Why Christians Need to Vote

"This election is the most important election of your lifetime." We hear these words for every election. Whether it's presidential, senatorial, or at the local level, voting is vitally important. Bible-believing Christians can make a huge difference this fall and I encourage you to vote.

The contents of this article are based on information from WALLBUILDERS (<u>wallbuilders.com</u>). Being a statistics person, I found some of the election information to be very interesting! Do you know where you stand?

Noted pollster George Barna recently conducted a study to determine Christians' interest levels and viewpoints for the upcoming 2024 election. He interviewed 2,000 church-going, self-identified Christians. Below are a few notable highlights:

Most (57%) believe the outcome of the November 2024 election will make a big difference in their lives, while many of the rest (29%) say it will make only some difference.

Moral decline was identified by less than one-quarter of the churched Christians (23%) as a defining issue, while abortion on demand was supported by 42%.

On the list of issues, economic matters were identified as the top concern, especially in relation to inflation and the cost of living (67%); the economy, in general, (64%); immigration and boarder control (60%); crime, law and order (59%); unemployment and jobs (38%); and federal deficit and debt (33%). Another issue was addressing poverty and homelessness named by 43%.

Time Runs Out

Psalm 90:12

So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.

That Bible verse comes from a unique psalm, the only one written by Moses.

Moses understood that we only have so many days. He thought he was going to enter the Promised Land. After all, he led Israel out of Egypt and was their head for 40 years in the wilderness. But a temper tantrum brought his years of service to a close:

And Moses lifted up his hand and struck the rock with his staff twice, and water came out abundantly, and the congregation drank, and their livestock. ¹² And the LORD said to Moses and Aaron, "Because you did not believe in me, to uphold me as holy in the eyes of the people of Israel, therefore you shall not bring this assembly into the land that I have given them" (Numbers 20:11–12).

Moses' time ran out.

As I write this, I have just heard the names Pete Rose, Dikembe Mutombo, and Kris Kristofferson. Their time ran out, Mutombo at just age 58. Kris Kristofferson wrote a song with these haunting lyrics:

... Why me Lord, what have I ever done

To deserve even one
Of the pleasures I've known
Tell me Lord, what did I ever do
That was worth loving You
Or the kindness You've shown

... Lord help me Jesus, I've wasted it all

So help me Jesus, I know what I am Now that I know that I've needed you So Help me Jesus, my soul's in Your hand

When we are young, life seems endless. For a child in school, the days of December before Christmas break can seem like an eternity. When we get older, the words of an old song may echo in our head: "Wo-oh, what I want to know, where does the time go?" (Grateful Dead)

Jesus is the Son of God, risen from the dead, our Savior at the Father's right hand, interceding for us. But in his earthly days he was a teacher. "Disciple" means "pupil, learner." He taught his followers. He still does.

Let us learn from him, as we amble and angle toward Thanksgiving, and Advent. The apostle Paul teaches us to live "redeeming the time" (Colossians 4:5).

Christ died and rose to redeem our lives, past, present, and future. Through faith in him, learning from him, we discover how to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom.

That is timely counsel, however our future calendar turns out.

Abortion, the issue of choice for Kamala Harris, was the seventh-ranked issue, identified by 41% of churched Christians.

When Christians were asked if they prefer that their churches be more or less involved in the 2024 election than they had been in other recent elections, the answers were split. A plurality (42%) opted for the status quo, preferring the same involvement as in the past. The other half were evenly divided between saying they prefer their churches to be more involved (25%) or less involved (27%).

What are the voting trends among church-going Christians? 6 out of 10 vote in every election, 3 out of 10 vote inconsistently, and 1 out of 10 are not registered or do not vote.

The survey showed the likelihood of people of faith likely to vote in 2024 at 51%, unlikely to vote 49%. Why? According to the survey, 68% of Christians are not interested in politics and elections and 57% dislike all major candidates.

We as Christians can provide desperately needed leadership in our communities and in the nation at large. Christians are encouraged to be aware of the candidates and issues, to learn what the Bible says on issues confronting our nation, and encourage fellow Christians to vote.

Most of all, pray for all of our leaders, "all who are in authority, so that we may lead a tranquil and quiet life in all godliness and dignity." 1 Timothy 2:2.

Pray, be informed, and vote!



Who Is This Man?



Please... PRAY FOR NATIONAL REPENTENCE

Note: this petition continues after the election.

Nations like ours are set up so that, typically, we get the leaders we deserve. Elections reflect the cultural realities of a particular time and place. Biblically, we know that God is sovereign over leaders and nations.

In light of these two things, my prayer each election has long been that God is merciful, and that He will not give us what we deserve. Like Nehemiah and others from the Old Testament, it would be appropriate for us to pray for our nation with a posture of repentance.

Lord, these are dark and dangerous times for our country. Our politics is full of hate, and it's spilling over in how we think of and treat each other. And like any nation, we have guilt for the evil that we have done and permitted.

We have the blood of over 65 million unborn children on our hands. How do you even begin to atone for this? No political party is willing to defend the unborn, and some of those who speak up for them have even been imprisoned. We can only appeal to your mercy and pray for an end to the slaughter of innocents.

We have dismantled your design for marriage and sexuality and given in to a spirit of confusion over simple biological facts. We are engaged in a destructive project to do the impossible and transition people from one sex to another, and more victims will pay the price for our folly.

We have deep injustices in our criminal justice system against the marginalized and politically disfavored, resulting in many false convictions and plea deals done by the innocent to end their ordeal. In this way we have corrupted justice in violation of your commands to judge with truth.

We have made idols out of our possessions, out of sex, out of ourselves, out of politics, out of our nation, and out of the government, and we have viciously attacked anyone who questions our false gods. We treat them as heretics to be despised and hated.

We hate and malign our political opponents, forgetting that they too are made in your image and forgetting Jesus' teaching that to hold another in contempt is the equivalent of murder, an attack on the image of God and thus on God himself.

May we as your people resist the temptation to hate, to insult, to lash out. May we love our enemies and pray for those who insult or persecute us. May we be peacemakers.

May our allegiance be first and foremost to your Kingdom of righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit. May we live by Jesus' teachings and the values of the Kingdom as agents of reconciliation and shalom in a world that desperately needs them. May your priorities be our priorities over party, tribe, or faction. May we seek first your Kingdom and your righteousness, working for your justice in the world but especially for your rule over all areas of life. May we be disciple-makers in accordance with your final command to us.

May we live by the law of love—not the kind of sentimental love our culture promotes—but love that seeks the ultimate good of all persons, not their temporary satisfaction. May we love people enough to speak the truth with compassion and gentleness. May we care more about their wellbeing here and in eternity than about what they think of us.

Politically, the issues we are facing are many and complicated, and no party stands for your Kingdom in all areas. May we affirm and support what is good: the right to life, liberty of conscience, our fundamental freedoms, equal justice under law, government that carries out its responsibilities before you but stays out of things beyond its legitimate authority. May we oppose what is evil: infanticide, abuse of all sorts, injustice, and dehumanizing rhetoric from all sides. And above all, may we put our hope in you, not in the election or defeat of candidates or parties.

We pray against the demonic forces driving these and other evils in our society and the increasingly overt embrace of the occult among cultural elites.

Lord, you and you alone determine the rise and fall of nations. Only your Kingdom lasts forever. If this is the time when we will see the decline of our nation, keep us from despair, remembering that our citizenship is in Heaven from which we await our Savior, Jesus Christ our Lord. Your promises remain unchanged, and whatever happens, we know you are true. Our hope is in you, not in politicians, parties, laws, or constitutions. We commit our nation into your hands, and by your grace we will live in faith, hope, and love, whatever happens.

We ask all this in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, Amen.¹

Fin Facts

Did you know?

As of September 30th St. Mark had \$477,530 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in the contingency account. The cash balance has increased over last month. Instead of the anticipated loss of (\$63,269) in the budget through the end of September, the church has a gain of \$72,270 through the first nine months of the fiscal year in spite of an average \$8,785 per month decline in budgeted general tithing. The gain is due to staff vacancies and careful spending.

At the 2023 Annual Meeting the Congregation stepped out in faith and approved an anticipated loss of \$35,850 for this fiscal year. A gain of \$14,900 is now anticipated if we meet holiday giving projections.




