From the Desk of Intentional Interim Pastor Steve

Greetings brothers and sisters in Christ

This month we'll look at how we are loving God and all people through vision statements 5 and 6.

Vision statement 5 is: Share our gifts both materially and spiritually.

We use our spiritual gifts to build each other up. Likewise, God has expectations about our sharing of our God given material gifts too.

1 Corinthians <u>1</u> Now about the gifts of the Spirit, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed.<u>2</u> You know that when you were pagans, somehow or other you were influenced and led astray to mute idols.<u>3</u> Therefore I want you to know that no one who is speaking by the Spirit of God says, "Jesus be cursed," and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.<u>4</u> There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them.<u>5</u> There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord.<u>6</u> There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work.<u>7</u> Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good.<u>25</u> so that there should be no division in the body, but that its parts should have equal concern for each other.<u>26</u> If one part suffers, every part suffers with it; if one part is honored, every part rejoices with it.<u>27</u> Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it.<u>31</u> Now eagerly desire the greater gifts. And yet I will show you the most excellent way.

Our gifts are very different from each other given to us for the building up of the body of Christ, the Church. The sharing doesn't stop with our spiritual gifts but extend into our material gifts given to us by God.

The very thought that we get our material gifts from God can be a foreign concept to us. Our culture teaches you have what you worked for and earned. James book calls into question that line of thinking.

Recently, hackers tried to obtain information from our website so some sensitive information may be limited for security reasons.

Current important information is also shared during the start of our worship services with important announcements to keep members informed on the work of the church, youth programs, Bible studies, etc.

And, if you are interested in our financial status or want to read the minutes from our Council, ministries, or committees you will find copies of these reports on the north wall of the Fellowship Hall. Every month new documents are displayed so the information is current.

At the September Council meeting a discussion was held regarding the establishment of a Communications Committee to better serve both internal and external communications. Better communication will help everyone!

Important decisions from September 2024:

Below are important decisions from the September 2024 Council meeting:

A motion was approved for a 2025 youth mission trip at dates to be determined. The trip will be to the Blue Ridge Mountains, Rutherford City, North Carolina.

A motion was approved for a bulletin board honoring congregational members and their relatives who are currently serving in the military.

A motion was approved to replace church siding at a cost of \$13,380 plus a 10% contingency fund for unexpected problems.

The 2025 budget was reviewed with some minor changes being made. Approval of the budget was made by an email vote.

A brief discussion was held on establishing a Communications Committee to better serve both internal and external communications.



If you or a family member are currently serving in any branch of our armed forces, would you please let me know. I would like St. Mark to honor them and pray for them by making a photo gallery that we all can see at St. Mark. Once you tell me who they are and in what branch they serve, I will let you know how big of a picture I would like. Thank you and please thank them for their service.

Some Thoughts About Faith and Politics

I have always been kind of a political junkie. I have memories of watching political convention coverage with my dad as early as 1968. On election night in the year 2000, my wife went to bed around midnight and when she woke up around 6:00 a.m., I was still glued to the television. She shook her head and said, "Why are you still up?" And I said, "Because we

still don't have a president!" Unfortunately, I had to go to work that night. I was so tired that I probably talked about Abraham rowing the Ark across the Red Sea.

So, I follow politics. I read about politics. I have strong political ideas. And I usually enjoy the presidential election season. It's an opportunity for the nation to debate important issues which will affect all of us for many years to come. And it's an opportunity for each of us to exercise one of the most important freedoms that we have in this country – the freedom to vote for the candidate of our choice.

But then we come to the election of 2016. Many of you have asked me who I am going to vote for. I won't tell you in this article. All I will tell you is that I will vote - I will not give up that right. And I will vote for someone whom I do not wholeheartedly support. The candidates who are running are not the ones that I would have chosen. But they are all that we have. So, I will make a choice.

First, I will examine the candidates' positions on the political issues that are important to me as well as the social issues that are important to me. And then I will choose a candidate. I might have to hold my nose when I am in the ballot box, but I will choose. I will vote. And as I vote, I will remember three things:

1) God is bigger than politics.

No matter who wins the election this year, my first allegiance is always to my God. Politicians will sometimes let me down, but God will never let me down. Psalm 146:3 says, "Put not your trust in princes, in a son of man, in whom there is no salvation." This doesn't mean that we should never put any trust in our leaders. It simply means that our ultimate trust is in God alone. Politicians are human beings. They are sinners. They are not saviors. Our only unshakeable hope is in the cross of Christ.

"Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers (and sisters) dwell in unity." Psalm 133:1, ESV

2. It is our duty to pray for the next President.

Even if the person that I vote for is not elected. I will pray for the new President. If the new President has serious moral flaws, I will pray that God will change his/her heart. If the new President is pursuing harmful policies I will pray that God will give her/him the wisdom to change course. Paul says in Timothy 2:2 that we should pray "for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way." I will follow this godly advice from Paul.

3. We must never allow politics to divide the body of Christ.


Paul says in Ephesians 4:5-6 that as Christians, we have "one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all." As long as we are unified in our faith, and in agreement regarding the Word of God, we should not allow the political arguments of the world to tear us apart. We should be able to worship together, to serve together, and to share the Gospel together. In fact, when we display Christian unity, even in the midst of our political differences, we send a powerful message to the world. We tell the world that Jesus Christ means more to us than our party affiliations. And God is pleased. Psalm 133:1 says, "Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers (and sisters) dwell in unity."

Amen and Amen.

 We will be having a "called" fire drill for all 3 services in October so look forward to more <u>exciting</u> news and updates about that. Battalion Chief LT. Biggs from the LVFD will be here to assist us with and inform us about the drill.

- 2) In case you didn't know, we have currently 2 AED units on site (one in the Narthex and one upstairs in the Ed Center) and 4 First Aid kits (one near each AED unit plus one near the Nursery and one near the SS bulletin board downstairs in the Ed Center).
- 3) We recently had 5 members of St. Mark's "First Response" Team get recertified in their CPR/AED training. This team has been put together to help in an emergency before the professionals get on site. To be a member of this "First Response" Team, you need to be certified in both areas. We would love to have more members on this team <u>ESPECIALLY FROM THE</u> <u>SATURDAY NIGHT SERVICE!!</u> So if you would like to join, please let Mike or Tim know, and we'll sign you up for the class to be held in the fall. There are two parts to the training an online part and a hands-on part. A small fee is involved with getting certified, but our committee pays for most of the training.
- 4) If you have any interest in helping St. Mark stay safe and secure, please see Mike or Tim we'd welcome you with open arms to join our committee! There are no prerequisites in knowing anything about safety and security to be a member just the willingness to help. We usually meet on every other 4th Tuesday of the month but more often if needed. Thank you for thinking and praying about joining the team and/or our committee.



⁵ But while Peter was in prison, the church prayed very earnestly for him. ¹¹ When Peter came ^[a] to himself, he said, "Now I know for sure that the Lord has sent forth His angel and rescued me from the hand of Herod and from all ^[b] that the Jewish people were expecting." Acts 12: 5,7, 11-12.

Read the fourth chapter of the Book of Acts which records just one of those daring prayers and the nearly unbelievable events that followed a time of very bold prayers. Most of us pray that God will do something *to* us or *for* us. But God wants to do something *in* us and *through* us. Prayer changes our heart from being self-centered to being Christ centered and offering ourselves to be in God's service unto His Glory. That can be done only through our cooperation, through our yielding to God in receptive prayer, first in quietness and then in action. Remember His promises to Israel and Christians are contingent on being "strong and courageous!" "Be not afraid!" The great "I AM" is with us . "Do NOT be discouraged!"

So it was for Martin Luther on a dark early evening of April 16, 1521 at the Diet of Worms after a previous night of audacious prayers declaring ... "I am bound to the Scriptures I have quoted and my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and will not retract anything, it is neither safe nor right to go against conscience, I cannot do otherwise. Here I stand. God Help me. Amen." Christ was the center of His life and Martin had the courage to stand before the great political and Church authorities of his day knowing God was with Him.

Today we are amid a 500-year historical geo-political turning point. As one writer, Dr. John Seel, stated "we're not in an age of change, but a change of age."¹ Our world as we have known is changing, so profoundly that our histories going forward are going to be altered. Thinking of the fall Rome (475 AD) and Luther at the Diet of Worms.

The issues facing the church stem from wholesale changes of assumptions, global actors, and personal experiences. As a result an American culture once grounded in Christianity has shifted overtime from a neutral to a negative and now to outright hostile attitude toward Christian doctrines, values and morality. This hostility is not conscious or explicit, but implicit, not personal, but foundational, and not political but cultural.²

Thus, we must first seek God through prayer so know Him, to love Him, to trust Him, to abide in Him, then to ACT in His will as Joshua, Peter and Martin did, thus glorifying God and His works. So friends, keep praying 24/7 as we seek the Holy Spirit and His guidance for St. Mark Church, our leaders, our members, our families, our communities, our state of Illinois, our Nation, our current leaders, our candidates, our elections, our world. ¹² For our struggle is not against ^[a]flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual *forces* of wickedness in the heavenly *places*.³ intensifying spiritual warfare. Let's pray...

O Lord, I thank You that You can use ordinary people to accomplish extraordinary things. The source of the power is not from us, but from Your Holy Spirit.

May I not set my sights low, but expect great and wonderful things from You, even things I do not understand. Sometimes I am gripped with fear and insecurity, and these are the times when I have taken my eyes off You. I want to be faithful to the many opportunities You have given me so that I will learn to look to You for all things.

May I learn the wisdom of abiding in Christ as a branch abides in the vine, so that I will draw my life and impact from You instead of trying to create life on my own. In that light do not let my emotions be my guide, but your living Word and wise Christians so on the day I stand before you I will hear the words, "well done good and faithful servant."

I ask for Your Spirit to exhort, encourage, comfort, and teach me in the times when I embrace the wisdom of obedience, and even in the times when I stray from You.

Because following Christ is not really about inviting Him into our lives, but embracing His invitation into His life. In the name of Jesus. Amen and Amen³

Trained by Constant Practice

Everyone who lives on milk is unskilled in the word of righteousness, since he is a child. But solid food is for the mature, for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil (Hebrews 5:13–14 ESV).


The words above call on Christians to grow up. They were written to a church, perhaps in first century Jerusalem, whose members were facing persecution for their faith. Some were deserting the church and going back to their former ways.

At the core of their problem, the writer says, is their failure to move past the milk stage. Young Christians learn about repentance and faith in Christ and baptism and basic Christian teachings and church practices. That's a good starting point.

But God saves us from our sins through faith in Christ so that we will begin to feed on a more varied and nourishing diet. There is the meat of Bible study and weekly sermons. There is the bread of worship and communion with Christ. There is the constant practice of turning from sin and pursuing righteousness. There are the vegetables of living for God and others (our spouse, our children, our friends, our co-workers, the larger society) instead of serving ourselves.

At least such service can seem like vegetables. Over time, it becomes like dessert: we learn to delight in giving ourselves to Christ and his will for us, which is not to live self-indulgent lives but lives of caring, devotion, hospitality, generosity, and outreach.

As the passage above puts it, we have our "powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil." We are weaned from the milk of the ABCs of Christian faith and practice. We do more than simply attend church, as important as that is.



But what if I had not instantly recognized that copperhead? Good thing I had discernment!

As Christians, every day our powers of discernment can grow "by constant practice to distinguish good from evil." Led by God's Spirit and word, we can flourish on the solid food God provides.

Is your diet milk or meat? Not to sound dramatic here, but there are copperheads of testing and temptation lying in the dark ahead of every one of us. How are your powers of discernment? Are they being trained by constant practice?

The gospel invites us, not to sip from a cup that leaves a silly milk mustache, but to dine at a table of hearty fare that will satisfy our souls, benefit others, and glorify God.
