St. Mark! We are blessed! There is a lot going on at St. Mark and Council has been busy. While I'll provide updates on the two most active initiatives below, I wanted to recognize that I have not provided a recent update on some of the more difficult issues that we have faced in the past, in large part because there has not been anything to update. Justice is sometimes slow. That said, though, I am targeting the end of June to have a few forums (afternoon and evening) to provide current updates that I have at that time. Please watch for the weekly announcements for dates. Meantime, anyone that has a question, can always reach out to me directly.

In the past few years, even before our transition period with Pastor Steve, we heard a lot about how we can do things differently and better. One of those things was a simpler operating structure that took out layers of management that would allow the Congregation and its Ministry Teams to accomplish things more easily.

In June 2024, I joined a team consisting of Jerry Gass, Laurie Kerns, and Intentional Interim Pastor Steve, to start work on a new Constitution and Bylaws. This team did a great job in preparing a draft of both and submitted them to Council in April 2025. On May 2nd and 3rd, Council had a retreat focusing on fellowship, worship and reviewing the draft Constitution and Bylaws. It was a great success. At our May Council meetings there were some additional suggestions and revisions, and it is the hope of Council that this draft will be approved in June and then brought to the Congregation for additional vetting.

## St. Mark Council News

To keep you better informed about Church Council decisions, please go to <a href="https://smlc.info/minutes/">https://smlc.info/minutes/</a> for Council and Committee minutes.

Below are important decisions from the May 2025 Council meeting:

- Council approval of Interim Pastor contract and pay for period from July 1, 2025, to January 31, 2026. Negotiations to proceed to finalize agreement.
- Council extended authority to Council President to attempt resolution of contract issue with Stratus Cleaning Solutions.
- Council approved benevolence contribution of \$500 per month for three months to RIMI to support mission work of Surgit Digal requiring a Missionary Action Plan and a Voice Article in August.
- Council approved the 2025 Pre-Approved Vendor List.
- > Council is finalizing a draft of the new Constitution and Bylaws for congregational vetting. While originally planned for May and June, this will be pushed back to August.

#### President's Message, Continued from page 1

You might recall from my May Voice article that my hope was that we could have the new Constitution in place by August. This was a very ambitious goal and while this would be ideal, it is not realistic. The better approach is more deliberate, allowing the congregation time to absorb and provide comment before final approval and implementation. The goal now is approval and implementation at the November Congregational meeting. This will allow more time to review and meet on these important changes. During the summer, there will be additional communications regarding the changes, and we will have forums to allow for congregational comments. More to come on that.

I also want to provide an update on our Mission and Vision Teams. Recall the Transition Team provided four ministry opportunities: Women's Fellowship, Community Meal, Youth and Family Ministry Development, and Movie Night. Sign up for the teams started in early May through the end of the month. Then, depending on the responses, kick-off meetings will be set for the Team Volunteers to develop and implement these ministries. Updates will be provided to the congregation in June.

As summer approaches, I hope that all of you have time to enjoy the weather and summer adventures. Summer at St. Mark will be exciting, and we want you to be part of it. There are plenty of things happening at St. Mark! VBS, Rummage Sale, and Gardening to name a few – please participate and volunteer for these wonderful opportunities.

### Considering the Spiritual Discipline of Prayer Disciplines are never ends in themselves, but a means to an end.

Where does one start with the discipline of prayer? You. Who you are is how you pray. Why does one pray?

- Prayer enhances our fellowship and intimacy with God (Psalm 116:1-2; Jeremiah 33:2-3).
- The Scriptures command us to pray (Luke 18:1; Ephesians 6:18; 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18; 1 Timothy 2:1).
- When we pray, we follow the example of Christ and other great people in Scripture like Moses and Elijah (Mark 1:35; Numbers 11:2; 1 Kings 18:36-37).
- Prayer appropriates God's power for our lives (John 15:5; Acts 4:31; Ephesians 3:16; Colossians 4:2-4).
- We receive special help from God when we pray (Hebrews 4:16).
- Prayer makes a genuine difference (Luke 11:9-1; James 5:16-18). "When I pray, coincidences happen, when I don't, they don't," attributed to William Temple.
- Prayer develops our understanding and knowledge of God (Psalms 37:3-6; 63:1-8; Ephesians 1:16-19).
- Our prayers and God's answers give us joy and peace in our hearts (John 16:23-24; Philippians 4:6-7). Our problems may not disappear, but in prayer we gain a new perspective on our problems along with the peace and patience to stand firm.
- Prayer helps understand and accomplish God's purposes for our lives (Colossians 1:9-11).

Prayer changes our attitudes and desires (2 Corinthians 12:7-9). How does one pray?

The Lord's Prayer is a model revealing the eight forms of prayer. Strive for a balanced diet in prayer; we are usually short on adoration and thanksgiving.

- Adoration praise for who God is; thanksgiving praise for what He has done.
- Affirmation agreeing with God's will and submitting to it.
- Supplication making requests for ourselves (petition) and for others (intercession).
- Confession our need for forgiveness.
- Renewal as we face the temptations of the world, the flesh, and the devil. Set my mind on things of the Spirit.
- Closing Prayer that honors the Lord and completes our thoughts.<sup>2</sup>

## ST. MARK ANNUAL RUMMAGE SALE July 31st, August 1st & 2nd

The Annual St. Mark Rummage Sale is only 2 months away. Time to stop procrastinating and start cleaning out those closets, basements and garages and packing up your great treasures to donate to the sale.

Before I tell you all the details for this year's sale I'm going to try to answer some questions I get every year.

- 1. Why do we only let members help set up? Although it is always nice to have extra help, we have learned that people who are not members are usually volunteering to help so they can pre-shop. They do more shopping than helping and we don't have time to supervise people we do not know. Many are resellers who just want to get the best items first. Although this would make us money for a couple years, if all the good items are gone before we opened the sale shoppers would stop coming in the large numbers they do now because we wouldn't have the great treasures they expect from us each year. Also our volunteers are so awesome we have never opened a sale without everything done.
- 2. Why do we have a "Do Not Accept List"? Over the years we have found certain items just do not sell. If we accepted them they just take up time and space and then we have to dispose of them at the end of the sale. They are not worth our time.
- 3. Why do we not raise our prices? Although many of our items may be worth more than we charge we have found we make money on volume sales. Also because we have low prices more people shop our sale. We make money and the community gets great bargains. Last year we made \$27,000 so we feel our prices are good. This year our goal is \$30,000 so start cleaning!
- 4. Why don't we collect all year? First we don't have the storage space. Second if we collected all year we wouldn't have room to set everything up. Just collecting for one month fills every inch of space we have.
- 5. Why don't we have a room with more expensive items for sale? We would love to do this but that would mean extra cashiers to man that room. If anyone would be willing to sit in that room from 9-8 for 3 days that would be great.
- 6. This is one of our most asked questions. Why do we give our leftovers to Goodwill? Many people don't like Goodwill because it is a for profit organization. We like it because, except for furniture, they take everything. They drop off a semi -truck and we just fill it up. By the time the sale is over our volunteers are exhausted. Easy clean up is needed. Many places will take our items but we have to deliver to them. Most of our pick up crew is over 65 and they do not need to be moving things all over. I always tell people if they would like to take items somewhere right after the sale or if they know of a group that picks up items let me know. We do have the Veteran's Closet that picks up items, Kindred Life parents who are invited to shop for free and last year we gave all our leftover shoes to the group Mike Mol collects for.

I hope this helps you understand how we run the sale. Now for the important news. Rummage schedule....... June 30th... Rummage collection starts. July 7th...Ed Center set up begins. Days and times will be on the sign up poster. July 20th... Donations in main building are moved to set up areas. July 21st...Main building set up begins. July 31st, August 1st & August 2nd...Sale days! All hands on deck August 2nd...Clean up after sale. Many hands make quick work. Everyone is welcome to come and help. We have volunteers of all ages. My grandkids grew up helping and still come each year. It is a great way to meet other members you may otherwise never see. We are a fun welcoming group of men, women and kids. It's a rummage sale, so you really can't make mistakes. We cant wait to see new faces this year, so come join us for fun, fellowship and yes...work. If you are willing to help with pickups let me know. Younger bodies are needed. See you in July. Questions or to schedule pickups call Laurie Kerns.

These are many of the items we do not accept. TVs, large appliances, microwaves, pianos, organs, large exercise equipment, artificial Christmas trees, chandeliers, chemicals, house paint, building supplies, china cabinets, large desks, large glass top tables, mattresses or box springs, large mirrors without frames, oversized couches, magazines, encyclopedias, computers, used make up or beauty supplies and any broken or unusable items. If you would throw it away so will we. A full list of unacceptable items will be available in July.






#### The Power of Praying for Your Adult Children


