Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ,

Vision statement #3 is:

This vision is all about sanctification. Paul says in <u>1 Thessalians 5:23 Now may the God of peace</u> <u>himself sanctify you completely and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless</u> <u>at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.</u>

Our Contemporary Service...

As we move into the future, a question has been raised, "Should St. Mark's Contemporary Service continue to be a blended worship service combing content from both the traditional and contemporary services or should the Contemporary Service be 'truly' contemporary?" The questions below need to be explored with sound answers to help guide not only our membership, but the new pastor who will lead us.

Regardless of whether a service is traditional or contemporary, the goal of any worship service is to totally praise and glorify God!

Research indicates that Contemporary Services are a form of <u>Christian worship</u> that emerged within the 1970s and 1980s. Contemporary worship typically uses modern music in a greater portion of the service than in traditional worship forms. The settings are more informal. Where contemporary worship is practiced in churches with a <u>liturgical</u> tradition, elements of the liturgy are frequently kept to a minimum.

A 2019 article by Dana Horrell, "What is Contemporary Worship" outlines some of the defining features of a contemporary service including music, informality, relevance and technology.

Music. It is basically an innovative use of music that is derived from popular music such as rock, jazz, and folk. Research shows that the majority of songs are about prayer or adoration. Another trait is to place the musicians in front of the worship area instead of the pastor.

Informality. A key to a contemporary service is informality in style, dress, speech and leadership. A relaxed style is promoted as part of the service. In some churches having snacks and drinks may be encouraged as part of the service.

Relevance. Years ago churches began to reach out to youth in ministries that met them "where they are." Some churches altered worship times and day of the week to fit with work schedules and family recreation time.

Technology: According to Ms. Horrell, "Dependence on electronic technology is ubiquitous in contemporary worship. This includes everything from amplified use of electronic guitars, keyboards, and drums in the employment of LED projectors and screens for song lyrics and video clips...."

St. Mark needs to attract more youthful families with children and there is a growing trend among some younger people to prefer the contemporary style of worship.

There appears to be no universal format for a Contemporary Service as every church who selects to have such a service defines the worship parameters for their own membership. Please note, St Mark has had great success with its current Contemporary Service format.

The following questions should be considered to help decide what type of Contemporary Service St. Mark will have in the future.

How formal or informal should the service be? Should the service be led by a Pastor or Worship Leader? Should there be a Liturgy in the service? What type and how many songs should be sung throughout the service? Should there be a confession of sins during the service? Should there be a sermon or a Biblical message? What should be the musical accompaniment? Should a Worship Band be placed in the Altar area? Should there be a children's sermon?

The Greatest of These

In previous months I wrote about hope and faith. Now we consider love: "So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love" (1 Corinthians 13:13).

There are various kinds of love. You can love the Cubs, the Packers, or the Blackhawks. You can love your car—Subaru ads are based on this. You can love your patio or fresh landscaping. You can love your first cup of coffee in the morning.

But those objects of our love are exterior to us. They don't love us back. They fulfill some need or desire. But we don't have a personal relationship with them.

A lot of people have a pet in their lives, a cat or a dog. Some cats are aloof, and they let you know it. But I know a cat named Brutus that rubs up against you like a dog and wants attention. Dogs can be very forward in showing affection. They love their owners! They crave love in return.

Still, as real and important as pets can be to us, they are animals. We were sad several years ago when we had to bury our white German shepherd Wolf. But it wasn't the same as the deep loss felt at the death of a close friend, child, or spouse.

When Scripture speaks of "the greatest of these," it is referring to the love that God shows. For example: "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8).

As humans we have the capacity to receive and reflect God's love. Theologians call this the *imago dei*—the image of God. We were made in God's image: "So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them" (Genesis 1:27).

That image was marred when sin entered the world (Genesis 3). Still, we have the capacity, though now we struggle with misguided love.

Our love, human love, is noble and desirable, but it is imperfect. The standard for love biblically speaking is not what we desire, feel, or express, but who God is and what he has done in Christ: "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10). "Propitiation" means the Son bore the Father's judgment for sins that you and I committed.

When we trust in Christ who died and rose for us, a new love arises in us: "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us and his love is perfected in us" (1 John 4:11–12).

God's love "is perfected in us." That's astounding! But believers in Christ have a front row seat on the love of God. God is infusing love into us: "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us" (Romans 5:5).

Fortified with God's love by his Spirit, we find resources beyond the ordinary to love others—our spouse, our children, our neighbor, even those we may consider unlovely. Jesus' words on this topic are haunting and challenging: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' But I say to you, Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, so that you may be sons of your Father who is in heaven. For he makes his sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust" (Matthew 5:43–45).



We may be thankful for the love that has been shown to us, by God and by other people. We may be sure that God is pleased as we, through faith in Christ and a personal walk with him, receive his love with a heart to show that love to others.

Important decisions from August 2024:

The Council meeting for August 2024 was rather short with the only major motion being approved was to purchase additional Bibles for distribution at Feed My Starving Children in Libertyville.

The 2025 church budget was on the agenda but was postponed until the September meeting for a comprehensive review.

St. Mark is Moving Forward

St. Mark moved forward by developing goals that support St. Mark's mission of "Loving God and all People" during a Saturday, August 17th Council retreat.

During this working session, the Council members reviewed our Mission and Vision statements. Members were divided into small groups to discuss and develop goals with the mission and vision in mind for what we want St. Mark to accomplish in the next year and then for the following three to five years. After small group discussions, we came back together to brainstorm. Together we developed overall comprehensive goals for the future.



Why do this work? St. Mark is in the midst of searching for a new pastor. This new pastor must be aware of, and embrace, the goals that were established. Forming these goals brings continuity as Council members change and keeps us moving forward. It will be important that Council reviews these goals on a regular basis to learn about successes and where improvement is needed.

Goals for 2025

Attract more young people, those before confirmation and ages 18 to 25. Establish younger youth groups to learn what they need. Interact and have shared activities with other area churches. Form a task force to review the use of the Ed Center. Form a task force to focus on identifying community needs, especially children.

Goals for the Next 3 to 5 Years

Hire a Youth Pastor.

Establish a marketing and media team.

Give Welcome Baskets to new people moving into the area.

Re-imagine worship services and explore having an occasional outdoor service or have a service on a weeknight and decide on the format of our Contemporary Service.

Provide regular community events.

Form a task force and rebuild educational programs for all age groups.

Have more congregational forums on important issues.

Finally, some members of the congregation may totally agree or disagree with the goals. Other members may have goals to add. Please consider becoming a member of the Council so your ideas can become part of St. Mark's future.

An essential vision of the early Church was to provide opportunities and encourage people to grow in Christ. It makes great sense to make it one of ours too!

When Jesus encounters people in need of help he instructs his disciples. 

First, hanks to Sammie Kerns and Danielle Wetterberg, that is me behind all that whipped cream!!! As you may remember, FMSC had a fundraising event where volunteers could donate to have staff members get "pie'd". Our goal was to feed a family of 4 a meal a day for a year but our wonderful donors thought that wasn't enough!! We raised over \$1500, which fed 15 people!!

Second - speaking of donations, through the offering taken during VBS, \$454.21 was given to FMSC. This is enough money for 1556 (just in case you didn't catch that number) <u>ONE</u> THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY SIX meals!!


St. Mark's Joyful Hearts - Singles Group

Fin Facts

Did you know?

As of July 31st St. Mark had \$383,700 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in a contingency account. The cash balance has increased by \$80,000 over last year. Instead of the anticipated loss of (\$25,000) in the budget for the end of July, the church has a gain of \$31,000 through the first seven months of the fiscal year in spite of an average \$10,000 per month decline in budgeted general tithing. The gain is due to staff vacancies and careful spending.

At the 2023 Annual Meeting the Congregation stepped out in faith and approved an anticipated loss of \$35,850 for this fiscal year. The proposed 2024 budget will be published soon.


