MISSOURI MUSINGS

South Africa Update

On a regular basis, St. Mark contributes to pastoral training in South Africa. Former St. Mark Pastor Bill Shields and I travel there each October for seven days of intense activity.

On October 13, we began our approximately 14th pastor's conference at the Simonsberg Christian Conference Centre, Stellenbosch. The sessions ran from 7 AM till 9 PM (14 hour days: they're serious over there!). About 60 pastors and lay leaders attended. Our theme was "Heavenly Grace in an Unheavenly World." Before, between, and after sessions, conversation was, of course, non-stop.

On Wednesday, October 16, we ended the conference and flew 800 miles to Johannesburg.

On Thursday I spoke all day (10 AM–4 PM) at Trinity Presbyterian Church, Pretoria, on "The Battle for the Bible and the Care of Souls." There was an attentive audience of about 50. On that same Thursday Pastor Shields was at Johannesburg Bible College speaking on 2 Timothy to ministry students.

In all these conferences, we build on ten years of labor in Cape Town and Johannesburg-Pretoria. That history of connection and longer-term friendship provides a fruitful atmosphere for exchange, application, and mutual understanding.

Throughout the 10 days of travel and labor, I was most grateful for the support and prayers of St. Mark. Some areas where we felt answered prayer:

- 1. There were travel complications, but by God's grace we surmounted them.
- 2. I preached or taught 17 times in seven days. Pastor Shields was also taxed to the max. Some of our sessions lasted for 90 minutes. On two of the days I spoke for over five hours. Would our voices hold up? We credit your prayers for no impediments or restrictions.
- 3. Our wives back in the US experienced no crises in our absence.
- 4. "Jet lag" was non-existent on both ends of the trip. Good thing: Bill arrived back on a Saturday evening and preached the next morning. That's not easy with a seven-hour time adjustment.

This is my 35th year of overseas ministry. It is never easy but never grows old, even though I do (grow old), and nothing in this world lasts forever, I am aware. But church growth in Africa has exploded, and the need for pastoral teaching and encouragement is immense. It is a privilege to be part of the harvest that God is bringing about. And it is a double blessing to share God's word on the wings of your prayers.

And so, Pastor Shields and I thank God. And we thank you, the body of Christ whom we represent!


If you aren't done with your Christmas shopping, we have some beautiful handmade items made by in country artisans. (Christmas Items On Line or In Our Store)




True Community

Did you know?

As of October 31st St. Mark had \$437,859 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in the contingency account. The cash balance has decreased over last month. Instead of the anticipated loss of (\$63,269) in the budget through the end of October, the church has a gain of \$92,325 through the first ten months of the fiscal year, in spite of an average \$8,185 per month decline in budgeted general tithing. The gain is due to staff vacancies, a government pandemic subsidy of over \$19,000, and careful spending.

At the 2023 Annual Meeting the Congregation stepped out in faith and approved an anticipated loss of \$35,850 for this fiscal year. A gain of over \$50,000 is now anticipated if we meet holiday giving projections.


