Confession, Petition, Vision (Being, Listening, Doing)

How thankful we can be that we can enter into three days of prayers with our brothers and sisters in Christ who are also part of LCMC congregations around the country and around the globe!

C- Confession - I am Sorry Praying for Ourselves

It is wise to form the habit of inviting God to search our hearts and reveal "any hurtful way" (Psalm 139:23) within ourselves. Sustained attention to the heart, the wellspring of action, is essential to the spiritual formation process.

Allowing Jesus to examine our intentions and priorities, we open ourselves to His good but often uncomfortable work of exposing sins. ¹ Self-examining prayer and/or journaling in God's presence over time helps us get past our emotions and actions.

This practice uncovers sinful patterns which require repentance and renewal. Note: this a process of working out our salvation by making us more "Christ-Like" or conforming to His image.

What does this look like?

• Repentance: ask 1) God to reveal your sins, 2) ask forgiveness for your sins and 3) ask for God's help to change your sinful ways (renewal).

Search me, O God, and know my heart; Try me and know my anxious thoughts; And see if there be any hurtful way in me, And lead me in the everlasting way.

Psalm 139:23-24

To assist you, here is a prayer sequence for examination and encouragement that incorporates The Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, the Beatitudes, the seven deadly sins, the four cardinal and three theological virtues, and the fruit of the Spirit. This can serve as a kind of spiritual diagnostic too. ² See the Appendix for Day 1 Confession



P - Petition- I ask Prayer Points for Myself and Our Church

As God shapes us to be more Christ like, whatever circumstance He allows in our lives are for our good, even though they may not seem so at the time. (Romans 12:2; Romans 8:28-29) This eternal perspective can change the way we pray. Rather than asking God to change our circumstances to suit us, we can ask Him to use our circumstances to change us. Do you not know we are spiritual beings? Do you not know we should receive each day with gratitude from God's hand for it prepares us for our glorious and eternal destiny in his presence.³

Call Committee. Our petition for our new pastor:

Dear Heavenly Father, We come before you with humble hearts seeking wisdom for St. Mark's future Pastor. Grant the call committee discernment, endurance, and insight on your plan. Help us, as one body of Christ, to work together and according to Your will. Guide the heart of this chosen person to know without a doubt. St. Mark is their new church home. We thank you for your goodness, love, mercy and perfect timing. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.

From the desire of being approved - Deliver me Jesus;

From the desire of suffering rebukes - Deliver me Jesus; From the desire of being humiliated - Deliver me Jesus; rom the desire of being forgotten - Deliver me Jesus; From the desire of being ridiculed - Deliver me Jesus; From the desire of being wrong - Deliver me Jesus; From the desire of being suspected - Deliver me Jesus;

Response - Grant me the grace to desire it.

That others may be loved more than I - Grant me the grace to desire it. That others may be esteemed more than I - Grant me the grace to desire it. That in the opinion of the world others may increase, I may decrease - Grant me the grace to desire it.

That others may be chosen and I set aside - Grant me the grace to desire it.
