


Living into our Mission and Vision

MISSOURI MUSINGS

Happy Endings

Pastor Breum used to say that for a Christian, all of our best days lie ahead of us.

I believe that. I believed it when I first began to attend St. Mark around the year 2001. Now, a quarter century later, I believe it even more. Our best days lie ahead of us because we have the sure hope of everlasting life. Jesus died on the cross for our sins and defeated death in his resurrection. He ascended into heaven, from whence we await his return.

Death, for the Christian, is not termination but transition. Death is not perishing: it is promotion. "This day you shall be with me in paradise," Jesus told the thief on the cross who believed in him. To be absent from the body, for the believer, is to be present with the Lord.

Whatever the course of our life, for the Christian believer, we await a happy ending. "He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away" (Rev. 21:4 ESV).

Because we have this hope, when good things come to an end in life, we entrust God with what was and is now past. We look for him to bless what is to come.

Through life's ups and downs, God's promises and faithfulness bear us up. Serving him, knowing him, worshiping him, sharing him with others, gives us purpose. Our lives, however difficult, have meaning. As the Heidelberg Catechism puts it, "He also watches over me in such a way that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven. In fact, all things must work together for my salvation."

In this mortal life, all things, including all good things, must come to end. But even the very best things pale beside the future God has promised to his people.

With this consolation, I face the ending of this column, Missouri Musings. I have written over 150 columns--a small book!--since I began in March 2011. Thank you for reading. My association with St. Mark is the longest and most significant of any church in my life. My younger son Micah was confirmed at St. Mark. Our family attended regularly from 2001 until we moved away in 2010.

In those years 2001–2010, some of you remember that I taught in the Education Center many Sunday mornings. I preached (all three services) one weekend a month (and always on Palm Sunday). I gave many children's sermons (one of my favorite things). I performed a wedding for Pastor Breum when tragedy required him to be away. In 2023 I was privileged to lead a Confirmation service.

Just two months ago, I met with many of you to remember, to grieve, and to celebrate the homegoing of Ed Gray.

Since 2010, I have preached at least four times a year at St. Mark. Over the years we have shared somber events like 9/11, the wonderful ministry of Pastor Shields, the move from the ELCA to LCMC, and the joys of hundreds of Sundays of worship. There have been many deep friendships. Since 2010, on my St. Mark preaching weekends, I was hosted by Lou and Bonnie Korom until Lou's death. Since then, the Dorans and the Bolanders have kindly opened their homes.

Sharon Schranz and Debbie Zuchowski deserve special recognition for their kindnesses as church administrators over many years when they often had to cut me slack. I have benefited from the wisdom and friendship of many council presidents, most recently Joni Wasmund and Cliff Ewert.

As St. Mark transitions from II Pastor Abend's skillful interim guidance to a new permanent pastor, and as the church approaches 2030, it will no longer be the church I first knew back almost into the 1990s. When I started attending St. Mark at Pastor Breum's invitation, I was in my 40s. Now I am in my 70s. My time of writing Missouri Musings, and my time of regular preaching at St. Mark, have ended.

- > Council approved Robin Korom as Council Vice President for 2025.
- > Council approved honorarium schedules for Ordained and Non-ordained ministers who serve as substitutes at church services.
- Council approved an extension of Intentional Interim Pastor Steve Abend's contract with St. Mark to June 1, 2025.
- > Council approved Brock Millsop as a new member of the Finance Ministry Team.
- > Council approved allocating \$1,000 for a Random Acts of Kindness youth event.
- > Council learned of marketing opportunities that St. Mark has with the local Chamber of Commerce, with thanks to Kurt Ulbricht for his work on this.

- > Council approved sponsorship of BiG Great Lakes in the amount of \$2,500 and a donation to STAR for \$2,500 from the Council's Discretionary Benevolence Fund.

ushering, offering, communion, readings, and greeting too.



30 DAYS OF PRAYER for the MUSLIM WORLD.

In April 1992, a group of Christians from a global missions organisation gathered by the Red Sea in the Middle East. Ramadan had just ended. Praying together, this group of men and women felt that God was directing them to pay more attention to His love for the Muslim world. Those involved in the meeting describe the revelation as a clear message, calling them to embrace the Muslim world in all its diversity, seeing Muslims as God does - as His beloved creation. They committed to obey this word, beginning with a time of 30 days of focused prayer and fasting for the Muslim world.

Every time that Ramadan has occurred since then, a prayer guide has been created to help Christians pray for Muslims during the 30 days of the fast. The guide focuses on blessing Muslim people and helping Christians have greater understanding of, and love for, Muslims around the world. Christians from many nations get involved in the production, sharing the needs of local Muslim communities and stories to inspire prayer. Distributors in many nations translate and share the guide in over 40 languages, creating a global prayer movement unlike any other with many hundreds of thousands participating in prayer every year.

If you are using this prayer guide, you know that God works together with us through prayer, and you can see the fruit of over 30 years of faithful intercession. Your participation, prayers, and pursuit of a word spoken 30 years ago have changed the world forever.

Knowing the Importance of Prayer in God's Eternal Work... Building up St. Mark Church through prayer during Lent

"When you call on me, when you come and pray to me, I'll listen. Jeremiah 29:12

Join in Fellowship to seek God's blessing for St. Mark Church to:

- Continue be a House of Prayer, and
- Faithfully engaging in the Great Commission.

<u>First</u> note for a believing church to be engaged in God's eternal work of salvation, restoration, and building up the body of Christ, there are three requirements of the congregation.

- Realizing God's work through St. Mark Church can be achieved, if we seek to be energized by the Holy Spirit.
- Praying with prayers of faith to engage God's heart by seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance and giving glory to God for the answered prayers.
- Understanding God's ordained accomplishments for St. Mark Church will be attained, when we as a congregation *depend* on the Holy Spirit and each member *willingly exercise* their Spirit's gifts. ¹

<u>Second</u> find a small group, a prayer partner, your family, your spouse. Thus fulfilling our call to Lenten prayers of sharing and listening to each other and the Holy Spirit.

Third pray for a least 10-15 minutes to cover a St. Mark worship service in prayer, note suggested guidelines below*, but as always follow the prompting of the Holy Spirit.

*In this season of Lent join your St. Mark family in a time of focused prayer before and during weekend and midweek worship services to:

- Repent of our sins, individual and corporate (St. Mark Church); Matthew 4:17
- Ask the Holy Spirit for revival within and beyond St. Mark Church by; Mark 16:15-20
 - o the preaching at St. Mark church,
 - o conversions by the power of Holy Spirit at St. Mark.
- Ask the Holy Spirit for St. Mark Church to continue reformation for all believers; Matthew 28:18-20
 - o practical training and teaching for our soul forming Christian journey,
 - transformation of St. Mark minds shifting from a temporal to an eternal perspective,
 - making disciples.
- Ask the Holy Spirit for St. Mark to be a church of restoration; 1 Corinthians 13:11
 - o nurturing future pastors to live and teach the Gospel,
 - asking the Holy Spirit to embolden each of our St. Mark family to develop new relationships within their own neighborhoods, schools, work,
 - o sharing personal stories of the Christian life at St. Mark,
 - serving community needs through St. Mark based services.
- Conclude with prayers of praise and thanksgiving to the Trinity.

Did you know?

As of January 31st St. Mark had \$437,358 in checking and savings accounts as well as \$60,000 in the contingency account. The cash balance has increased over the last month by \$7,173. Preliminary financial statements indicate a gain of \$7,0010 for the first month of the fiscal year. Offerings exceeded budget by \$1,826.



We need 60 volunteers for this event.




