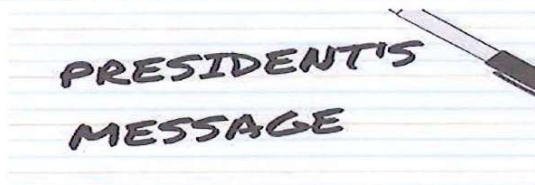

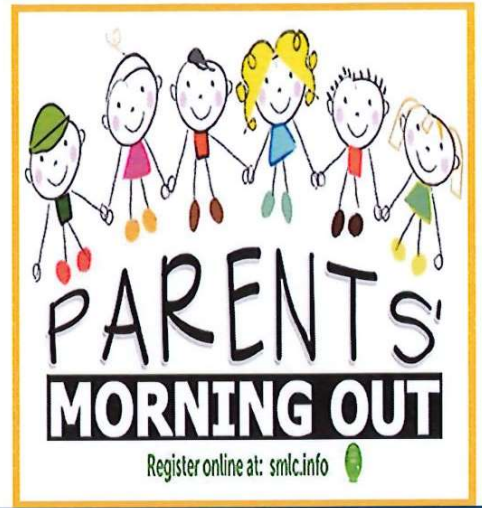


St. Mark Council News

It may not be "BREAKING NEWS" but here are some things we would like you to know:

- 1) We will be having a fire drill sometime in the not so distant future and it may be unannounced so
 - a. Please know which door you should exit out of – the Emergency Plan flier is in the pew pocket in the sanctuary. To assist you, we have posted colored signs on the appropriate doors for exiting.
 - i. If you have a child in the nursery, the nursery people will bring your child to you.
 - ii. If you have a coat in one of the coat rooms, please leave it behind.
 - b. After you have exited the building, please proceed to the north parking lot (between the columbarium and the Garden of Eatin') - please just don't get into your car and leave. A representative from the Lake Villa Fire Department - or one of us - will dismiss you. The Fire Department Representative might have something to tell us while we are outside. You are then welcome to return to church to get your coat and/or attend coffee fellowship.
- 2) The first aid kits and the AEDs have been restocked and updated. IF YOU NEED TO USE ONE OF THE FIRST AID KITS – GO RIGHT AHEAD but please let one of us know and/or the office so we keep the kits stocked – thank you in advance for helping us with this!!
- 3) We have purchased a [LifeVac](#) for the kitchen, the nursery, and the Sunday School area. In case of a choking emergency, these are to be used before the EMT's arrive. On their website, these are the [instructions](#) on how to use one. We will make an announcement at one of the services during the summer also to explain their use and purpose.
- 4) If you currently are a First Response Team member and need to be re-certified or you would like to become a team member, please keep your eyes and ears open for the next training date and/or talk to Tim Rick or Mike Mol.
- 5) As always, if you see and/or hear of anything that we should be brought to our attention, please contact Tim Rick or Mike Mol. If you would like to join our team, see Tim or Mike also. We are a team that prays that we are never needed around the church!!

A Great Awakening, Director: Joshua Enck, April 3, 2026, Movie, PG13, 2 hr. 9 min. Tells true story of an unlikely friendship between the Reverend George Whitefield and Benjamin Franklin that resulted in one of the most defining moments in American History.

What would you say? America's Christian Heritage: Fact or Fiction

Almost three hundred years ago, the separate American colonies stood on the verge of an invisible phenomenon known as the "Great Awakening," a powerful religious revival. One could hear it, feel it, and see its effects. Yet no one can fully explain how revival begins—the timing, the place, or the conditions. It happens when and where the Spirit wills it. As Scripture says:

"The wind blows wherever it pleases. You hear its sound, but you cannot tell where it comes from or where it is going. So it is with everyone born of the Spirit." — John 3:8

A century after John Winthrop spoke of "A City upon a Hill," only a few spiritual embers remained in the land. Economic prosperity, worldliness, weakened church standards through the Half-Way Covenant, and the fading fear of Indian attacks had cooled the Puritans' original zeal.

The Great Awakening spread like a wildfire through the colonies between 1730 and 1770, reaching both rural towns and major cities. It crossed denominational lines and weakened the spiritual hold of the Church of England. The movement is most associated with Jonathan Edwards and the New England Puritans. The first spark of revival came in Northampton, Massachusetts where Jonathan Edwards—a brilliant, but reserved preacher—began preaching boldly against the idea that man could accomplish God's purposes by human effort rather than by God's grace alone.

Edwards preached justification by faith and the necessity of being "born again." His famous sermon, *Sinners in the Hands of an Angry God*, based on Deuteronomy 32:35, pleaded with sinners to repent while there was still time. The colonists' response shocked even Edwards himself, later recorded in *A Faithful Narrative of the Surprising Work of God*. Theologians, who knew Edwards understood the revival could not simply be explained by his personality or emotion.

Another major figure was George Whitefield (1714–1770), an itinerant preacher, from England. After his conversion at University of Oxford, Whitefield preached throughout England and eventually the American colonies. Forced outside established churches, he preached in open fields to crowds sometimes reaching 30,000 people.

Upon his second visit to the colonies, Whitefield helped ignite revival across America. Historian Paul Johnson wrote, "He simply carried a torch and used it to set alight multitudes...." In 1740, Whitefield traveled from Savannah to Boston on the first continental preaching tour. Over the next thirty years, he preached an estimated 18,000 sermons.

Whitefield's central message was simple: "You must be born again." His sermon *The Almost Christian* challenged listeners to examine whether their faith was real or merely outward religion. John Wesley described the response: "In some places, thousands cried out aloud... most were drowned in tears... almost all lifting up their eyes, and calling for mercy." ¹(Gibbs, p. 88)

Nearly every denomination benefited from the revival, especially the Baptists. Even Benjamin Franklin observed its social impact: “It was wonderful to see the change soon made in the manners of our inhabitants... it seemed as if all the world were growing religious...”² The Great Awakening emphasized personal conversion, challenging ministers and churches that lacked spiritual vitality. Gilbert Tennent argued in *The Danger of an Unconverted Ministry* that a converted plowman was more fit for leadership than an unconverted minister.

Such ideas were revolutionary in the eighteenth century. They helped shape a mindset that later influenced the Founding Fathers. If an unjust king lacked moral legitimacy, then authority itself could be questioned. John Adams, a principle Founding Father and 2nd President, later reflected: “The Revolution was in the minds and hearts of the people. As British leaders acted more like tyrants, colonial respect for English institutions and the king rapidly declined.

The “Be Born Again,” message of the Great Awakening created new men and women in Christ and was the glue which tied the colonies into a formative movement, lighting the spark of liberty. Adams, called this moral and spiritual shift “the real American Revolution.”³

The key text for the Great Awakening was Revelation 21:5: “Behold, I make all things new.”

Many of these tasks are sit down jobs for those of you who can't stand long.

During the sale we need many, many, many hands to help our visitors carry their purchases, find things they are searching for, straighten up areas as they are shopped and just be a friendly face. After the sale we need everyone to help pack up leftovers and put on the donation truck. There will be a sign up sheet in July for those who want to help. If you are interested in cashiering please see me personally. We also serve lunch to our workers and food donations are always welcomed. Set up is usually during the day, but we are going to have one evening a week where those who work can help. If you don't drive but would like to help please let us know. We will get you a ride. If young people would like to help they are most welcomed. Youth under 13 need to come with an adult for safety reasons. Many high school and college age students come for service hours. Strong arms are also needed for pick ups. Except for youth who need service hours we do not allow non members to help with set up. See me for reasons why.

July 6th.....Ed Center set up begins. Days and times will be on the sign up poster.

July 19th....After 9:30 service many hands are needed to move all donations in main building to their selling area.

July 20th.....Main building set up begins. We will still also be working at the Ed Center.

July 30th & July 31st & August 1st.....Sale days! All hands on deck.

August 1st....Clean up after sale. Many hands make quick work.

Hope to see you at the sale. It is a great way to meet other members you may otherwise never see. We are a fun welcoming group that always welcomes new faces. 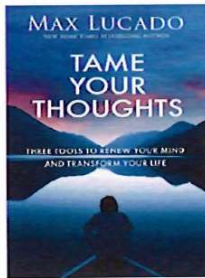

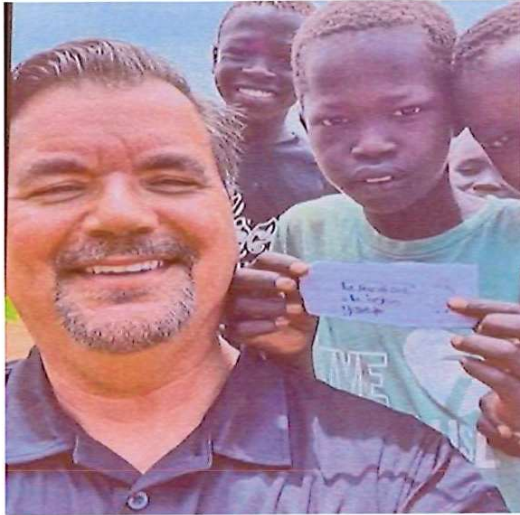

FMSC Update

Through St. Mark's benevolence funds, we donated enough funds to make St. Mark a "Bronze Sponsor" at last month's annual gala! That benevolence helped provide 22,403 meals, which in turn, feeds 61 kids a daily meal for a year!!



At the gala, FMSC's CEO showed this picture of some refugees in Sudan – notice the t-shirt the young man over his left shoulder is wearing!!

Overall, the FMSC Illinois Gala raised \$1.1 million - that's enough to feed well over 10,300 kids a meal a day for a full year. How cool!! That's the GREAT news but the bad news is that there are more than 10,300 kids who need food. FMSC goal this year is to feed over a million kids so please consider helping financially or by volunteering.

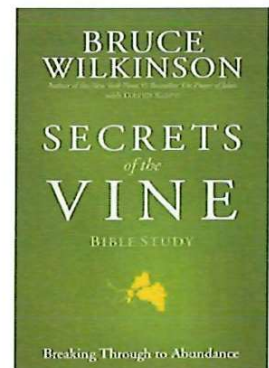

In CONGRESS, JULY 4, 1776

The unanimous Declaration of the thirteen United States of America

When in the Course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth, the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God entitle them, a decent respect to the opinions of man-kind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation.

We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed,—That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness.

Prudence, indeed, will dictate that Governments long established should not be changed for light and transient causes; and accordingly all experience hath shewn, that mankind are more disposed to suffer, while evils are sufferable, than to right themselves by abolishing the forms to which they are accustomed. But when a long train of abuses and usurpations, pursuing invariably the same Object evinces a design to reduce them under absolute Despotism, it is their right, it is their duty, to throw off such Government, and to provide new Guards for their future security.—Such has been the patient sufferance of these Colonies; and such is now the necessity, which constrains them to alter their former Systems of Government. The history of the present King of Great Britain is a history of repeated injuries and usurpations, all having in direct object the establishment of an absolute Tyranny over these States. To prove this, let Facts be submitted to a candid world.

List of Grievances.

WE, THEREFORE, the Representatives of the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in General Congress, Assembled, appealing to the Supreme Judge of the world for the rectitude of our intentions, do, in the Name, and by Authority of the good People of these Colonies, solemnly publish and declare, That these United Colonies are, and of Right ought to be FREE AND INDEPENDENT STATES; that they are Absolved from all Allegiance to the British Crown, and that all political connection between them and the State of Great Britain, is and ought to be totally dissolved; and that as Free and Independent States, they have full Power to levy War, conclude Peace, contract Alliances, establish Commerce, and to do all other Acts and Things which Independent States may of right do. And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our sacred Honor.

What would you say? America's Christian Heritage: Fact or Fiction

July, 2026 marks the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. Would you define the Declaration as the *birth certificate* of the nation, reflecting the spirit of the United States of America? Or as an insurrectionist statement? As in the past, the perennial question resurfaces: Was the founding of the United States primarily a product of Christianity or Enlightenment Deism?¹

Michael Novak, in **On Two Wings: Humble Faith and Common Sense**, writes: "The leaders of the American Revolution were not, like the leaders of the French Revolution, secularists. They did not set out to erase religion. Quite the opposite." "...if the Founding Fathers were influenced by the Enlightenment...it was the Enlightenment of John Locke, a man ever at pains not to trend heavily on Christian sensibilities."² And Baron Charles Montesquieu, a Christian and legal philosopher, who wrote God is the source of all law,³

The first act of the Continental Congress in September 1774 was to pray Psalm 35 to God for wisdom in responding to the British bombardment of Boston. The Second Continental Congress, in June, 1776, issued a proclamation calling for a national day of prayer, humiliation, and fasting.

Read the Declaration of Independence, mark phrases that are meaningful to you stating *why* the Declaration was adopted. To whom is this appeal directed? Common sense, reason, God, divine Providence, Creator, Supreme Judge?

Laws

The phrase "the Laws of Nature and of Nature's God" is key to understanding the spirit of the Declaration. In the 18th century, "law of nature" was understood to mean God's universal law written into creation and known through reason and science. The phrase "Nature's God" referred to God's will as specifically revealed to man in Scripture.³ Like gravity, these laws were considered fixed and unchanging for both individuals and nations. Thomas Jefferson combined the "law of nature" and the "law of revelation" into the Declaration's phrase: "The Laws of Nature and of Nature's God."

Self-Evident Truths

In the Preamble of the Declaration of Independence, Jefferson wrote of "self-evident truths." A truth which is understood directly and needs no proof, discussion, or debate. Examples: Man is created in the image of God. Round is not square. Men are not angels.

- "All Men Are Created Equal" This phrase refers to equality in the sight of God. All share the same sinful nature. All stand equally in need of salvation. This does ****not**** mean all people are equal in: appearance, ability, status, personality and circumstances. (Gibbs, p. 141)
- Men are "endowed by their Creator with certain "Unalienable Rights" Because we are created in God's image, we have both the duty and right to resist efforts to dishonor that image. These rights: cannot be sold; cannot be surrendered; cannot be taken away. Therefore:
 - God — not government — is the source of rights.
 - Government exists to protect these God-given natural rights.

- Governments that deny these rights, or claim authority to grant them, are illegitimate and may be overthrown.⁴
- "Life, Liberty and the Pursuit of Happiness" Citizens possess these rights whether or not governments recognize them. Therefore, citizens have a duty to insist that government protect them.
- Life and liberty are gifts from God. Government is to protect the life, not deny it.
- William Blackstone, a British jurist, (1723–1780) defined liberty is a power of acting as one thinks fit, without restraint or control, unless by the law of nature." John Locke added "Though this be a state of liberty, yet it is not a state of license." In other words, liberty is governed by moral responsibility. Doing the right thing.
- The Pursuit of Happiness. Blackstone argued there is a direct connection between happiness and God's law: "(God) has graciously reduced the rule of obedience to this one paternal precept, 'that man should pursue his own happiness.' This is the foundation of what we call ethics, or natural law."
- Jefferson's closing prayer appeals: "To the Supreme Judge of the World for the rectitude of our intentions." Gibbs notes that only God could validate the moral correctness of their movement for independence from Great Britain.

Historian Paul Johnson observed that the Declaration of Independence was, for those who signed it, both a religious and secular act. Many believed the winning the Revolutionary War confirmed approval of God. Just as earlier colonists had written their covenants and compacts in the name of God and spread the Gospel to all the nations, many believed the founding of the United States reflected both prayer, faith and liberty working together.

Do you believe the Declaration reflects primarily Christianity, Enlightenment ideas, or both?
