

The month kicked off with an additional worship option on the first Sunday of August where we partnered with Faith First Church from Genoa City for outdoor worship. How inspiring. We will continue to do this every first Sunday of the month through November.

The Finance Team and Trustees finalized a proposed 2026 draft budget and Council approved it at the August meeting. The 2026 budget needs all of you to prayerfully consider increasing your giving as we are seeking to add a part time Youth and Family Ministry Director and a Worship Technology Coordinator. These are positions where we need focused leadership.

The Elders, serving as the Nominating Committee, announced that nominations for Council positions are now open. One-year terms open for nomination include President, Treasurer and Secretary. Three-year terms open for nomination include Property and Management Liaison and Parish Education Liaison. Please prayerfully consider serving.

As a result of our Living into Our Mission and Vision Forum back in February, I am happy to report that our new Women's Fellowship ministry, The LIGHT of St. Mark! (Ladies in God's Holy Truth) is seeking opportunities for its first fellowship event. More LIGHT to come...

Our Constitution and Bylaws have undergone Congregational vetting at forums held August 13 and 21. Thank you to all who attended and prayed for the success of these meetings. The discussion we had was excellent and insightful. The Constitution Team is preparing the final drafts of the Constitution and Bylaws to seek Council approval prior to a Congregational vote.

We have learned from over 30 years doing the Rummage Sale that nothing is impossible when God is on your side. So earlier this year when our Rummage Team met and we decided to ask Him to help us reach the crazy goal of \$30,000 we should have had no doubts. We also should have known He has his own way of doing things. It started with us being offered almost a whole house worth of treasures 2 months before collection began. Normally we would have said no

but something, or should I say someone, prompted us to say yes. This was the beginning of the many, many trips our awesome pickup team made. The treasures from this house were great, many being brand new and still in the box. It also was our first \$1,000 made as we presold some of the furniture.

When we actually started our collecting the donations kept rolling in. Our congregation and community really supported our sale. Then the fun began. We spent the next 4 weeks working with the best group of people ever to set up what we all say is definitely our best sale ever. They priced, unpacked, hung, folded, displayed, sold and then repacked and put on the truck everything that didn't sell. During the sale they helped the hundreds of shoppers find great treasures and bring them to their cars all with a smile and friendly words.



The saying goes it takes a village, well for us it took a church. By my count we had 96 people working on the sale from start to finish. Fifteen of those were first time rummage workers who I think will all be back next year. It was a lot of work, but we also had a lot of fun. There are so many I want to thank and, hopefully, I will be able to do that in person. Each and every one of you are loved and appreciated and this sale could not happen without you.

Rest up as next year will be here before we know it. And yes we made our goal..God is Good..with the help of a loving donation our total to date is \$34,215!!! And just so you know our goal for next year is just to survive the sale! Most of our workers are of the very mature age (I try not to say old) and we might have to fight over who gets to use the donated walkers!

Considering the Spiritual Discipline of Prayer



Solitude, Silence and the art of Silencing the Soul

In the 2025 August *The Voice* I pointed out the necessity of a structured time in a prayer closet facilitating the discipline of prayer. Why? This space provides for two additional disciplines, solitude, and silence setting the stage for one to listen for the whispers of the Holy Spirit. Solitude is moving away for a time from the lures and aspirations of the world, from the influence of peers and society, and into God's presence. It was an indispensable practice in the life of the Lord

Jesus. (see Matthew 14:23, Mark 1:35). "Solitude transcends loneliness; whenever Jesus sought solitude, it was to be in the presence of the Father." ²

Silence facilitates solitude. "it prepares the way for inner seclusion and enables us to listen to the soft voice of the Spirit." It involves the quieting of noises of our surroundings. Both practices of solitude and silence are fundamental, helping us to become more authentic people. Psalm 107:9 tells us God satisfies the thirsty and the hungry, filling them with what is good. "The problem isn't God's refusal to speak, but our refusal or inability to get quiet enough to hear. Silencing the soul is a learned art. The psalmist David spoke of this. 'Surely I have composed and quieted my soul; like a weaned child rests against his mother' (Psalm 131:2). When we quiet the soul, we can hear His voice in our hearts." In doing so we redefine ourselves in terms of what God thinks rather than what people think. As well as who we are in Christ instead of our own false self-image.⁴

<u>Exercise</u>: Find a moment, now or later for solitude. Spend 15 minutes simple sitting and enjoying God's presence. (Sitting next to you; take a walk with Him early morning or at dusk.)

Exercise: The next time you pray or read God's Word,

- take 3-4 deep breathes in and exhale slowly,
- second ask God to direct your prayers, thoughts and to set the agenda of your time together,
- take five to ten minutes of sitting in "quietness and trust" (Isaiah 30:15) before Him,
- when you mind wanders, picture yourself sitting quietly next to Him, listen,
- don't rush into your thoughts and requests,
- close with prayers of praise, gratitude and thanksgiving.

Vital - Make a daily appointment to be in the presence of your Father God. In 40 days it will be a fruitful habit. Seek the Holy Spirit's help to show up each day.

Two FMSC Updates!!

First – if you get this soon enough, our next packing event is TUESDAY, (YES - TUESDAY) night, September 2nd, at 7 in Libertyville. We usually pack on Monday nights, but because of Labor Day, FMSC will be closed that day. If you can make it this Tuesday night, here is the link to sign up (TUESDAY, Sept 2, at 7). If you can't make it to this one, our next packing day will be Saturday, October 4th, at 9 in the morning and here is the link to sign up for that day (Saturday, Oct 4th, at 9). If you haven't seen in the Fellowship Hall, St. Mark has helped pack 142,416 meals – that comes out to feeding 390 kids a meal a day for a year!!!



Second – another way to help is to look on your calendars and see if you could help pack at <u>Hope Filled Holidays</u> at Pathway Church in Arlington Heights on December 11 – 14. This is what FMSC calls a Mobile Pack. In those four days they "only" want to pack over 850,000 meals!!! Open registration starts in mid-October so please consider joining <u>a lot</u> of people feeding

starving kids. (FYI - the church is about 40 minutes south of St. Mark.)

MISSION TRIP 2025

We are back!! After safely - thank you God - putting 1935.6 miles on the van, Ayla Appelt, Avina Doty, Abbey Johnson, Leah Koslosky, Erin Pasdiora, Joey Reimer, Lori & Jeff McKenzie, and myself have memories (and some pictures) of a very worthwhile and eye-opening mission trip to Spindale, NC.


Spindale is a town of about 5000 people that is about 10 miles off the South Carolina boarder. It had 4 big factories close about 20 to 25 years ago and it still hasn't recovered. Rutherford County, where Spindale is located, is one of the poorest counties in NC. We went down there thinking we would be doing Hurricane Helena relief, but the town and area needed just plain help!

The 9 of us were split into 3 groups – the Tree Huggers (Jeff's group), the Mountaineers (Lori's group), and the Pathfinders (my group) – and then mixed together with 3 other church groups. One was from a church in Yorkville, IL, one from Walworth, WI, and one from my hometown of Elkhorn, WI!! Each group had different "missions" to do each day that ranged from weeding a community garden, helping the Salvation Army, working at a monastery, making a hiking trail, cleaning, painting, and organizing at a couple of different thrift shops, and handing out food at a drive-up food pantry.

In Spindale, even though they are going through some rough times, we saw the beauty of God all around us. Being in the heart of the Blue Ridge Mountains, we saw His handy work almost every day. On the way down and on the way back, driving through Great Smoky Mountains National Park or Daniel Boone National Forest, we witnessed first-hand the wonders of His works. If you are ever visiting Lexington, KY, we highly recommend going through the Nada Tunnel on the way to the Sky Bridge Trail, or if you are in the Knoxville, TN, area, make a day trip to see Cades Cove.

I hope you had a chance to see our presentation during the service on August 17th. If not, please talk to any of the mission trippers and ask them about their experiences. Personally, I'd like to thank Lori and Jeff for putting up with me and helping as much as they did - they were wonderful. I'd like to thank the kids (and their parents for trusting me and letting them go on the trip) for an awesome trip – you were fantastic. But I truly need to thank you St. Mark for all your support - financially and spiritually. We couldn't have done it without you. God is good all the time and all the time, God is good!!
