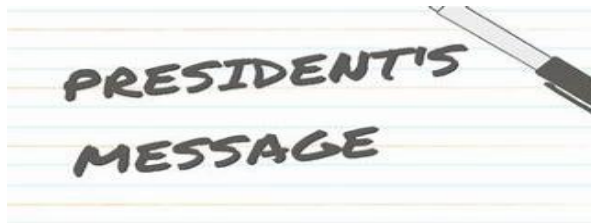

Below are important decisions from the November Council meeting:

Council approved the use of SVL Productions to assist in relocating video equipment, and to update some of our audio and media capabilities to ensure an enhanced online worship experience.

Our local staff will translate your letter and deliver it to the child you support. Sponsored children often keep their sponsors' photos and letters in their homes as treasured possessions. You may write to the child you sponsor as often as you like. When you write, your sponsored child will benefit from knowing that someone across the world really cares. Your words of encouragement will help them see that they matter and give them hope for the future.

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self control. Against such things there is no law.

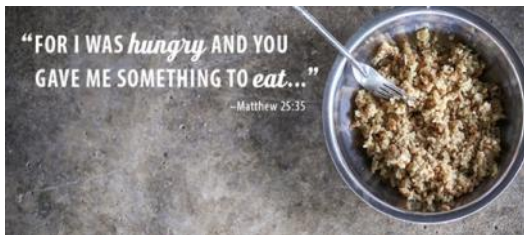
The Call Committee

Two (or 3) FMSC Updates!!

First – if you get this soon enough, our next packing event is Saturday, December 6th, at 8:45 am. Our next packing day after that will be Monday, January 5th at 7:00 PM. And then, the next one

after that is Saturday, February 7th, at 8:45 am.

Second – another way to help is to look on your calendars and see if you could help pack at Hope Filled Holidays at Pathway Church in Arlington Heights on December 11 – 14. This is what FMSC calls a Mobile Pack. In those four days they “*only*” want to pack over 850,000 meals!!! Open registration has started so please consider joining a lot of people feeding starving kids. St. Mark will be a sponsor of this event. (FYI - the church is about 40 minutes south of St. Mark.)

If you haven't seen in the Fellowship Hall, since St. Mark started helping out as a church group, we have helped pack 175,032 meals - that comes out to feeding 480 kids a meal a day for a year!!

Also – through your wonderful generosity and love of sharing the Good News, St. Mark has given away – for free – over 1500 Bibles at FMSC!!!!

IN OTHER NEWS --- we have installed a safety fire blanket in the sanctuary to be used in case of emergencies. This blanket can be put on top of a fire or wrapped around a person who is on fire to help extinguish the flames. The blanket is on the south wall, opposite the organ, near the staircase.

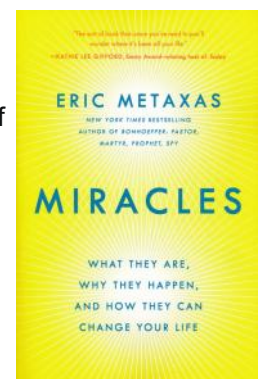

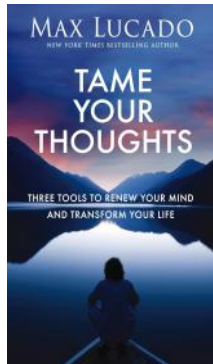

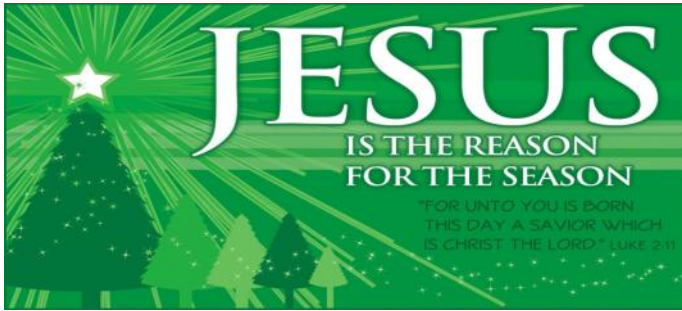


Bear one another's burdens

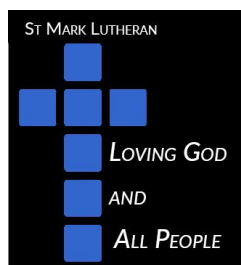
