot possibly talk to every member of the church, nor can we be expected to know what every person's gifts and talents are. If you are considering or have questions about a particular role, please SPEAK UP! Any Elder or Council member can answer your questions. "As each has received a gift, use it to serve one another, as good stewards of God's varied grace." (1 Peter 4:10)

This is not intended to place a guilt trip on members to push them into serving. God calls us to be good stewards, meaning we are to "utilize and manage resources He provides for His glory and the betterment of His creation" (Holman Bible Dictionary). I ask, "In a spirit of unity, do you desire to be a good steward and use your time, talents and treasures to move forward our mission and vision?"

Being a part of a church's council gives you the opportunity to add input into the spiritual support of members, policy guidance, strategic planning, and responsible spending. We invite you to join St. Mark's leadership team!

As the annual meeting and church elections approach, please pray for members' hearts to change and for wisdom as we seek to encourage them to use their gifts to benefit St. Mark which ultimately glorifies God.

## MISSOURI MUSINGS

### Finding Faith

In May I wrote about hope. Scripture says, "So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love." This month let's look at faith.

The American poet Emily Dickinson (1830–1886) poked a little fun at faith:

"Faith" is a fine invention

For Gentlemen who see!

But Microscopes are prudent

In an Emergency!

There's some truth there. Microscopes and the scientific enterprise have brought about great good. Of course there have been downsides too. While medicine saves lives, medical technologies and labs produce fentanyl and other abused drugs. These consume lives at alarming rates.

Science has eased and aided human life. But it also lies behind industrial and military capacities that threaten the environment and whole populations. Warring factions in Sudan, depending on arms shipped in from Iran and Russia and elsewhere, have displaced millions and threaten millions more with starvation. Whichever side wins, the result will be tough for any surviving Christians, since both major factions are militant Islamist with no place for Christians in their social vision, if they even have one.

Dickinson's poem above can be taken to brush aside faith—it's "a fine invention." But actually it a priceless gift when we think of faith in Jesus Christ. The Apostle John put it this way: "For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith" (1 John 5:4).

"Born of God" describes what happens when we receive the gospel message. We repent of our sins, trust in Jesus's death on the cross, and commit our lives to Christ who rose and conquered death, gifting us with eternal life through faith.

That faith, John writes above, overcomes the world. Faith in Christ is the gateway to benefits too numerous to exhaust here. But we can give some examples:

<u>Faith protects us.</u> Believers in Jesus "by God's power are being guarded through **faith** for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time" (1 Peter 1:5). Guarded from what? To name just one example: "In all circumstances take up the shield of **faith**, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one" (Ephesians 6:16). This is why Luther could write: "The Prince of Darkness grim/We tremble not for him."

<u>Faith, tested, produces stability.</u> "You know that the testing of your **faith** produces steadfastness" (James 1:3). We live in an anxious age. Where and how can we find refuge for our souls? The answer: in Christ, and through faith. His assurance displaces anxiety.

<u>Faith pleases God.</u> "Without **faith** it is impossible to please him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that he exists and that he rewards those who seek him" (Hebrews 11:6). This is shown going all the way back to Abel: "By **faith** Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his **faith**, though he died, he still speaks" (Hebrews 11:4).

<u>Faith opens to us the riches of God's word, our salvation.</u> The Apostle Paul wrote to Timothy: "From childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for

salvation through faith in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 3:15).

That's just a short list of the benefits of faith. But none of those benefits are trivial.

Faith is not some "fine invention/For Gentlemen" as in Emily Dickinson's poem. It is a divine gift to be exercised, nurtured, and enjoyed. For it is written: Through Christ we have "obtained access by **faith** into this grace in which we stand, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God" (Romans 5:2).

A motion was approved to approve the Worship and Music Director position to be available for approximately \$60,000 per year.

The Council was informed that PADS will no longer use churches for lodging. A motion was approved to dispose of St. Mark's PADS equipment.

#### Matthew 5:44

43 "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, 45 so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if you love those who love you, what reward do you have? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? 47 And if you greet only your brothers, what more are you doing than others? Do not even the Gentiles do the same? 48 You therefore must be perfect, as your heavenly Father is perfect.

Prayer is both an internal and external vision. We pray in all circumstances!

As we are loving God and all people, prayer is our foundation of how we do that. Prayer is central to following God with our mission statement. We pray to God and pray with and for all people.

#### Our Second vision statement is: Worship

Worship is formal and informal praising God for God's mighty deeds and Jesus' redemption of us and the world!

#### Isaiah 19:23

<u>23</u> In that day there will be a highway from Egypt to Assyria. The Assyrians will go to Egypt and the Egyptians to Assyria. The Egyptians and Assyrians will worship together.

Isaiah writes that God's intended reality is that all people worship God together. Even lifelong sworn enemies like the Egyptians and Assyrians would worship together. Worshiping God with all people is a central tenet of God's plans for God's people. Worship isn't for just the people we like, but for all believers in Jesus Christ.

#### Matthew 28:

<u>16</u> Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. <u>17</u> And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. <u>18</u> And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. <u>19</u> Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit

Worship can be formal on Saturday evening or Sunday morning. However, as we see with the disciples, it can also be spontaneous praise God for what God has done, even when we don't full understand what that is. Worship is part of the great commission that leads us to share the good new of Jesus with all nations.

#### Revelation 15:4

4 Who will not fear you, Lord, and bring glory to your name? For you alone are holy. All nations will come and worship before you, for your righteous acts have been revealed."

Worship is an internal action for St. Mark. We worship together. However, it is also something we can do anywhere and with anyone. As we have seen worship is part of our calling to love all people through worship of God anywhere. We share God's love as we worship God!

This was in a set of devotions that were written, however due to several factors, they haven't been widely read. It's important that we begin to understand and use them as we move forward to calling a new pastor. You've heard me preach on mission and vision many times. Mission and vision is a critical component to the future of St. Mark.

The council has a retreat this month to look at our future. The mission and vision will be a central part of that retreat. It's never easy to pick up a new habit and using the mission to guide the congregation is new. I equate it to learning to brush my teeth when I was young. At first, I would forget it and my parents had to remind me. More than once, I got up after going to bed to brush my teeth. I had to be intentional about thinking, 'did I brush my teeth?' After a while, I just did it because it was part of my morning and evening ritual. The same thing happens here.

We need to be intentional about using these tools to move us into the future. That's also why the time we're spending together is intentional interim ministry.

The drone virtual tour will be available for candidates on the website for all to view.


The brochure is done and being sent to potential candidates.

## Knowing the Importance of Prayer in God's Eternal Work... Appealing to the Holy Spirit 24/7

<sup>7</sup> If you abide in Me, and My words abide in you, you<sup>[b]</sup> will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. <sup>8</sup> By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples. John 15: 7-8

Your St. Mark prayer team thank each of you for listening and answering our continuing call to pray as one corporate body to seek the Holy Spirit's blessings for St. Mark Church to:

- be a House of Prayer,
- faithfully engage in the Great Commission: so we pray for:
  - o a GREAT REVIVAL, a third great awakening;
  - o opportunities for ongoing DISCIPLESHIP:
    - a spirit filled teaching pastor,
    - Biblically grounded teachers to teach believers to bring about their spiritual transformation and as well as nourishing mature believers.

As we pray for revival in our nation, we ask God to stir up spiritual fervor in people's hearts (Ezra 1;1,5). So it is key to pray that God would stir up in people the heart conditions for revival that He has laid out in the Bible. Our culture has forsaken God, neglected God and even rebelled against Him. Mario Murillo says, "Before a great awakening, there must be a rude awakening." "Adversity greater than human self-sufficiency can handle will bring us to the end of ourselves and make us realize our need for God. It is the first step toward people's getting right with Him. Despair brings about the other heart conditions to which God responds." <sup>1</sup>

So in this state of desperation note the following are prayer points for August:

- Pray **Psalm 139:23-24**: before you pray for holy desperation in others. Ask God to reveal any trace of being too comfortable, self-sufficient, and independence in your own heart.
- Pray according to **Proverbs 9:10** that America's moral slide, both inside and outside the Church, will fill God's people with holy fear and a burning desire to seek Him.
- Pray through **James 5:4-6** and **Revelation 3:15-20** for the Holy Spirit to open our eyes and burden our hearts against any worldliness and lukewarm condition in the Church.
- Pray through the prophecy and promise of **Zechariah 14:13-16** for the growing instability in the U.S. to bring about godly fear in our nation that will direct hearts to return to God and worship Him.<sup>2</sup>





## Did you know?

- When giving online, you save the church money by processing your donation as a check direct from your checking account rather than through a credit card.
- When giving online you can give a one time donation, or set up automatic payments.
- When giving online you can select general giving or special giving for designated funds like flowers, memorial gifts, building fund, etc.

As of June 30th St. Mark had \$394,840 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in a contingency account . Giving is \$49,641 under budget through the first half of the year. Due to staff vacancies and careful spending, instead of the budgeted net loss, the church is running a net income for the first half of the year in the amount of \$41,163.


# What's on the Shelf?
